


#### Cottonwood Country Musical



TOO COLD to FISH?

Just as the calm that often occurs as the eye of a hurricane passes overhead is misleading, don't let the warmer weather since last week's frigid temperatures make you think winter is over. That's fake news. It's not even mid-January; we still have a lot of winter yet to slug through. It will get cold again.

Maybe it won't get as cold as last week. We can hope. But Texas has even had freezes in March.

How cold was it? Well, cold enough for Texas Parks and Wildlife Dept. (TPWD) to close fishing on the coast. Not all up and down the coast; not even in every county. Just in parts of nine counties, out of the 15 that touch the coast.

TPWD did that because freezing weather can cause fish to be severely depleted in two ways. Fish, although coldblooded, can freeze to death. My aunt, living on Offatt's Bayou in Galveston, tells of seeing guys walking away from the bayou after a bone - rattling freeze in the 1950s carrying frozen trout over their shoulders like rifles.

The other way is man-caused. Trout and other game fish seek deep water during extreme cold since it is a little warmer. Congregating in places like Army Hole near Port O'Conner, fish become sluggish and prone , to capture, like the ones my aunt saw. Greedy fishermen can just scoop them up.

"The high mortality that a freeze can cause may deplete fish stocks for years," said Robin Riechers, TPWD's Coastal Fisheries director. "Protection of the surviving fish ... would likely shorten overall recovery of coastal species, especially trout." In 1989, 11 million fish were killed. It took years for fishing to rebound.

Lance Robinson, deputy director of Coastal Fisheries,

said, "The goal wasn't to shut down all areas, but to protect the trout population in deeper areas. Freezes in '83 and '89 were killers.'

Robinson added that it was too soon to know how many fish were killed last week. "It takes time," he said. "The cold weather earlier in December sent fish to the deeper water before the freezing weather hit the coast. That helped. Sudden

Early reports from the Rockport and Port O'Connor indicate about 1,000 dead fish -- including tarpon and red snappers. "But it's in the hundreds, not millions, like earlier years," Robinson

Not only fish were affected. Robinson said over a thousand green sea turtles, stunned by the cold, washed up on beaches. TPWD volunteers and others took them to hatcheries to warm up. He also praised the barge owners for cooperating on the Intercoastal Waterway. They suspended traffic from the Land Cut to Brownsville.

When asked how TPWD reacted so quickly on a holiday, closing fishing from 6 a.m. Jan. 2 until 10 a.m. Jan. 3, he replied, "We were watching the temperature and pulled the trigger in time. Lots of conference calls from Sat.

What a way to spend a holiday! Thanks, Y'all!



Shocked by the sight, he continued onward nevertheless. He sighted a small German squad of eight, and killed four with his pistol. The remaining four immediately surrendered. Shelling continued, and on the way back to the American lines, one burst in New York. He remarried in killed one of his prisoners and shattered Edwards's own leg. He kept the remaining prisoners under guard, and ordered the World War II, Edwards stepped drkenbridges@gmail.com. Germans to patch him up. His three remaining prisoners carried him back to the American lines at gunpoint. He lost most of his right arm, and his left leg was mangled. A bullet remained lodged in his right leg for the rest of his life. In spite of these losses, he kept his upbeat outlook on life after the war. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor for this incident in 1923.

After his discharge from the army and from the hospital, Edwards talked his way into the graduate program in journalism at Columbia University in New York. He never went to high school, and no one could confirm that he even had a bachelors degree. Edwards claimed he had graduated from Texas A&M University in 1910 after playing halfback for the football team. He also claimed that he had a degree from Baylor University after playing football for them. However, poorly kept records at Baylor and an archival fire at Texas A&M made it impossible to either support or reject his claims of attending either one. He never completed the program before embarking on his next adventure.

Daniel Richmond Edwards aide for U. S. Senator Warren up to serve once again. He had certainly given enough in the First World War, but he felt he had to give more. Though now past 40 and with many injuries, he was not sent back into the infantry. Instead, the army used him to promote the war effort, a task he took on proudly. Edwards also periodically worked as a war correspondent as well. After the war ended, he stepped i. away from the army with the rank of major.

Though he was cited for his amazing acts of courage during the war, he admitted that he was "Whenever I did one of these things, I was scared to death.'

Edwards spent his last years in Arkansas. He settled in the Hot Springs area and worked quietly as a fishing guide on Lake Ouachita. It was a simple job of helping others make the most of a special time in their lives. He still spoke to the occasional group and still worked with veterans causes. For Edwards, the 1950s and 1960s were a time far removed from warfare and battle. He enjoyed the peace he had won for others and deserved for himself, spending his days on a clear blue lake in a majestic forest. He passed away at the age of 70 at the veterans hospital in Little Rock in October 1967.







## Cross Plains' 2018 retail sales up 5% from 2017

The City of Cross Plains' one percent city sales tax payments in 2018 are just over five percent higher than 2017, according to the Texas State Comptroller's

Texas State Comptroller Glenn Hegar reported the city's sales tax payment on Wednesday, Janury 10th.

Cross Plains' 2018 sales tax payments for the year totaled \$20,139.33, which is 5.08 percent higher than the \$19,164.81 in sales tax rebate payments collected in 2017. The payment to the city for

Janaury 2018 was the same amount as the yearly total.

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced today, Wednesday, January 10th, he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose taxing districts \$709.2 million in local sales tax allocations for January, 9.5 percent more than in January 2017. These allocations are based on sales made in October by businesses that report tax monthly.

Hegar sent Texas cities \$456.9 million in January 2018, which is higher by 8.4 percent compared to January 2017 and higher by 8.4 percent year-to-date.

He reported \$44.3 million in January 2018 allocations to Texas counties, which is higher by 15.0 percent compared to January 2017 and higher by 15.0 percent year-to-date.

The Texas transit systems received \$158.8 million in January 2018 sales tax allocations, which is 8.5 percent higher than January 2017 and higher by 8.5 percent year-to-date.

Special Purpose Taxing Districts received \$49.2 million in January 2018 allocations, which is 20.0 percent higher than January 2017 and higher by 20.0 percent year-to-date.

Total sales tax allocations were \$709.2 million in January 2018, which is 9.5 percent higher than January 2017 and higher by 9.5 percent year-to-date.

## ATTENTION PROPERTY OWNERS

Property owners have certain rights that may reduce their property tax burden.

HOMEOWNERS

Persons who own their residence on January 1, 2018, may claim their home as a residential homestead. The filing of this document is only necessary if the homeowner has changed homesteads since January 1, 2017, or has become eligible for additional exemptions since last year. Homeowners may also defer the portion of the tax on their residence homestead if the value of the home was raised more than 5% above the previous year. Although the taxes collection is deferred, interest continues to run on the unpaid portion of tax at a rate of 8% per annum and the deferred tax remains a lien on the property. To apply for the deferral, the owner should contact the appraisal district which appraised the property in question and complete an application.

**DISABLED PERSONS** 

Person who are disabled under Social Security law are entitled to additional exemption on their residential homestead. Disable applicants must apply with the appraisal district and furnish a determination letter from Social Security. Disabled persons now receive all benefits on their home that are (see below).

PERSONS WHO ARE **OVER 65 YEARS OF** AGE-EXEMPTIONS AND DEFERRAL

Persons who are over 65 years of age or disabled persons may file for additional exemptions and a ceiling on school taxes for their residential homestead f they become 65 during 2017

or will be 65 during 2018. Over-65 persons should apple for this exemption at the appraisal district office in their county. Over-65 person are also eligible to defer paying the tax on their residential homestead if they wish. The taxes continue to accrue during the deferral along with an interest rate of 8% annually, but no attempt will be made to force payment during the deferral. Details and an application may be obtained from any appraisal district or the State Comptroller.

**DISABLED VETERANS** 

Persons who have been declared disabled by the Veteran's Administration are eligible for additional exemptions on property they own. The declaration letter from VA is mailed annually, but the appraisal district only needs a copy in the first year of eligibility or if the percentage of disability changes. In certain situations where the disabled vet is 100% disabled and unemployable, their homestead can be completely exempt. An annual reapplication for the 100% exemptions may be required by the Chief Appraiser.

> FARM AND RANCH **OWNERS**

Farmers and ranchers may be entitled to receive an alternate method of appraisal determined by the farm income to the property. This available to over 65 persons method is available to farms and ranches commercially raising crops or livestock or which are used as a wildlife habitat under State guidelines. An application for agricultural use value and additional information is available from your appraisal district. Re-filing is only necessary if requested to do so by the Chief Appraiser.

> **EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS**

Exemption applications for all property tax exemptions including total exemptions for charitable, religious, and other total exemptions may be obtained from an appraisal district nearest you or through the State Comptroller's Office at 1/800-252-9121 or from their website at: http://www. windowns.state.tx.us/taxinfo/ taxforms/02-forms.html.

> **BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNERS**

State law now requires the filing of a rendition declaring what types of business personal property that a person or company owns. Failure to file the rendition will result in a 10% penalty. If a fraudulent rendition is filing, a 50% penalty is mandated. A rendition can be obtained from the appraisal district office where the property is located. Deadline-April 15. A 30 day filing extension is available by written request.

Callahan County Business reminded to render taxable property by April 15th

If you own tangible personal property that is used to produce income, you must file a rendition with the Callahan County Appraisal District by April 15th, 2018.

A rendition is a report that lists all the taxable property a person owned or controlled on January 1st of this year. Tax laws require all businesses to pay property tax based on the value of the assets used in the business to generate income. These assets include inventory, furniture, fixtures, machinery, equipment and vehicles. Owners do not have to render exempt property, such as church property or agriculture producers' equipment used for farming, unless specifically requested from the Chief Appraiser. By April 15th of

each year, business owners must provide the appraisal district with a listing of those assets. Your business should have received a Confidential **Business Personal Rendition** from the appraisal district. If you have not received this form please call at 325/854-5865. If you own multiple business locations, you will need to complete the rendition form for each location.

The Appraisal District may use the information submitted in the rendition to set property values as well as field inspections of businesses. You can also file a report of decreased value to notify the district of significant deprecation of your property. For example, if your property was damaged by a storm, flood, or fire last year, you should file a report of decreased value. The district will look at your property before assigning a value in 2017.

The last day to file a rendition or report of decreased value is April 15, 2018. If a rendition is filed late or incomplete or not at all a 10 percent penalty will be imposed, if a fraudulent rendition is filing, a 50 percent penalty is mandated. Property owners who need more time to file their renditions may file a written request for an extension with the chief appraiser on or before April 15, 2018 to receive an automatic extension to May 15th or the next business day if it falls on a holiday or weekend.
