Start Food Safety Practices At The Grocery Store
Consumers concerned about the
quality of their food in grocery quality of their food in grocery
stores can follow a number of tips to ensure food is safe before they take it home. "A good starting point is to look for cleanliness and sanitation when selecting a food store," said Dr
Peggy Gentry-Van Laanen nutrition specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. However, shoppers also need to know what they can do to maintain safety and quality after buying groceries."
Meat is a highly perishable food chat can harbor bacteria, which can
cause foodborne illness, and should be closely scrutinized, Gentry-Van Laanen said. Shoppers should use their senses to determine th freshness of raw meats as well as poultry, fish, fruits and vegetables efore buying them.
Meats should have a pink, red or poultry should range from color of yellow, she said. Meats and poultry should be moist and have fresh odor. Produce that appears slimy or cloudy and has a rancid or putrid od
In the seafood department, fresh shellfish such a oysters, mussels and lobster should be purchased live, Gentry Van Laanen said. Finfish should have a clean, fresh smell--no fishy or off-odors. For whole fish, the gill should be bright red or pink
Flesh should be firm and elastic, and the skin should be shiny with and the skin should be shiny with is fresh, the eyes appear bright and clear and protrude away from the head.
"Fillets should be firm, not slimy and have a fresh smell," she said. "Fish should be displayed in temperatures or in ice and not piled upon one another."
When buying fresh fruits and vegetables, check the color, she said. Produce should also be firm relatively blemish-free and mold rree and have a pleasant odo
Other guidelines that can help consumers make wise choices whe Brocery shopping include

*Avoiding food in leaky, buldging,
or severely dented pans. Don't buy cracked jars or jars with loose or buldging lids.

Program Amendments of 1992 Program Amendments of
signed by the President Oct. 28, authorizes VA to permit veterans to negotiate interest rates on VA guaranteed home loans with
lenders. VA will begin a test on the use of negotiated rates, tracking these loans and comparing rates and points charged to those charged on FHA and conventional loans. The authority expires December 31,
Legislation also authorizes a three-year program for VA
guaranteed

(ARMs). These mortgages will be similar to FHA ARMs, with the interest rate corresponding to the specified national interest rate index (limited to one percene rate authorized, with adjustments to the loan rate limited to a five-percent increase for the life of the loan. ARMs mar be existing loans
underwriting also requires that account the status of the interest rate index, maximum and expected amounts of increases in meeting payments, FHA standards and other factors that VA may determine. direct loans to Native American direct loans to Native American
veterans living on trust lands. The loans may be used to build or buy homes on reservations and other trust lands.
