Remove seeds and skins from white grapes and cut in halves lengthwise. Shredded fresh pine apple is added, and then apples cut in small pieces. Also a small amount of celery may be cut up. To this, add one quarter of the amount in Brazil nuts which have been cut in small pieces. Mix and season with lemon juice. Mayonnaise dresing is used to moisten




