Silverton Gets Longest Train In Its History

Thirteen Cars of Building Material and Merchandise Arrived in Company. Silverton Tuesday Night for Projects Under Construction.

The train of the Ft. Worth & Denver, South Plains railroad which came into Silverton Tuesday night was the longest unit in the history of arrivals into the station here since the inauguration of train service last Novem-

The incoming freight shipments required thirteen cars. While it is a frequent occurance for small towns on main railroad lines to have trains a mile long to arrive and depart, only a few cars are shunted to the switch Six Inches Of Let yards, but Silverton is the terminus of the line and all loaded cars arriving are for local consignees.

Seven of the freight carriers contained brick and tile for the new buildings under construction here, and the remaining six brought merchandise of miscellaneous nature..

Work on the high school building has been held up through the delay in freight arrivals.
