Richards said that Saturday's lopsided vote showed that Texans don't like that approach. That means $\$ 350$ million that had been shifted from wealthier school
districts no longer is available to the system, noted Ms. Linebarger, D-Manchaca.
"Voters sent the lawmakers the message that they don't want such revenue-sharing, that they want excellence in their schools, and they don't want any taxes raised to pay for it,"
