## How Texas Weathered The 90's Recession

The official time span of the latest recession that hit the United
States is July 1990 through March States is July 1990 through March
1991. As is the nature of national recessions, not all areas of the - country were affected at the same ises nor at the same levels. Texas is one of those states where the recession was relatively mild and comparison purposes, it is easier to use the official time span to measure where the Texas labor market was before the recession and
where it stands now. At the beginning of 1990, the Texas total unemployment rate
hovered around $6.0 \%$ for a civilian labor force of just over $8,400,000$. For the month of August 1993, the seasonally adjusted rate for Texas remained fixed from the previous month and the previous year at
$7.2 \%$ for a civilian labor force $7.2 \%$ for a civilian labor force that has grown by 500,000 to
$8,928,000$. The jump in the
unemployment rate results from the employment growth's inability to keep pace with the labor force. In comparison to Texas, the
United States began the year 1990 with a total unemployment rate of
around $5 \%$ for a civilian labor force of 125 million people. The nation had added 3.4 million people to its labor force since that time and though the total unemployment
rate is on a decline from the recession, the August 1993 figure remains higher than early 1990 at
6.7\%.
Total Nonagricultural Wage and Satary employment in the state of
Texas grew by approximately 400,000 jobs during the time period of early 1990 to the present.
While total employment was growing, the component industries shifts in their share of the total workforce. Nonmanufacturing industries gained an even larger percentage of the total employment
( $86 \%$ as opposed to

79\% pre-U.S. recession). At the
same time, Manufacturing same time, Manufacturing
industries did not have an overall increase in employment, ending up at the same level achieved before the recession. Things were happening within the
manufacturing community manufacturing community.
Recessions usually result in a Recessions usually result in a
decrease in demand for durable gocrease in demand for durable
gonsumers tighten their goods as and spend less on the high
belts and ticket items that constitute durable goods. As that situation occurred during this recession, manufacturing experienced a shift
in employment from durable to in employment from durable to
nondurable goods. However, even as the larger picture was changing, as the larger picture was changing,
many manufacturers of durable goods were able to maintain somewhat stable employment levels. The majority of the shift came from the big losers of
employment in durable goods employment in durable goods,
Transportation Equipment and Transportation Equipment and
Electronic and Other Electrical Equipment, to the largest gainers in
nondurable goods, Apparel and nondurable goods, Apparel and
Other Finished Textile Products, Other Finished Textile Products,
Chemicals and Allied Products, Rubber and Miscellaneous Plastics Products and Paper and Allied
Products.

This news may come as a surprise to many anorexics who
mistakenly believe they can take calcium supplements and sidestep osteoporosis, a well-known consequence of the disease," said Dr. Steve Abrams, an assistant professor of pediatrics at Baylo
College of Medicine in Houston.
In a recent study of adolescent females, Abrams and coinvestigator Dr. Tomas Silber with in Washington, D.C. found that anorexia nervosa severely hampers bone formation while breaking down existing bone.
They also found that, despite taking high levels of calcium, girls with anorexia nervosa did not healthy girls who were on their usual diets. Abrams noted that the anorexic girls excreted high levels of calcium in their urine because of
Abrams emphasized that the To determine how anorexi nervosa affects the body's use of calcium, Abrams and Silber examined girls with and withou the disease. The volunteers, age measured for bone density and wer given a stable isotope of calcium, special "tracer" that tracks the rate at which bone is formed and broken down.

The girls with the disease were hospitalized at Children's National Medical Center and received level
of calcium above the current daily of calcium above the current daily
recommendation of 1,200 milligrams.
Abrams believes the results indicate that the patient's health must be improved before there can be any inprovement

Under the new name, High Plains Agro Industries, the plant has been in operation now for about four weeks. The plant employs about 75 people and is currently
processing and chopping locally grown jalapeno peppers for industrial use.

Manager, Mark Loyacono, informed the Journal that the plant also processes sliced peppers and markets them under the Nacho
Grande label. The plant operates as a private label manufacturer and - will soon be processing salsa and cheese
labels. The peppers ane fields to the plant in special trailers that allow the peppers to be dumped one containers that convey the peppers up to a washing tank
Then, the peppers are sorted by machine and again by hand. The - stems are removed and the peppers are culled.
The pepper odor grows stronger as we continued our tour of the pepper

the peppers, the fumes are extremely strong. Several of the workers wear masks to keep from being over-come by the fumes. The peppers are chopped and salt and acetic acid are added to make
