## Muleshoe woman in satisfactory condition following car rollover

A Muleshoe woman was upgraded to satisfactory condition and moved to a regular room at Methodist Hospital in Lubbock as of Tuesday, following a one-vehicle accident near Muleshoe on Friday.

Helen Adrian, 42, was transported to Muleshoe Area Medical Center then flown to Methodist Hospital in Lubbock by helicopter following a one-vehicle accident at 6:19 p.m. on Friday on Highway 84, approximately one-tenth mile east of Muleshoe. On Monday, Adrian was listed in serious condition and was in the surgical intensive care unit at Methodist.

Adrian's children, Grady, age 9 and Christy, age 12, were passengers in the vehicle at the time of the accident. They were both transported to Muleshoe Area Medical Center, where they were treated for minor injuries and released.

An officer from the Lamb

County Department of Public Safety in Spade responded to the scene since the Bailey County DPS trooper was not on duty at the time.

According to reports from the Lamb County office, Adrian was driving a 1990

white and maroon Chevrolet Suburban, travelling west on Highway 84. Adrian reportedly drove off into a bar ditch, where she overcorrected to the left, causing the vehicle to skid back onto the roadway.

She then overcorrected back to the right and the vehicle skidded across Highway 84 and ran over a reflector pole. She then ran over a calvert and the vehicle went onto the median.

The suburban's left wheel then dug into the dirt, causing the vehicle to roll two times. The vehicle then came to rest on all four wheels on the east-bound lane, facing northwest.

## Three Way ISD approves DARE program

## New surgeon honored with reception

A reception Sunday honoring Muleshoe Area Medical Center's new general and laproscopic surgeon emphasized the need for such services in the community - Dr. Robert Johnson was unable to attend the reception in his honor because he was called into emergency surgery.

Johnson, who assumed his new position June 1, had to operate on a patient with a stomach infection. He was called into surgery about 1:30 p.m. and finished at about 5:30 p.m.

Prior to joining MAMC, Bailey County residents had been without the services of a surgeon since November, 1993. Johnson has a four-year contract with MAMC.

With his recent move to Muleshoe Johnson said, "This is a nice community with nice people. It has been enjoyable for me."

Since he has been in Muleshoe, Johnson has done about 30 surgeries. He has also performed hernia surgeries, as well as head and neck and gallbladder surgeries.

"This is a smaller hospital and we provide more specialized services. I would like to see some of the equipment updated and some of the facilities improves so I can provide all the surgical care I am capable of," Johnson added.

Johnson also performs vascular and cancer surgery.

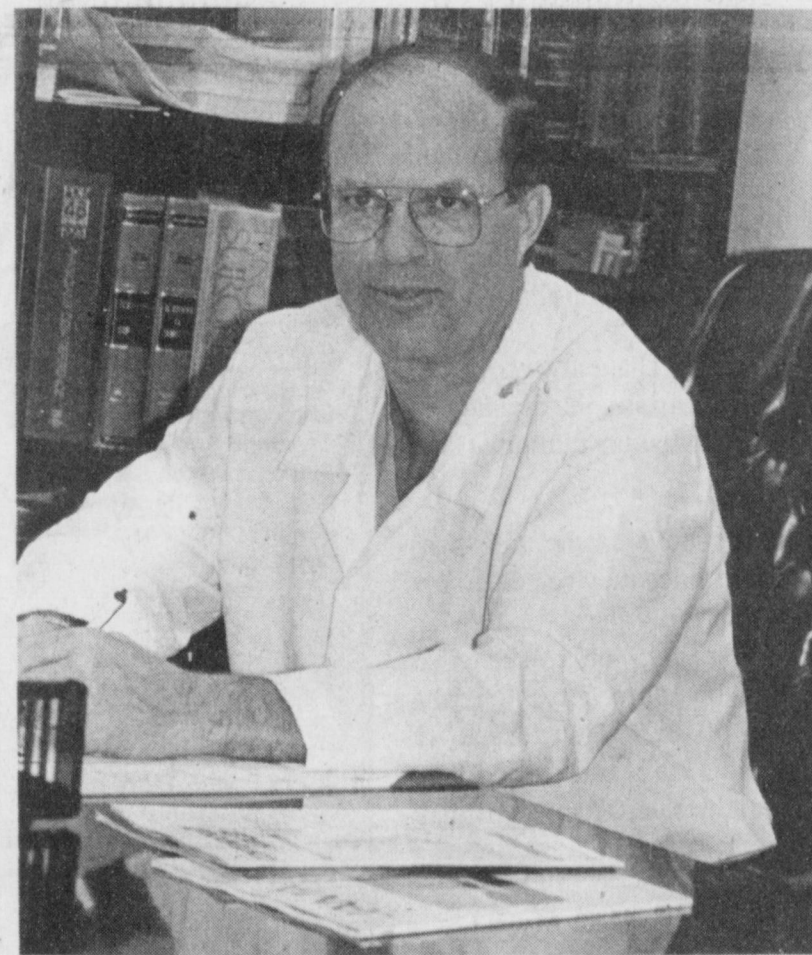
He is on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, although

he does get an occasional weekend off. He said he chose this career profession because "it is very satisfying and exciting."

Johnson, 52, is single and came to Muleshoe from West Covina, Calif.

Johnson received a bachelor of arts degree in 1964 and a medical degree from the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey in 1969.

Johnson was a diplomate of the National Board of Medical Examiners in 1970 and was a member of the Fellow of the American Cancer Society, Southwest Oncology Group, American Board of Surgery, Fellowship of the American College of Surgeons and in 1994, is a member of the American Society of General Surgeons.

## Texas travel inquiries surpass one million; new record set

More than one million inquiries for Texas travel information were distributed during the first 11 months of fiscal year 1994, setting a new record. That pace is 11 percent ahead of the previous fiscal year's total, according to information compiled and analyzed by the Texas Department of Commerce Tourism Division and the Texas Department of Transportation Travel and Information Division.

As of the end of July, 1,052,762 requests for travel information were distributed, an increase of 11 percent over fiscal year 1993. For the month of July there were almost

60,000 inquiries, an increase of 15 percent over 1993. The State of Texas fiscal year runs from September 1 through August 31.

The totals contained in the report are from the United States and international inquiries. People can request Texas travel information by telephone, mail, and in person at Texas Travel Information Centers operated by the Texas Department of Transportation.

Commerce's Tourism Division is responsible for advertising and marketing Texas as a premier travel destination and overseeing a contracted telemarketing operation to

handle toll-free telephone calls. The major portion of the one million-plus inquiries were made by persons calling Commerce's toll free number, 800/888-TEX. The Texas Department of Transportation is responsible for producing the state's travel literature and fulfilling the information requests.

Tourism is estimated to be the third largest industry in Texas. In 1992, an estimated \$21.4 billion was generated by travelers in Texas. That amount sustained approximately 406,000 jobs.

## Trailer following in footsteps of The Valdez

Lately there has been some dissension at the rancho. I have overheard murmurings in the barnyard, in particular regarding my stock trailer. The grumbling animals enlisted my teenage daughter to present their complaints.

In my defense let me describe my trailer. I felt like it was a real bargain when I bought it. Let's see, in 1986. It's an eighteen foot Hale, 1971 model with a bumper hitch. Upon purchasing it from a reputable Hereford breeder who guaranteed it would haul up to weight full grown cows, I made a few minor repairs.

Three of the wheel bearings needed replaced but the left front still spun good. We welded a jack on the tongue, built a new wooden panel for the end gate, put plywood over the rotting floor and bought innertubes for the two recaps that didn't have any tread left.

I'm still working on the wiring and have got a good coat of primer on the front panel which covers about six square feet in the shape of Utah. The greenish primer almost matches the original scour yellow.

Recently I put down a rubber mat on the slick plywood after a horse came loose in transit and slid from front to back goin' up a steep grade.

Every improvement an investment, I always say.

Jennifer's list of complaints seem trifling. The horses, she claims, are embarrassed to be seen unloading. She suggested

I repaint it. Trying to get along I pulled it down to the sand blasting guy for an estimate.

he recommended against it. Apparently he was afraid it would cause structural damage to remove that much rust would weaken the steel.

Admittedly, there has been some erosion where the sheet metal sides attach to the frame. This complaint was brought

up by the cows. They worried about sliding a foot through the four inch gap that circles the trailer. I have always looked on that gap as good drainage to prevent manure buildup. I take

it the boys at the sale barn agree since they've named my trailer the Valdez.

The dogs only asked that they be allowed to stay in the cab of the pickup instead of shut up in the trailer when I go into the sale. That way if they

see any other dogs they can duck below the dash. I thought leavin' them in the trailer would keep other dogs from peeing on the tires. But they said no self respecting dog would even consider it.

Perhaps my daughter has her own motives. I've noticed she won't even tie her horse to the trailer at a ropin' or horse show. I offered to paint her name on the side. Give her some pride of ownership. She said no thanks. I've always admired her modesty.

Bein' a good ranch boss I'm considering their grievances but I've good reason to avoid any hasty decisions. The Valdez is perfectly suited to my pickup. It's a '69 Ford with good tires and a fully functional left side mirror. Besides, the annual registration fee for

the trailer is only thirteen dollars.

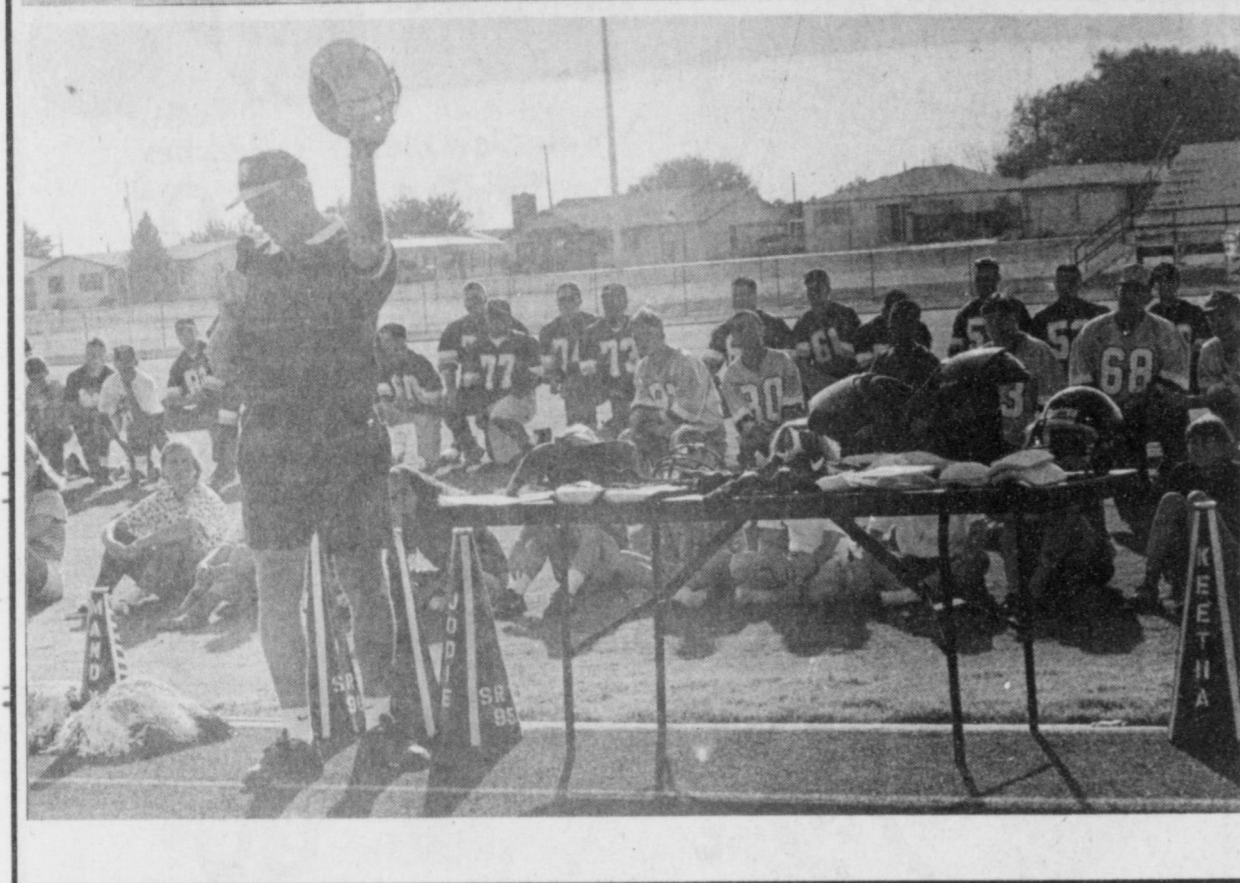
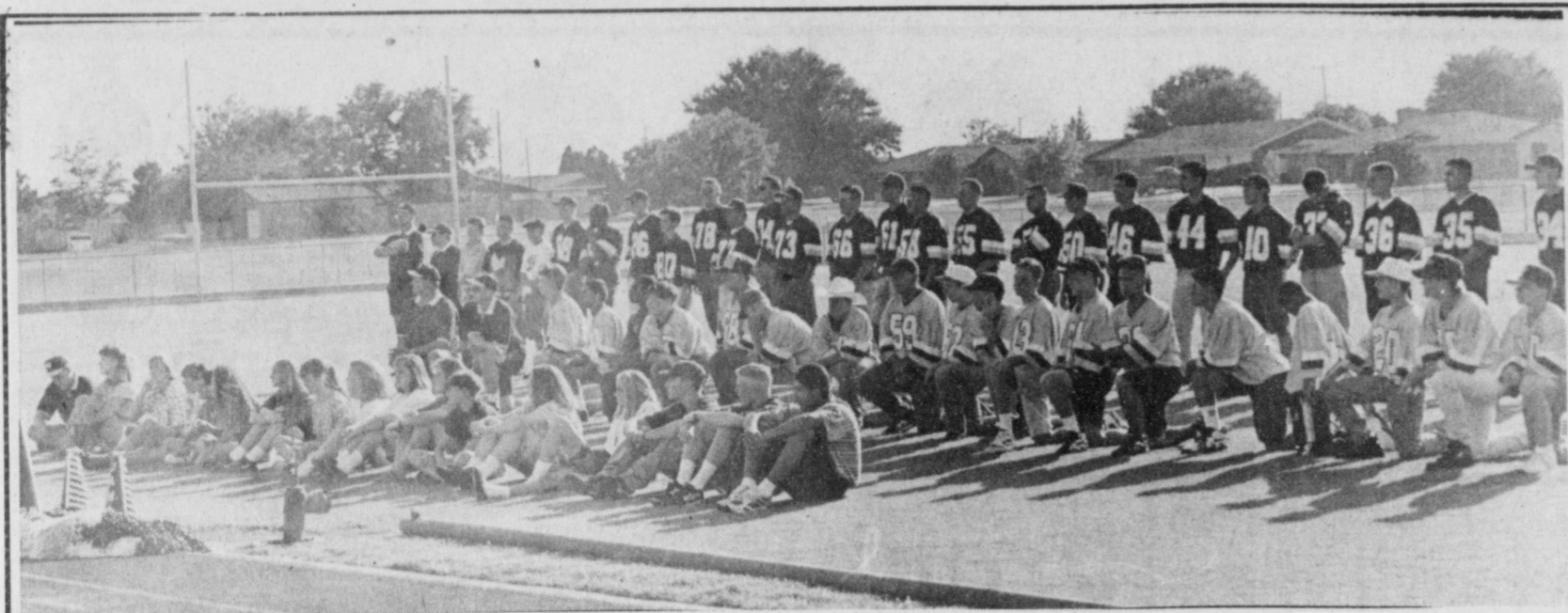

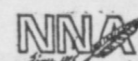

## Funding for Panhandle water supply secured

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Representative Larry Combest (R-Texas) said today that he has secured a Bureau of Reclamation guarantee that adequate funding will be available to carry out the \$1.6 million balance of the federal commitment to complete the desalting project in 1995 for the Panhandle-South Plains drinking water supply from Lake Meredith.

Congressman Combest confirmed the commitment in writing with the Commissioner of the Bureau of Reclamation Daniel P. Beard.

Congressman Combest sought the Bureau's unused 1994 funds after agreed-on installment of \$500,000 was lost by the House-Senate Conference Committee in what the bill's negotiators characterized as a misunderstanding. Combest, who in 1989 had introduced legislation for the project, on Wednesday went to the House floor and followed up with the Senate to obtain an agreement that funds remaining from the 1994 fund to meet the entire federal government obligation.

"I felt it critically important that the federal government live

up to its agreement to provide the one-third share of project funding, because the people of our region have been patient and forthright in coming up with their larger two-thirds share," said Combest. "I am pleased to have recued this from zero funding to full completion."

Canadian River Municipal Water Authority director John Williams was notified of the funding commitment.

"If I understand the commitment made, it appears that adequate funds will be available in 1995 with no slowdown in the project so it may go forward as rapidly as planned," said Williams. "I am deeply appreciative of the work done by Congressman Combest to make this possible. I know how much work has been done now and previously to authorize and fund this project."

Combest introduced the legislation authorizing the desalination project for a total of \$3 million federal share, while the 11 cities depending on the water supply and the state providing the remaining \$6 million. Last year, Combest helped secure a \$1.4 million installment from the federal government.

Today's written assurance of available funds from the Bureau of Reclamation and Combest's actions to gain congressional authority for use of those funds completes a decade of efforts by local, state and federal officials.

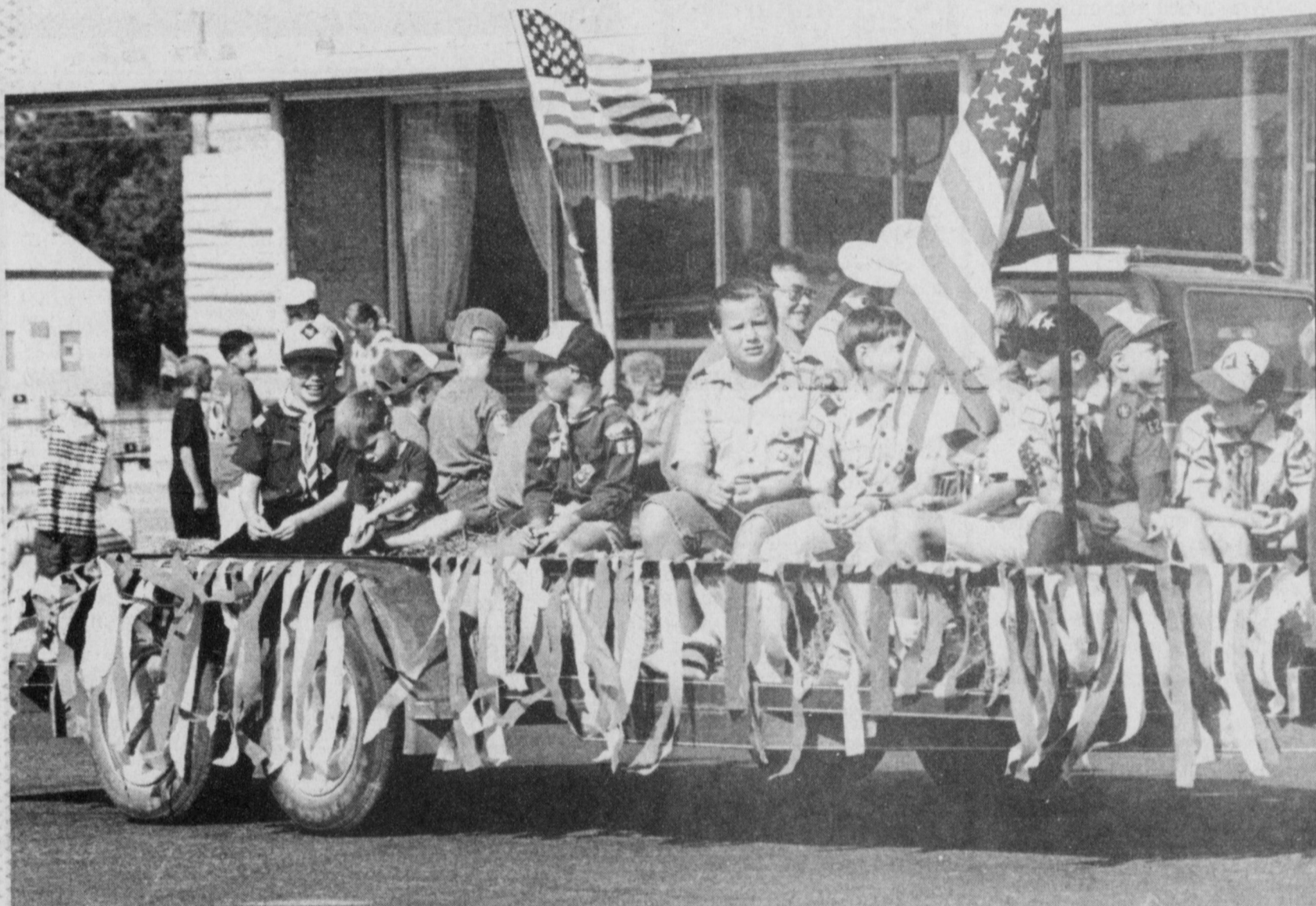

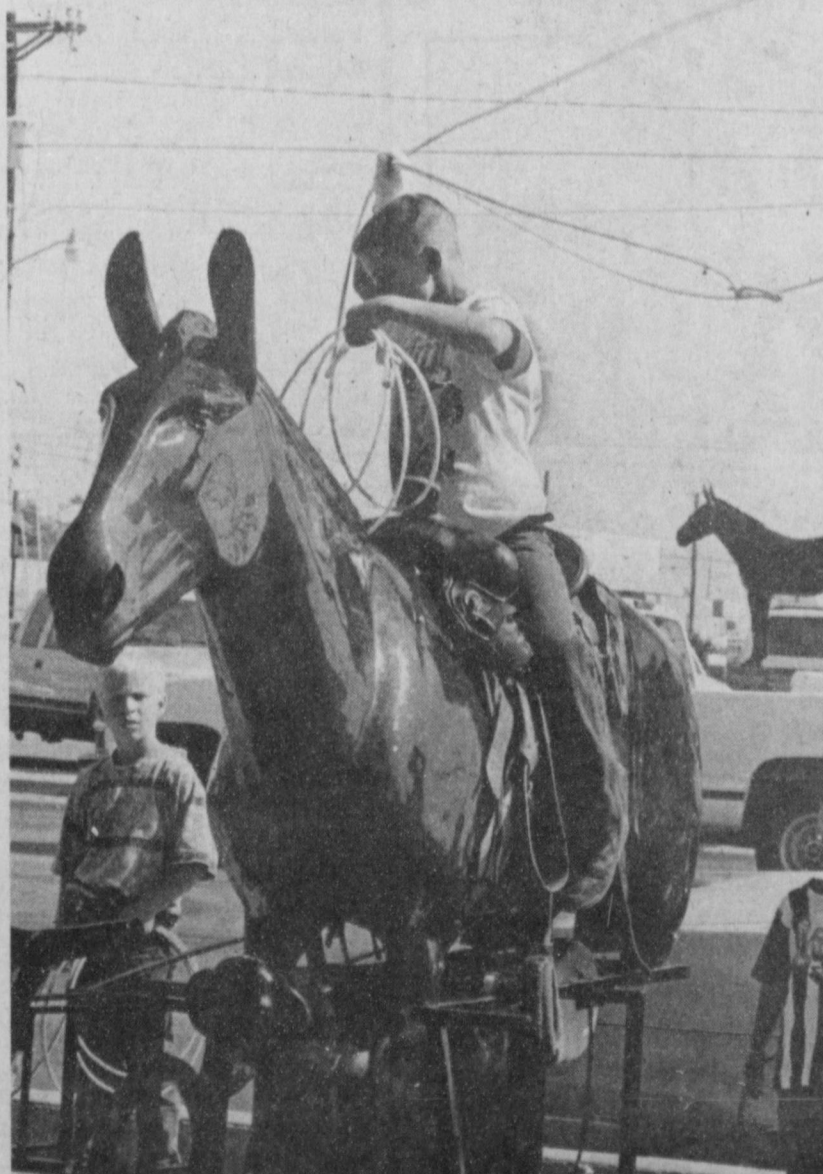

## SPC to install two-way radio communications

LEVELLAND - Four complete work stations for a new two-way radio communications training option should be installed this fall at South Plains College.

The second phase of radio service technology, part of SPC's program in electronics service technology, will begin in the spring, according to J.D. Harrell, assistant professor of electronics service technology.
