## POSTAL RATES WENT UP JANUARY FIRST

At midnight, January one the "two-penny postcard". At that hour, by act of Congress, the old penny postcard became a collector's item.

From then on any postal card, including the picture variety, must carry two cents postage.

The extra penny charge for postal cards was part of a series of rate increases voted by Congress in the hope of putting the services involved on a paying basis.

Also going up at midnight are special delivery charges, some third class rates, and registered, insured and collect-on-delivery fees.

Some \$117,000,000 in new postal revenues is anticipated from changes being made in the coming year, and others going into effect later will mean an additional \$8,000,000 by 1955.

There is no change in first class or airmail rates.

Parcel post rates, which went up an average 25 per cent Oct. 1, are not subject to further change. Second class rates which apply to periodicals such as newspapers and magazines start rising April 1 except where there is within-county free delivery of newspapers. These rates will go up 10 per cent April 1 and will be followed by 10 per cent increases on April 1, 1953 and April 1, 1954.

The objectives are to step up production in 1952 to meet growing defense requirements and to restore reserves, and maintain and improve soil fertility to make possible increased production in the future. Chairman Long urges farmers to stress particularly the soil and water conservation practices which will increase yields of the farm commodities most needed in the defense effort, and at the same time to consider future production needs based on the fact that population is increasing at the rate of about 6 thousand a day.

This dual objective is vital to the Nation's welfare—to the people who live in cities as well as farmers and rural communities. How effective we are in meeting the objective will determine not only the success of the defense program but our future progress as well.

It will be necessary for 1952 that ever farmer who participates in the ACP Program to have on file in the PMA office before any practice is carried out a practice designation sheet completed as to the practices he thinks are the most important to his farm and as to the practices he may wish to carry out. This is a plan sheet covering the work you may wish to carry out in the near future.

## Applications for Payment Ready to be Signed

Applications for payment may now be signed in the PMA office if you have completed all of your practices. We would like to get everyone's completed as soon as possible in order for you to obtain your money in the near future.

If you have an approval for a practice and have not met the specifications as set forth, it will be necessary that you do so before any payments may be made on your farm. If you have drilled a stockwater well and do not have an adequate tank it will be impossible for us to complete your application for payment until this is done; therefore no funds may be paid on the farm until this is completed. You are urged to place these tanks by your well at your earliest convenience, because it is not the wishes of the PMA to cancel your approval for a practice that is near completion, but it will be necessary to do this if not completed in the near future.

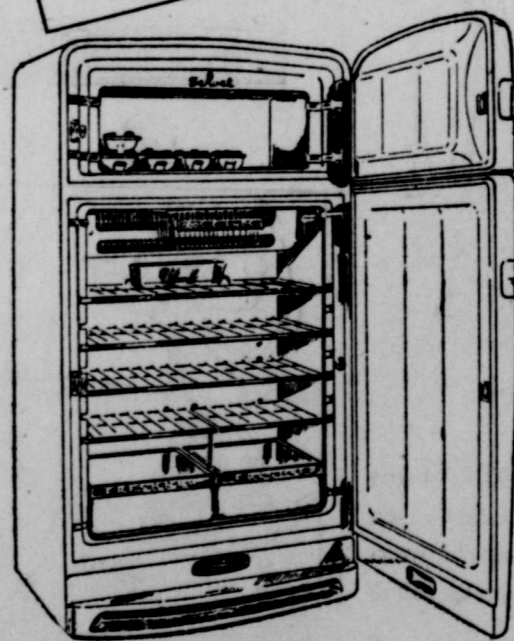
