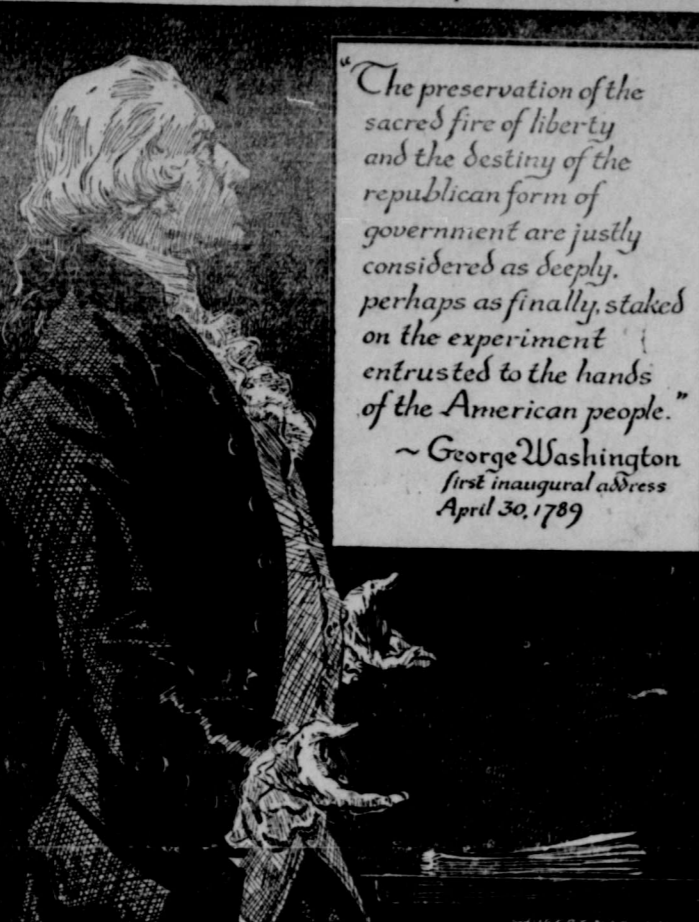

Briscoe County

From "The Stayer" August 2, 1898 No. 21 Vol 2, furnished by Mrs. Lee D. Bomar.

Briscoe county lies between the 34th and 35th degrees of latitude, and is about 3400 feet above sea level. Lines drawn, at right angles east and west, north and south show Briscoe to be almost exactly in the center of the Panhandle. It is watered by a number of small creeks running in the canyons and emptying into Red River. The general topography of the county is a broken plateau, beautiful level plains alternating with canyons or brakes as they are called. Some of the most sublime and magnificent scenery anywhere on earth is to be found in these canyons; deep gorges where the sun never penetrates; magnificent peaks that catch the earliest and latest beams of the light; clear limpid pools of pure sweet water; the deep and ever lasting green of the cedars; the varied and beautiful colors of the rocks; the many clambering vines covering bare spots with color and beauty all combined create a picture that cannot fail to please even the most careless beholder.

On the plains proper, the undulating prairies are dotted over with herds of white face cattle and scrub ponies that are the basis of the prosperity of the people. Any direction the eye may take you will see the waving grass, the fields of forage, all arrayed in living green; the tall windmill towers and the comfortable homes of the stockmen. A clear inspection of almost any of these homes will show them to be surrounded by shade and ornamental trees, an orchard, a garden; poultry, pigs, calves and all the adjuncts of the happy rural life. During the summer cattle are grazed on the prairies, but when winter comes with its icy breath, all but a few milk cows and work horses are driven into the canyons which shelter them from the cold and furnish an abundance of grass all winter.

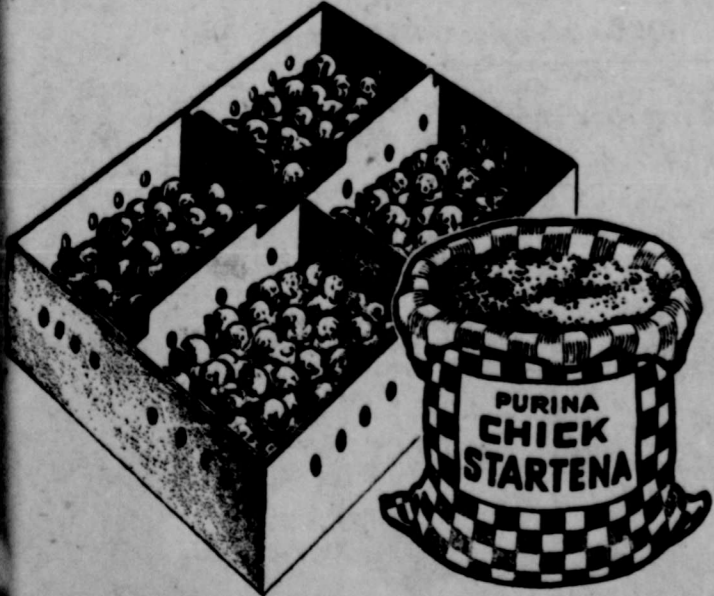

Civil Service Summer Park Employment

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced a Seasonal Park Ranger examination for filling positions in parks, recreational areas, monuments, and other sites operated by the National Park Service. The period of employment varies with the location and may range from 60 to 180 days a year. The salary is paid at the rate of \$3,175 a year.

Appropriate education of experience is required. No written test will be given. The minimum age limit is 21 years; there is no maximum.

Further information, including instructions on how to apply, and application forms may be secured at many post offices throughout the country. Applications will be accepted until further notice.

What Are We Doing About Americanism?

Do you ever try to analyze the feeling of pride, patriotism and gratitude that fills your heart each time February rolls around as we commemorate the births of the two greatest of American patriots? The Father of our Country, kneeling in prayer for his soldiers whose feet were unclad and bleeding—Our great emancipator giving his message of deep understanding on the Gettysburg battlefield—and on down through the years to our present day—our fathers, husbands, sons and brothers fighting and dying to protect this America of ours and maintain its ideals of freedom!

And what are we doing about it? What greater tribute could we pay these two great men, than to say—I am an American. Is this just a saying handed down to us from our long gone forefathers?

We need to re-awake the old fashioned patriotism, by making Americanism every body's business.

Perhaps our concern over the uncertain international situation has considered us to miss the great hazard at our doorstep. Visit our school, and attend the meeting of our local P. T. A. See and know what our citizens of tomorrow are learning. Know our teachers, realizing that the future of our country depends to a large degree upon the kind of teachers and the kind of teaching we have in the Nations schools.

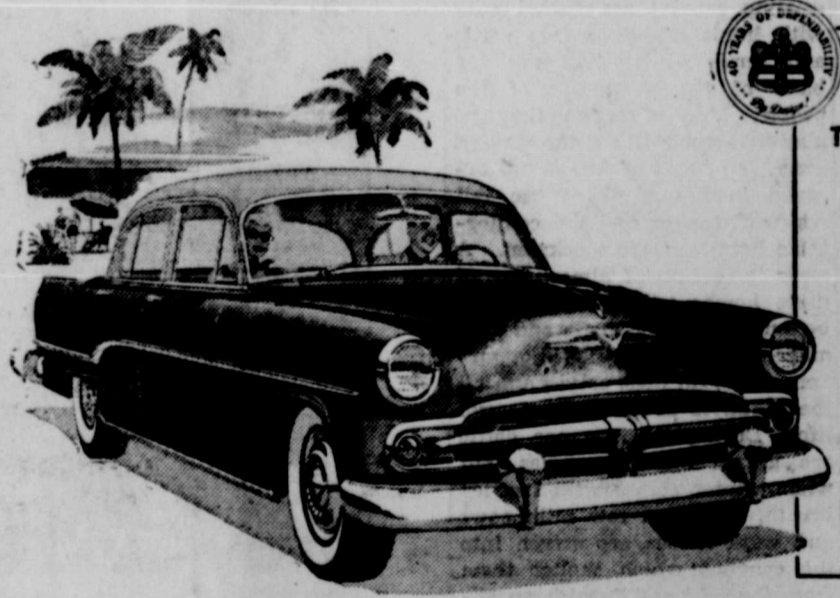

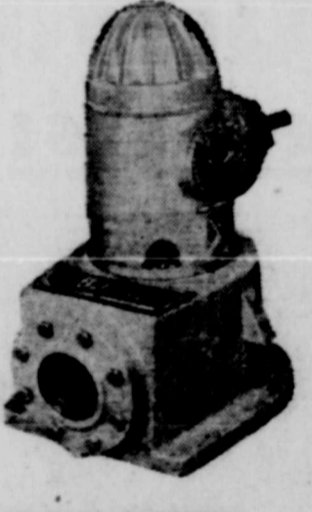

Membership in the FFA is made up of farm boys who are students of vocational agriculture in high school. The organization's activities are designed primarily to help develop rural leadership and good citizenship, and to stimulate the boys to better achievement in their study and work toward successful establishment in farming.

The Silvertown FFA chapter has 44 members. Officers of the FFA are: Douglas Oneal, President; James May, Vice-President; Jami Allison, Secretary; Charles Mayfield, Reporter; Don Ledbetter, Treasurer; Bob Barrett, Sentinel. G. H. Bunch, vocational agriculture instructor in Silvertown High School, serves as adviser of the FFA chapter.

Future Farmers choose the week of George Washington's birthday each year for the observance of National FFA Week. Although generally recognized as a Revolutionary War general and our first President, Washington's first love was the farm he called Mount Vernon. There, he was one of the first in the nation to practice contour planting, crop rotations, fertilization, and other soil conservation and improvement methods.

Our nation needs more new farmers each year if we are to maintain a rate of agricultural production sufficient to keep up with our expanding population. One of the most effective training organizations for farm boys is the Future Farmers of America.

Another clipping giving news of former days was brought to the News Office recently by Mrs. Billie Reed, a pioneer of Briscoe County. The article "Those were the Days . . . Team of 1902 looked Good against them all" a story of the undefeated Silvertown baseball team of 1902.

There uniforms included ties their monkey suits. Transportation consisted of the old horse drawn shay. The team traveled as far as Lubbock to play some of their games, starting before daylight and arriving just in time to play the game. They sometimes stayed overnight in route.

There were 14 players and a manager, and their entire outfield could handle the pitching chore.

Bob Helton was the shortstop.

He was described by those who knew him as the best shortstop they ever saw.

For that year the Silvertown club went undefeated against such neighboring opponents as Quitaque, Lubbock, Plainview, Turkey, Floydada, Canyon, Hereford, Estelline, and Matador.

The Silvertown squad of 1902 was the North Plain's first undefeated baseball team.

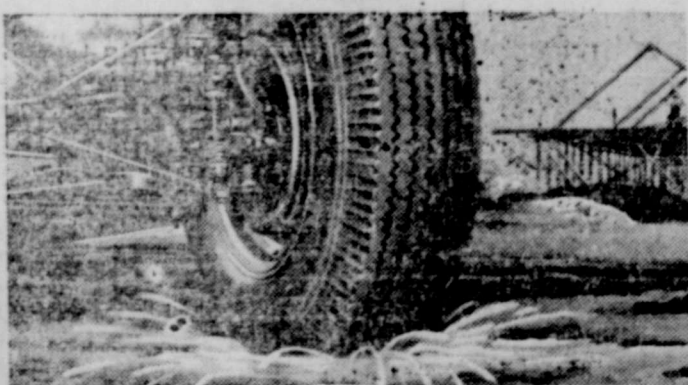
