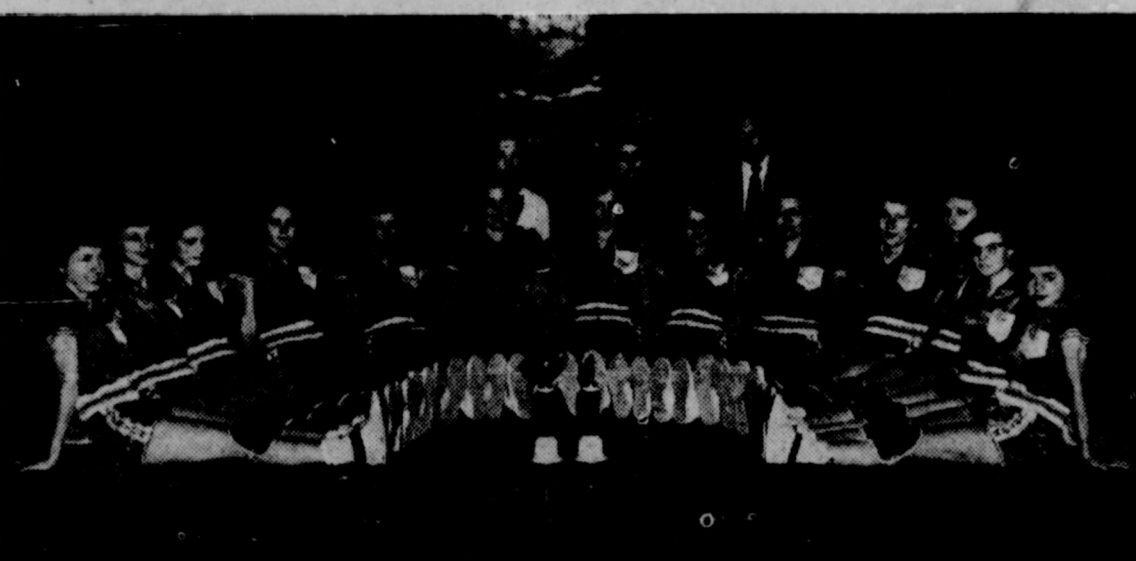
Defeated Estelline

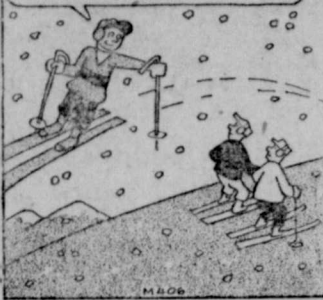

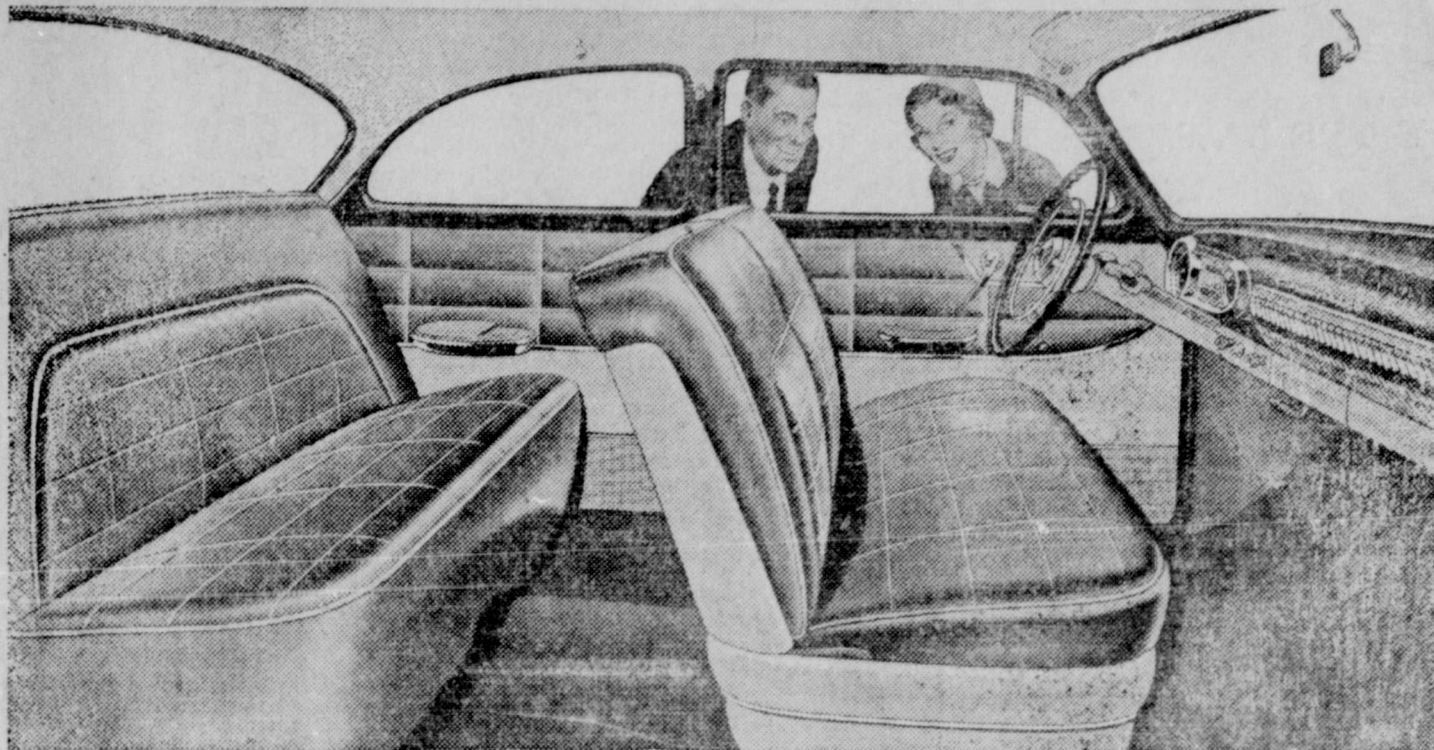

estates of persons having no heirs who die intestate revert, or "escheat", to the State.

Such provisions have been carried over from the English common law. There, under such circumstances, the estate escheated to the British crown. The theory of the process is that the sovereign (or State, having been the original owner of all lands before they were parceled out to individuals, is entitled to a return of such lands when the possibilities of legal inheritance have been exhausted.

This idea has been expanded to include personal property as well as real estate. It also applies in

the case of a person absent for a term of seven years and not known to exist who leaves no heirs and no will.

Presumably, there is hardly a person who does not have some individual or charity that he would prefer to have his estate, rather than have it go to the State by default, so to speak. Yet, surprisingly, estates worth many thousands of dollars do escheat to the various states from time to time.

Now, before you shrug the matter off with the idea that these statutory provisions could not possibly apply to you, better think a minute. Suppose you and spouse have no heirs besides each other and your children. Many people do fall into this category.

In event of a catastrophe resulting in death for you and your entire immediately family, no legal heirs would remain. Therefore if you had no will, your property would go to the State. In preparing a will it is possible to provide for such an eventual-ity.

In this hypothetical case, you would probably want to designate some friend as executor, to take care of all necessary arrangements and then distribute the estate according to your wishes.

On the other hand, if you have plenty of possible heirs a will could be used to designate which of them shall participate in the division of the estate. And, even if you wish your property to be distributed entirely in accordance with our statutes of decent and distribution as explained in previous columns, a will can perform useful functions. Among other uses, a will could provide for an orderly and economical portion of your property preventing any waste of the assets by heirs impatient for a settlement.

What happens to property which escheats to the State? Following certain required legal formalities and court proceedings, all escheated lands are set apart to the Permanent Free School Fund of the State, and may be leased and sold by the Land Commissioner under certain regulations. Escheated personal property is sold by the local sheriff under a court writ and the money received therefrom paid into the State Treasury.

Education must be universal and compulsory, because, in a democracy, it is my belief that all children must be trained for citizenship. This means that we must build enough schools and find enough qualified teachers to take care of the whole population of our citizens in this democratic society. If you will visit your schools, you will find that even though the teachers are doing a good job, they do not have the opportunity to give more than the basic training, in most instances, due to the great number of pupils in each class. Often I find the misconception that a pupil who graduates from high school should have learned all of the answers. My idea about school is that it only prepares the individual to learn how to use the things for which he is to earn a living—to learn how to do well in what we are called upon to do in moral and political agents, and to do well what we must do for the cultivation of our minds. As we observe Public Schools Week in Texas, may we become more conscious of what our schools hope to do for the individuals that are enrolled for the benefit of the Community. The Texas Congress of Parents

and Teachers were organized for the basic purpose of promoting Adult Education and encouraging the benefits of public education for all children and youth. We feel that it is more important than ever before that the citizens of each Community—rural, urban or city—know their schools. There have been many unjustified attacks upon our schools; but there have been those who have been honest and sincere in their criticism and have wanted to improve the situations in a positive and helpful manner. A first hand knowledge of the needs is imperative if we are to make the necessary improvements and if the interested citizens and those who have vested interests in our public schools will make a special effort to acquaint themselves with the great possibilities that lie within the reach of these great institutions, I believe that we can build a fortress that will thwart the efforts of any enemy.
