



When Their World Crashed ... **RED CROSS HEARD THEIR CALLS**

Above: This photo, an AP prize-winner, taken one hour after tornadic winds struck Port Huron, Mich., last May, shows a 13-year-old boy and his dog beside their demolished home. The Red Cross, immediately on the disaster scene, came to the aid of the family with clothing, household furni-ture, and medical care.

Upper Right: After the devastating Greek earth-quakes last August, 3-year-old Stamatia Frangatou sat on a hospital bed with her name pinned to her dress, as doctors drassed her fractured leg and injured head. Greek Red Cross workers finally located her mother alive, after a month's search, and re-united the pair. The American Red Cross conducted a nation-wide appeal for funds to aid victims.


