

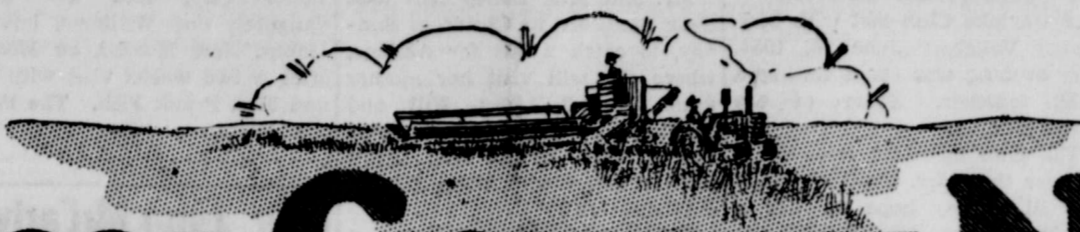

Dr. Ezzell was born Jan. 23, 1878, in McKenzie, Tenn. He was graduated from the University of Tennessee Dental School in 1906 and practiced in the Oklahoma Territory for two years before moving to Fort Worth, where he practiced until 1916.

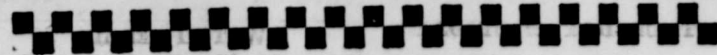

It's a good idea right now to check a few birds for lice. If you find lice or their eggs around the vents, it's time to get busy, because lice irritate the hens and usually cause production to drop. Easiest way to kill lice is to paint Purina Poultry Insecticide on the roosts. Fumes kill the lice. Repeat in 10 days to get new lice that hatch out from eggs.

BETTER SELL THOSE CULLS

Hens in farm flocks are responding to the spring urge to lay and egg prices are sure to be weak for a while. That means good poultry-men must cull closely to keep production high and cost per dozen low. Birds that paid their way laying only 2 or 3 eggs a week while prices were high, are "deadheads" now. Look your flock over. Chances are you can spot 10 or 15 birds out of every 100 that should be turned into cash to help feed the good layers.

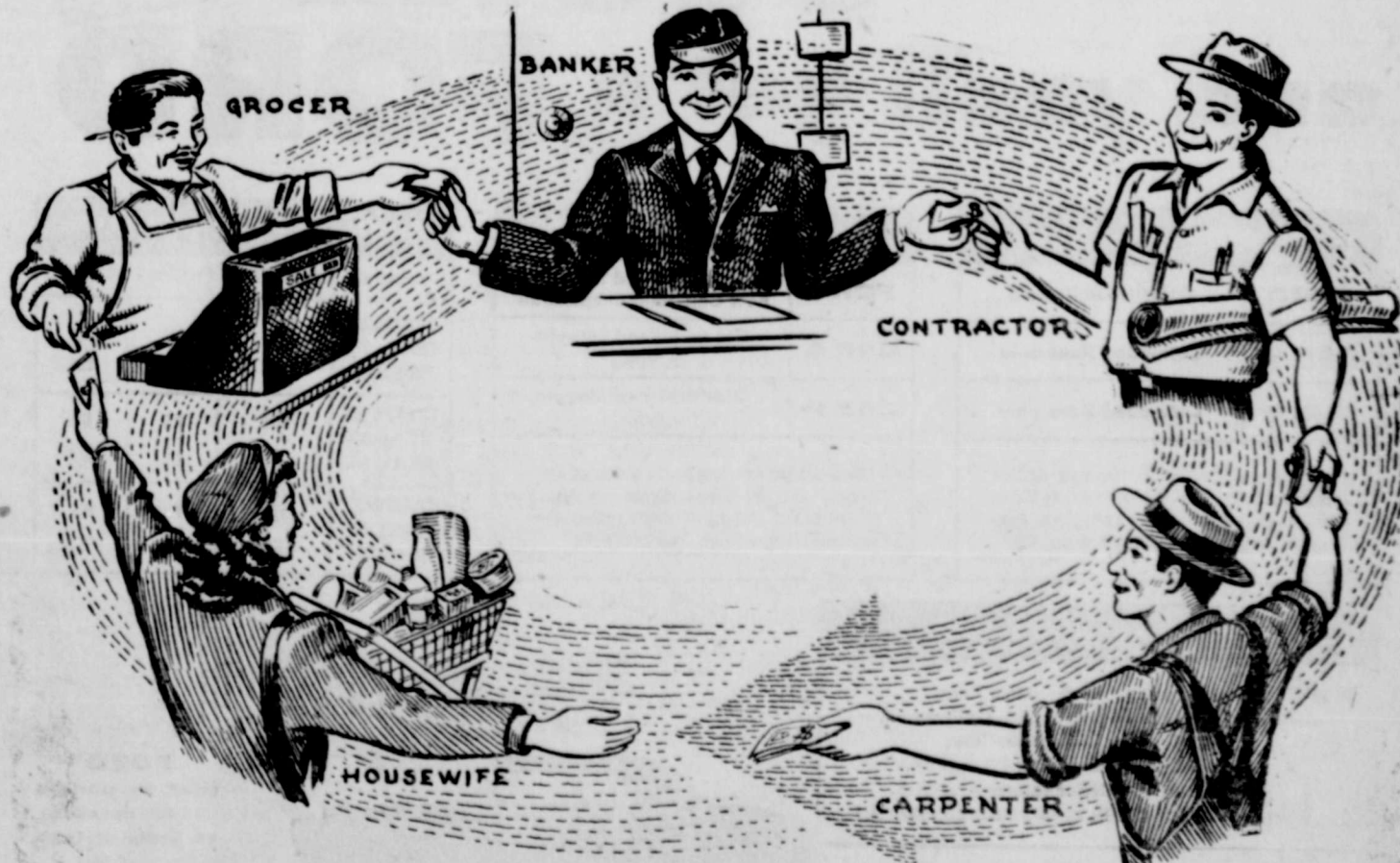
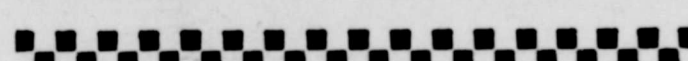

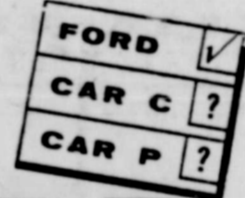
