Mothers and children in the 26-county Texas Panhandle are received \$69,582 of the \$233,563 in monthly social security insurance payments in the Panhandle in December, 1953, John R. Sander-

The largeest group of beneficiaries under the social security insurance program, however, con-sinues to be retired workers, Sanderson said. In December, 2,879 handle received \$130,734, not inchildren of such workers. There was an increase of more than 27% over the number of all beneficiaries in this area compared with December, 1952.
