Man in serious condition after being set on fire in Muleshoe

An Earth resident was upgraded from critical to serious condition and is reportedly improving at University Medical Center in Lubbock after being beaten and set on fire on Sunday afternoon just outside of Muleshoe. Meanwhile two cousins are jailed in Two cousins are arraigned on attempted murder charges

Bailey County on attempted murder charges in connection with the incident.

Joe Rincon, 20 of Earth, and David Rincon, 23, of Muleshoe, were both arraigned

before Bailey County Justice Samarron, 35, was found beaten, burned and left in near-freezing temperatures Sunday afternoon on the side of County Road 1090 in a re-DeLeon mote area, about two miles

south and two miles west of Muleshoe.

According to Bailey County Sheriff Jerry Hicks, two witnesses reported seeing two men carrying a person. They

reported the incident to the Sheriff's Department, who found Samarron beside the road. Samarron was then transported by ambulance to Muleshoe Area Medical and then transferred to University

THREE WAY - With more than 60 swine entries making up for reduced numbers in the steers, the Three Way School held its annual junior livestock show Saturday (Jan. 21) at the Vocational Agriculture Building.

Josh Tooley, who had swept the lamb show's top two honors at the Bailey County Junior Livestock Show a week earlier, repeated the feat at Three Way - exhibiting the Grand Champion lamb and steer.

Josh's sister Robin followed his lead with the Reserve Grand Champion lamb and steer.

In the swine show, Scott Pollard had the Grand Champion, while Jonathan Kindle exhibiting the Reserve Grand Champion.

The one-day event was highlighted by the annual Three Way FHA barbecue luncheon, served between the steer and lambs shows in the school auditorium. More than 100 persons enjoyed the meal.

Chad Edwards of Floydada judged the lambs and the steers, while Jimmy Duncan of Causey, NM, judged the swine.

The steer show had just four entries for 1995, due to several families whose calves did not progress as expected and others whose entries took the weekend off before being prepared for major shows later this month and in February.

Josh Tooley's Grand Champion came from the exotic class and at 1108 pounds, was the lightest steer in the show. Robin Tooley's reserve champion exotic was named Reserve Grand Champion.



A former Muleshoe High School band director accused of indecency with a minor by a former student has accepted a plea bargain which will "defer further proceedings without a adjudication of guilt," but will place him on three years

probation.

Carlos Javier Acevedo, 34,

agreed to the plea bargain Friday, Jan. 20 prior to a trial which was scheduled to begin Monday, Jan. 23.

Court reports state that Acevedo waived his right to a trial by jury in writing. He was represented by attorney Jim B. Brown of Amarillo.

In addition to probation, the

plea bargain also orders Acevedo to pay a \$500 fine and court costs and perform 200 hours of community service, all of which must be paid and completed during the first 30 months of his probation.

Acevedo was indicted by a Bailey County grand jury of the 287th District court on June 20 and was arraigned on June

According to court reports, the alleged incident occurred in September of 1993, while Acevedo was working as band director for the Muleshoe Independent School District.

Former MHS band director agrees to plea bargain

A request from parents to District Board of Trustees. move the junior/senior banquet and prom at Muleshoe High School from the Bailey County Coliseum to the Muleshoe High School was approved on Monday night by the Muleshoe Independent School

The change was primarily requested due to a lack of funds raised by the junior class, who traditionally sponsors prom. Also, they felt holding it in the school cafeteria would ease the decorating process.

The board also approved a request from senior parents to conduct Project Graduation at Six Flags over Texas rather than at the Texas Tech Activity Center, which is subject to their ability to raise funds.

Project Graduation is

parent-sponsored event foilowing graduation designed for seniors of MHS. It is a drug and alchol free program.

Also on Monday, the board continued to discuss a policy related to drug and alcohol testing for drivers.

Medical Center in Lubbock, where he is being treated for third-degree burns over five percent of his body.

Samarron was reportedly beaten with an unknown weapon that caused severe head injuries, a dislocated shoulder and a possible broken neck.

Samarron was conscious when deputies arrived and was able to help identify the suspects. Hicks said the suspects were arrested at a private residence in Muleshoe.

Hicks said that no motive for the assault is known yet. The case is scheduled to be presented to a grand jury of the 287th District Court on Monday, Jan. 31. The grand jury will decide whether or not to indict the pair based on evidence presented.

Reports state there apparently was a fight and alcohol was involved.

If convicted on attempted murder charges, the Rincons could face a maxium penalty of 20 years in a state penitentiary and a maximum fine of \$10,000 Hicks said.



"Acevedo committed the alleged actions with the intent to arouse and gratify the sexual desires of said defendant, and intentionally and knowingly engaged in sexual contact with aminor (younger than 17 years old)."

Court documents do not state where the alleged incident occurred.

Acevedo resigned from his position with Muleshoe Schools last February. He worked for Muleshoe Schools for four years.




The pledge was led by Joe Flores and the prayer was given by Tom Bowen. The Friendship Coin was passed on from Chuck Smith to Jerry Hutton.

Kirk is appointed to serve on Selective Service System board

Five Texas residents were recently appointed, in the name of the President, as local board members for the Selective Service System, including Donna M. Kirk of Muleshoe.

Kirk, along with four other individuals, will be joining a select group of dedicated, talented individuals who are donating valuable time in service to both their country and to the young men of their respective counties.

The Selective Service System's local board, although in an inactive status, would be responsible for deciding claims for certain classifications such as conscientious objection, hardship and religious ministry, should a draft be reinstituted by Congress and the President.

Although there is no plan to draft men into the military service at present, there is a need to develop a readiness in the Selective Service system in case a national emergency necessitates such action.

As members of the local board, these individuals will begin a comprehensive training program to prepare for this possibility.

Initial training consists of approximately 12 hours of instruction over a two-day period focusing on an intensive orientation to the Selective Service System, the major duties and responsibilities of the local board members and the

procedure to be followed by the boards.

In addition to the initial training, they will receive training in changes in the law, regulations, responsibilities and related agency policies and procedures.

The dedication of the board members assures that these young men would receive a fair and effective classification process by able, trained and objective individuals should the need for such a system arise.

Other board members appointed include Johnny Rodgers of Eden, Boyd L. Richie of Graham, Willie R. Jackson of Mason and Lonnie L. Kelley of Baytown.

The eight grade Mules claimed the top trophy in tournament action at Sudan on January 12-14 with a victory in the championship game over the Olton Mustangs, 51-12.







A variety of homestead exemptions could lower your property taxes!

A homestead exemption lowers the property taxes on your home by lowering its taxable value. If your home is valued at \$50,000 and you receive a \$5,000 homestead exemption, your home will be taxed as if it were worth \$45,000.

Who qualifies for an exemption?

Anyone who owned a home on January 1st (and used it as their primary residence on that date) is entitled to a \$5,000 homestead exemption to lower their school taxes this year... and it doesn't matter if your home is a house, condominium or mobile home. (Counties, cities and special taxing districts may also offer homestead exemptions.)

Are other exemptions available?

If you're disabled -- or if you're 65 years old or older -- you are entitled to an additional \$10,000 school tax exemption on your home. And if you qualify for the over - 65 exemption, you're also entitled to a permanent, locked-in "ceiling" on the school property taxes on your home. (The ceiling does not apply to county or city property taxes, and those entitles may offer other exemptions.)

Do I have to apply each year?

No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in 1994 you won't need to reapply for 1995 unless your chief appraiser requires it. However, if you haven't received an exemption on your present home -- or if you've moved to a new home -- you'll need to file for an exemption for 1995, and if you turned 65 or became disabled during 1994, you need to file for the additional exemption.



MHS to administer TAAS test in March

Muleshoe High School will be administering the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills Test (TAAS) during March. Individuals who are no longer enrolled in school and who have not previously met minimum expectations on all sections of the TAAS test, but have met all other graduation requirements, may retake the necessary section (s).

Individuals who wish to take the Texas Educational Assessment of Minimum Skills (TEAMS) test must also register in advance. This includes students currently enrolled in Texas public high schools as well as individuals who have completed all other high school

graduation requirements.

All individuals who wish to take the TAAS or TEAMS test, may pick up a registration packet at any high school campus, district central office, or education service center.

The test registration form must be completed and returned in the pre-addressed envelope and must be received in Iowa City, Iowa no later than 5 p.m., Feb. 14.

The Texas Education Agency and National Computer Systems will not be responsible for registration forms that are delayed or lost in the mail. To ensure that individuals are registered, forms should be sent either by registered mail or certified mail.






