"Here you see 8 circuits with provision for a future 8 more. In addition, there are separate circuits for the electric range and electric dryer. The kitchen, for example, has two appliance circuits for coffee-makers, waffle irons, toasters, etc." "All I'll have to do here is plug in my electric range. What's more, the wire used is #6 which means that the range will operate at top efficiency. Wire of the right size is an important part of electric ap-pliance operation."
