





Use a fertilizer of a 2-1-1 or 1-1- ratio at rates to supply wo pounds of actual nitrogen or each 1,000 square feet of lawn rea, advises E. M. Trew, extension pasture specialist. That's the amount of nitrogen in 20 pounds of 10-20-10 or 40 pounds

Another pound of nitrogen applied at 30 to 40 days intervals will keep lawns green throughout the summer, says Trew. Supply water as needed




