FALLOUT SHELTERS are the best way for rural Americans to protect themselves from a massive nuclear attack which could unleash dangerous radioactive fallout throughout the country. Some of the shelters recommended by the Office of Civil and Defense Mobilization are not as elaborate as this one, which includes an auxiliary generator and an electric air filtering and ventilating system. However, all recommended shelters should include the basic features shown here—a place to sleep; food, water and medical supplies, and at least eight inches of concrete or an equal weight of other materials for shielding the shelter against fallout. 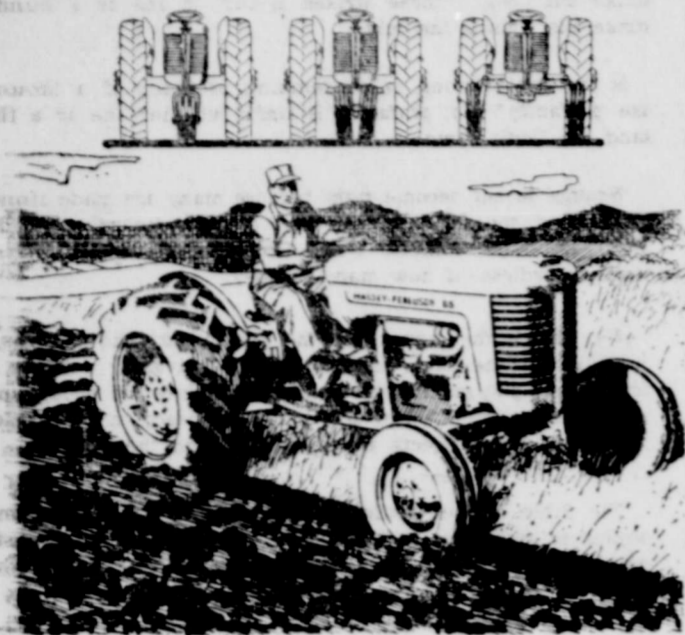

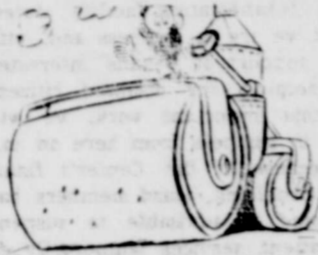
