Reed Named The
Oulstanding Farmer Number 48

| E. G. Reed, who farms south of Quitaque, has been named as the Outstanding Conservation Farmer of the Caprock Soil Conservation District for 1965 <br> This award is presented annually by the Silverton Lions Club to the farmer who, in the opinion of the Board of Supervisors of the Caprock Soil Conservation District, has carried out the best conservation farming operations over a sustained period of time. <br> Reed, since assuming control of his place, has drilled an irrigation well, converted his sandier land to irrigated and dryland pasture, and uses high residue crops in rotation with cotton to protect his land against wind erosion. He was noted for high production per acre on his peanuts in 1965, gross- ing approximately $\$ 400$ an acre. In addition, he left all the peanut hay on the soil surface for protection against wind erosion. <br> Reed was a guest of the Silverton Lions Club on May 20, 1966, at which time his award was presented. |
