## School Bus Law Being Enforced In Floyd County

Failure to stop for school busloading or unloading children s resulted in the fining of a Floyd County man and the issuing of warrants for the drivers of ers from Farwell, Friona and Hereford, according to Justice of the Peace S. J. Handley at Floy-

It is expected that another complaint will be filed this week on the same charge. State law requires drivers to stop before passing a school bus if it is stopped to take on or let off passengers, whether or not the bus lights are flashing, Handley noted. Drivers may then proceed at a speed not exceeding 10 miles per hour.

Drivers and children are taking license numbers of offending cars in an effort to help enforce the law. Maximum penalty for failing to stop for a stopped school bus is 200. The Floyd County man was fined \$50 plus costs.

The State law says: "Outside the city limits, meeting or passing, coming or going, any school bus which has stopped on the highway to discharge or receive school students, vehicle must be stopped immediately before passing school bus, but then may proceed and pass stopped school bus at a speed not exceeding 10 miles per hour and with due caution for the safety of such school children."

Drivers not complying with law may be fined from one to \$200



Pour two cans of undiluted mushroom soup over mixture. Top with grated cheese. Cook in uncovered dish for about 45 minutes at 300 degrees. Serves 12 people. (chicken or turkey may be used)



When he rose again to his feet he saw in the spot where he had knelt a beautiful plant with scarlet leaves and a yellow flower in the center.

Dumbstruck, yet realizing he was witnessing a miracle, he gently plucked the stalk and took it, full of wonder, into the church to lay on the

The Mexicans called the plant "The Flower of the Holy Night."

Years later an American Ambassador to Mexico, Dr. Poinsett, took the plant to the United States. Thus, the name "poinsettia." Ironically we do not know the name of the little boy who experi-enced the miracle.



He continued, "Though the bill is intended only to limit shoe and textile imports, mostly from Japan and the European Common Market countries, it will invite retaliation against our far larger exports of farm products. We sell twice as much farm products to these countries as the amounts of shoes and textiles they sell to us. It would appear to be poor economics to endanger this market that does so much to maintain our balance of trade.

"Texas' share of the farm market to the Common Market countries is \$59 million a year, according to USDA estimates. The state's share to Japan is another \$71 mil-



## **Festival** of Lights Reflects Old Traditions

Since the dawn of recorded history man has observed that there is a period during the year when "the days be-gin to lengthen and the cold begins to strengthen."

It is the Winter solstice when the sun began to rise over the world with renewed vigor and power for fertility, after a period of low

The people of the North considered the sun as a wheel which alternately threw its glow upon the earth and away from it. This sun wheel was known as "hweol" and perhaps this is the origin of our word "yule."

To the Jews this period was the Festival of Lights or Dedication, called Hanukkah. According to their history, in 165 B.C. a force of Maccabees met and vanquished an army of Syrians. udas Maccabeus entered erusalem with his army and found it desolate and in ruins. He began the work of purification; on the 25th day of Kislev it was finished and a sacred light was lighted.

In their destruction of the temple the sacred oil was almost depleted. However they did find a jar which they estimated would burn for one day. Miraculously, it burned for 8 days. Therefore every year the Jews de-cree that the 8 days prior to December 25 be celebrated.

The first night two tapers are lighted. One is called the torch. The second night a third candle is added and so on for each night until the 8th day. This explains why the true Jewish Hanukkah candelabrum has nine arms.



The Greeks had a special name for Carnations - The Divine Flower. They grew wild on the sun-drenched hillsides of that ancient land, 3000 years before the birth of Christ. If you select this exquisitely fragrant, long-stemmed flower to beautify your home for the holidays, you will be carrying

on a revered tradition.

The Romans called the carnation Dianthus Carolphyllus, The flower of God. During the Renaissance, kings, noblemen and their merchants sat for their portraits sometimes holding a carnation, or next to a bouquet of them placed on a table. Arranging carnation is the happiest of "problems". The possibilities are so varied that the flower presents no problem at all. Place one alone in a dainty vase, or assemble two dozen in an exuberant floral explosion. The lovely blossoms

await the dictates of your own imagination.

The furled and feathery petals of red and white carnations have an especially festive holiday look when combined with

variegated holly.

Carnations will repay you well for your relatively small monetary investment. Their fragile appearance is deceptive, for they are the longest lasting of all cut flowers.

#### THE MANY SONGS OF CHRISTMAS

At about this time of year it becomes very apparent that caroling is about as much a part of Christmas as the exchange of presents. In fact, caroling is nearly as old as Christmas itself since it was in the second century that the bishop of Rome urged his people "to sing in the celebration of the birth of our Lord." However, St. Francis of Assisi, who lived in the thirteenth century, is regarded as the father of caroling as we know it.

The most familiar of the carols we sing today were composed in the 18th and 19th centuries.

#### OKLAHOMA BROWN CANDY

6 cups sugar 2 cups whole milk or light cream 1/4 lb butter or margarine

1/4 teaspoon soda 1 teaspoon vanilla
4 cups broken nuts,
(black walnuts are best)

Measure 2 cups of the sugar into a heavy skillet. Drop the remaining 4 cups into a large, deep heavy kettle. Carmelize the sugar in the skillet by stirring constantly over low heat until it is melted. Go slow: don't let it smoke or turn brown. It may take about one half hour to melt completely without scorching. When the sugar in the skillet is just about melted, set kettle with the sugar-milk mixture in it over low heat and let it simmer as you continue stirring the melting sugar. When melted, pour carmelized sugar in a very fine stream into the kettle, stirring all the time to blend. This is an important step. Cook and stir until mixture reaches firm ball stage, 246 to 248 degrees on the candy thermometer. Remove from the step. Cook and stir until mixture reaches firm ball stage, 244 to 248 degrees on the candy thermometer. Remove from the heat, add 1/4 teaspoon soda and stir vigorously as it foam. Add butter or margarine and stir until it melts. Set aside at room temperature for 20 minutes. Add vanilla and beat until it is thick and gloss turns dull. Fold in nuts and turn into buttered pan about 15 by 10 inches by one inch deep. When slightly cooled cut in squares.
