

Saturday Is Last Day To Register Motor Vehicles

For all practical purposes, Saturday, March 31, will be the last day to register motor vehicles for 1973, Robert W. Townsley, director of the Motor Vehicle Division of the Texas Highway Department,

Townsley noted that the law set the final registration date as April 1, which this year falls on Sunday when county tax offices are

The 1973 license plates must be displayed on vehicles registered in Texas starting Monday, April 2. So they must be acquired not later than Saturday, March 31, to avoid penalty.

Townsley said many county tax officers had expressed concern that the pace of registration this year has slowed markedly. 'It looks as if a great many vehicle owners are putting registration off

to the last minute," he said. Even though the easy, computerized registration system has speeded the registration process in the last few years, if too many owners wait until the last minute, long waits in long lines at county tax offices and substations seem inev-






