**Local Delegates
 Attend State Meeting**

Two local homemakers attended three days of workshops and special events Tuesday through Thursday (September 18-20) in Waco during the Texas Home Demonstration Association's 47th annual state meeting. Delegates from Briscoe County were Mrs. H. M. Vaughn of the High Plains Club and Mrs. Elton Cantwell of the Southwestern club.

They were among more than 700 members of Texas Home Demonstration Clubs throughout the state.

Local delegates attended workshops on citizenship, family life, 4-H, health, cultural arts and recreation, safety and publicity, as well as special workshops dealing with their primary areas of responsibility in Home Demonstration Club activities.

Addressing the association as keynote speakers were U. S. Representative Omar Burlison (D-Tex) of Anson, the Rev. Peter McLeod of the First Baptist Church in Waco, and Mrs. Florence W. Law, assistant director for home economics with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

Burlison spoke on national views of family living, and McLeod discussed "Home - A Beacon Light" in a speech titled after the convention theme. Mrs. Law outlined "Present Trends in Family Living."

Home Demonstration Clubs, numbering 1,397 in Texas with more than 20,000 members, are sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, the Texas A&M University System and the U. S. Department of Agriculture cooperating.

Clubs are part of the Extension educational effort to bring the latest information on homemaking to all families in Texas.

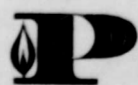

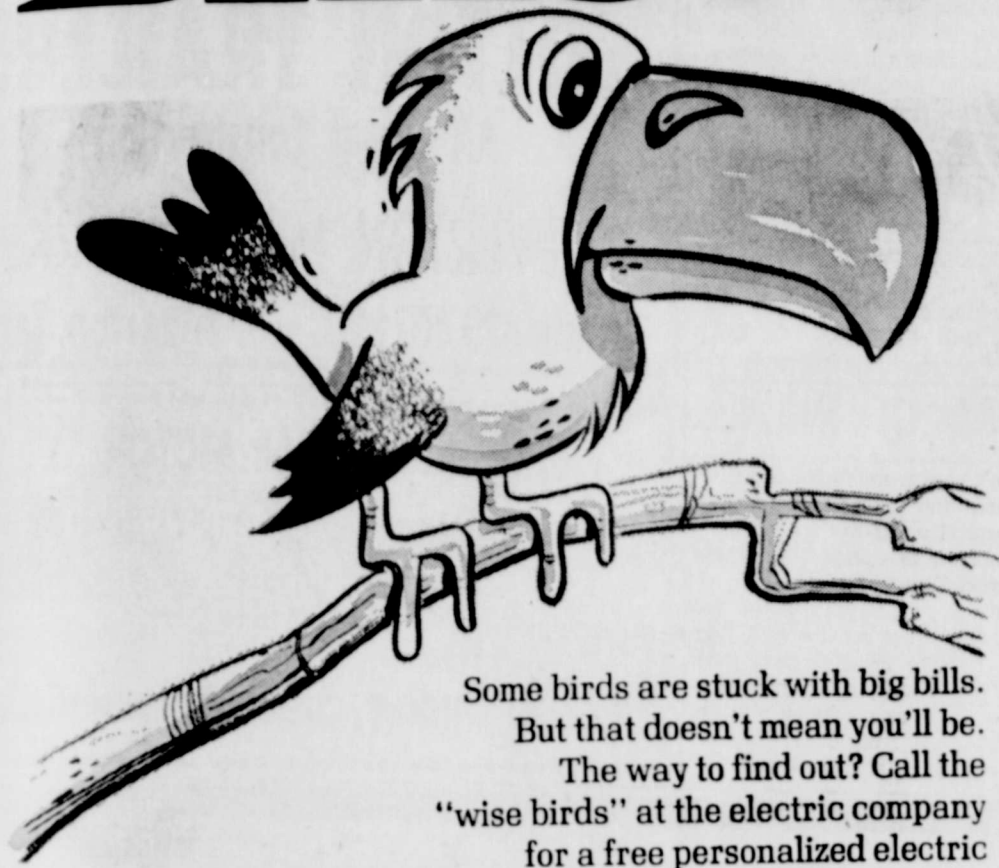

Bob Bullock Visited Here Last Week

Bob Bullock, former Secretary of State and now a candidate for State Comptroller, campaigned in Silverton last Thursday. Bullock, 44, is the first Democratic candidate to announce for state office.

Born in Hillsboro, Bullock received his bachelors degree from Texas Tech in 1955 and earned his law degree in 1968 from Baylor Law School.

He served two terms as a member of the Texas House of Representatives, Chief of the Anti-Trust and Consumer Protection Division of the Attorney General's Office and Chief Legal Counsel for the Governor.

Most noteworthy, however, was Bullock's tenure as Secretary of State of Texas. There, he worked hard to clean up campaign financing in Texas and developed a fair and economical elections system.

After serving as Secretary of State for 16 months, Bullock entered into the private practice of law in Austin. He is a veteran of the Korean Conflict and married to the former Amelia Hooks of Itasca, Austin realtor. They have two children, Lindy, 21, now Mrs. Steve Robinson, and Bobby, jr. 14.

During his tour, Bullock said, "Texas taxpayers are losing \$82,500,000 in tax dollars each year because some retailers are pocketing the state and local sales taxes they collect instead of reporting it to the Comptroller."

"Frankly, I think it is ridiculous to talk of taxing food and medicine when ten percent (10%) of the sales taxes now being paid by our citizens is not being recovered by the State."

"As Comptroller, I will work to see that the taxes we now pay are not lost to some unscrupulous retailer because of faulty collection procedures by the State."

Spreen Is New Texas ASCS Director

Senator John Tower has announced that Secretary of Agriculture Earl Butz has confirmed the promotion of Robert F. Spreen as State Executive Director for the Texas Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS). The promotion became effective September 16.

Mr. Spreen was born and reared on a farm in Williamson County and graduated from Taylor High School in 1932. He began his career with the USDA in 1936 as an auditor for the Agricultural Adjustment Act (AAA). Except for time out to serve in the U. S. Air Corps in World War II, he has continued his employment with USDA. Since 1947 and until his appointment as State Executive Director, Mr. Spreen has served as District Director for ASCS for the South Texas area which includes the Rio Grande Valley.
