IS INSANE

Verdict Returned at Wichita Falls. Twenty-Five Years' Imprisonment is Recommended.

Wichita Falls, Tex., Jan. 30 .-After being out thirty-eight hours, the jury in the trial of Frank Hursh harged with the murder of his wife, eturned a verdict finding the deendant guilty of murder in the secnd degree and assessing his punishent at twenty-five years' imprisonment in the state prison. The jury also returned a verdict finding that the defendant was "insane at the time of this trial."

Edgar Scurry, attorney for the defendant, was called out of the city before the verdict was returned and the plans of the defense cannot be learned. It is said the defense will ak that the verdict be set aside because of the defendant's present insanity. If the verdict is not set aside, a new trial granted or an appeal filed, the defendant will be committed to the state insane asylum antil he recovers his sanity, if ever, when he will be transferred to the penitentiary.

CLOCK SALES ARE PROBED

McManigal Said McNamara Called Them New Inventions.

Indianapolis, Ind.,-Purchases of alarm clocks made by Ortie McManigal, the confessed dynamiter ,at Rochester, N. Y. and at other places. were investigated by the federal grand jury.

Several jewelers, said to have sold clocks to J. J. McNamara's "dynamite crew" were questioned in the government's efforts to find out who besides McManigal, paid for clocks used in time bombs, and which led detectives to believe that explosions on the Pacific coast, and those at Peoria, were done by the same persons.

Parts of the clock destroyed in explosions were taken befor the jury. McManigal said McNamara called

the clock's "a new invention." Managers of telegraph offices in more than a dozen cities were subpenaed to appear before the federal grand jury and testify in the investigation of the dynamite conspiracy concerning messages by which, it is said J. J. McNamara directed the operations of his "dynamiting crew."

Copies of telegrams taken by the government from McNamara's office at the headquarters of the International Association of Bridge and Structural Iron Workers, are said to show not only that the dynamiters arranged simultaneous explosions in different cities, but also that some of the messages were ad dressed to men who have not been convicted or indicted. The purpose in summoning new witnesses is to establish the identity of the recipients of the telegrams. The blowing up of a building in Omaha in March, 1911, and of an iron works in Columbus I.d. on the same day according to Ortic McManigal, was arranged by telegraph.

McManigal went to Omaha and when he was about to light a fuse there he sent the following message to McNamara in Indianapolis, which was the signal agreed upon:

"Please forward check to Lincoln,

McManigah says McNamara, after receiving that telegram sent a message to Columbus for the man there to light his fuse. In that way explosions in distant cities were pulled off simultaneously, it being the plan of McNamara at the time of his arrest, according to McManigal, to employ six or eight men to carry on future work along the line.

ESTLAND MURDER TRIAL ENDS AVERDICT OF GUILTY FOR BERT CAMERON

Defendant Convicted of Killing Sutton Stovall-Claimed Stovall **Assaulted Camerons Wife**

Sunday afternoon Judge Blanton was called to Eastland, where he has tended in an automobile with Cleyburn McCauley to receive the verdict of the jury in the case of the state vs. Bert Cameron charged with murdering his brother-in law, Sutton Stovall, in July of last year.

Arriving here at about 5 o'clock in the afternoon the jury was brought out and rendered its verdict of a life sentence for the defend

Unmoved, the prisoner heard his tate read out and afterward Judge Banton duly sentenced him in accord ance with the verdict of the jury. Of course an appeal will be taken to the Courts of Criminal Appeals. The case was taken up in District court at Eastland Wednesday morning and went to the jury at about 10:30 Thursday morning.

Both sides were ably represented by council.

Bert Cameron, the defendant is alleged to have shot and killed Sutton Stovall on July 28th ,1911 while Sutton was in a buggy with two of his sisters traveling some place.

It was shown by the state that the defendant and the dead man had had a fight in May prior to the killing and the jury seemed to have attributed the killing to this incident and not to the alleged criminal assault. Beach Cameron brother of Bert was acquitted of being an accomplice in the murder just the day prior to the trial of his brother Burt cameron, it having been proven that he was present when the killing was done and rode off with the defend-

Rules on Anti-Pass Law. Assistant Attorney General E. B. Robertson for the second time held yesterday that in any one county only two deputy sheriffs may use free passes over one or all railroads and that only twenty-five members of the force of inspectors of the live Stock Sanitary Commission can use transportation over one or all Texas lines. Railroads and others have contended that one railroad might issue transportation to two deputy sheriffs, that another road might do the same for two more deputies, and that this scheme might be followed. not a building out there then. Peo-This woud permit the Missouri Kansas and Texas here to give passes to two deputies and the Central to do the same for two others. Robertson holds that roads are not allowed to do this, but that only two deputies can accept free transportation over one line or all lines. In the opinion it is held that legislative intent is clearly in accordance with the opinion and that the other scheme cannot be allowed-that it might permit an indefinite number of passes to be issued in any one county. 
