A fire broke out in the heart of the Industrial district in Houston at 1 o'clock Wednesday morning and a swath was burned out a half mile wide and a mile and a half long, em bracing twenty five blocks.

Two or three large cotton houses were burned and nearly one hundred thousand bales of cotton and much other valuable property and industrial concerns.

The fire loss is estimated at over six million dollars. Two hundred and fifty homes were burned and a thousand people were leftwithout shelter.

Mrs. Minnie Streight, Who Killed Her Husband Was Acquitted Yesterday.

GATESVILLE, Tex., Feb. 19 .-One of the most noted criminal cases in the courts of Texas came to culmination here Saturday, when Mrs. Minnie Lee Streight of Mc-Gregor, who on June eighteenth, nineteen hundred and ten, shot and ! killed her husband, T. 




