RIVERS AND HARBORS

State Gets in Appropriations . Bill More Than Engineers Recommended.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24 .- The Texas items in the rivers and harbors bill which came out today brought great rejoicing to the Texas members of the House, not only by reason of the fact that Texas gets more in the bill than was originally recommended by the board of engineers, but because of big new surveys ordered.

New Surveys Provided.

Representative Burgess made good on his promise of a survey for a 35 foot channel for Galveston and Representative Garner gets his survey for a 25 foot channel for Aransas Pass, which gets \$433,800 instead of \$150,000, recommended by the chief engineers. The Trinity river, already handsomly provided for by the engineers recommendation of \$340,000, get and appropriation of \$435,000 instead, the increase being for additional locks and dams. Likewise the Brazos river gets \$200,000 for improvement such as has been supplied from the instead of \$100,000 recommended Texas City channel gets \$100,000 instead of \$50,000 which will enable the widening and deepening of the channel.
