LAREDO, April 14.—United States federal court will convene here Monday with Judge Walter T. Burns presiding. Cases of violating the neutrality laws are the most important to be decided.

General Bernardo Reyes's hearing for neutrality law violation will be on the docket. General Reyes is at present confined in a prison in Mexico City, but will be represented by counsel and an effort will be

There is no resident in this city who is not pleased to hear a visitor say "Snyder is a pretty town" and the way to get them to say it is to make it a place to attract their admiration.

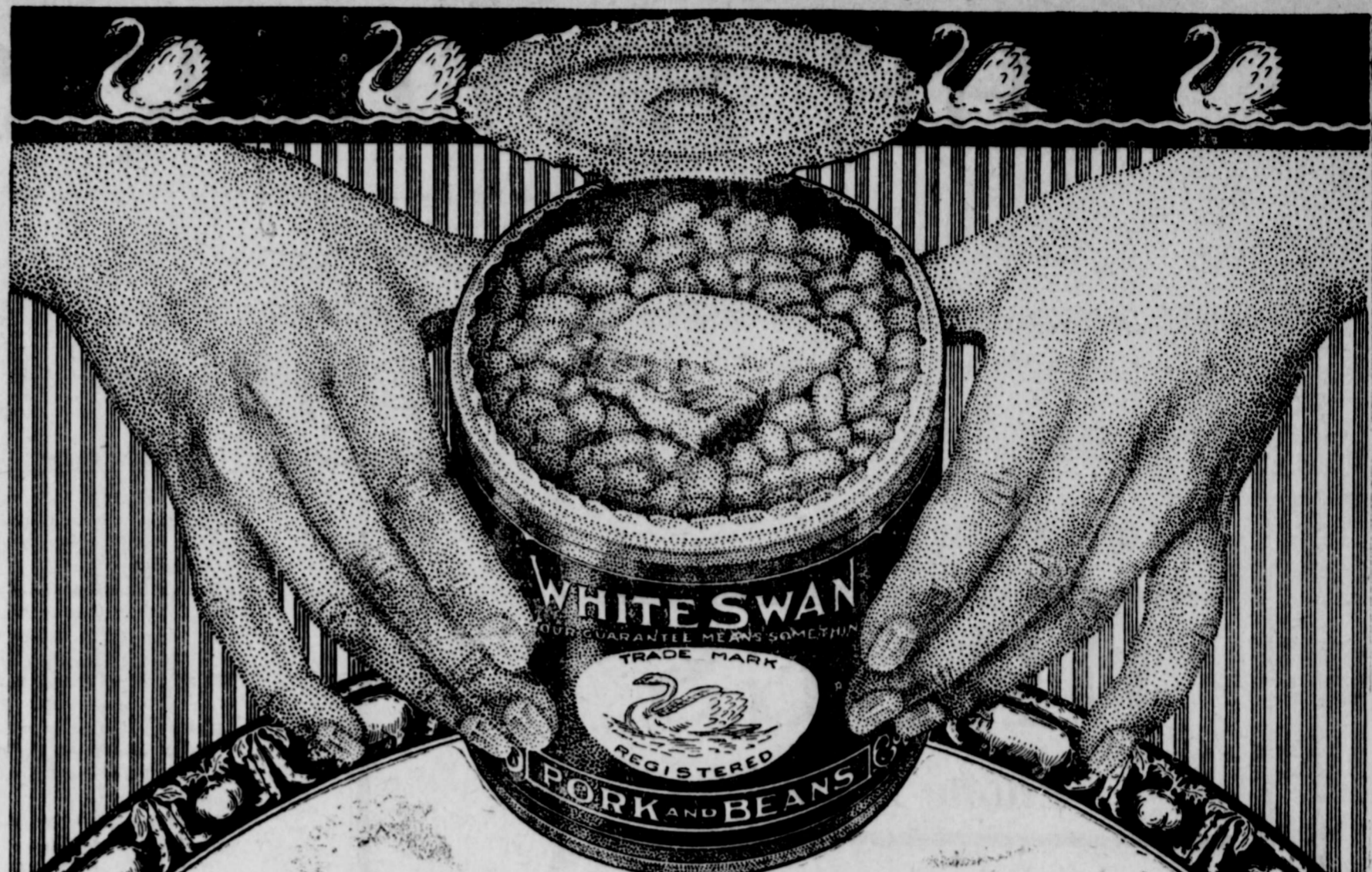

ans Outlines for Scientific Work Along Various Lines.

We are late with our report how ever will send the Signal some of he plans outlined by the farmers' nstitute at Dunn.
The meeting on April 9th, was

called to order by the president and roll of members called. Bro. Caperton made a good talk on why we should educate the children.
On motion of Bro. Ellis, the organization with officers heretofore elected, was made permanent.
Secretary Richardson announced the following committees for 1912:

For lack of space the names of other members of committees are not here given. The several chairmen and others are expected to post up and be ready at all times to lecture.

The field work is to select and improve seed and culture and to report in the fall, the results in order that the members of the institute may compare results and know better what kinds of cotton and feed to plant, and when and how to get them and most favorable prices and how to produce it at home.

There will be other committees formed later. It is of interest to the institute for every member to have special subjects to study so they may exchange notes and have a clearer conception of the work to be accomplished.

The institute aims to work for the increase of production and the decrease of cost.

These problems have already been worked out and it remains for us to reduce them to practice and that must be done systematically. If any farmer can suggest a better plan for institute work than here outlined the Dunn institute will appreciate the suggestion.

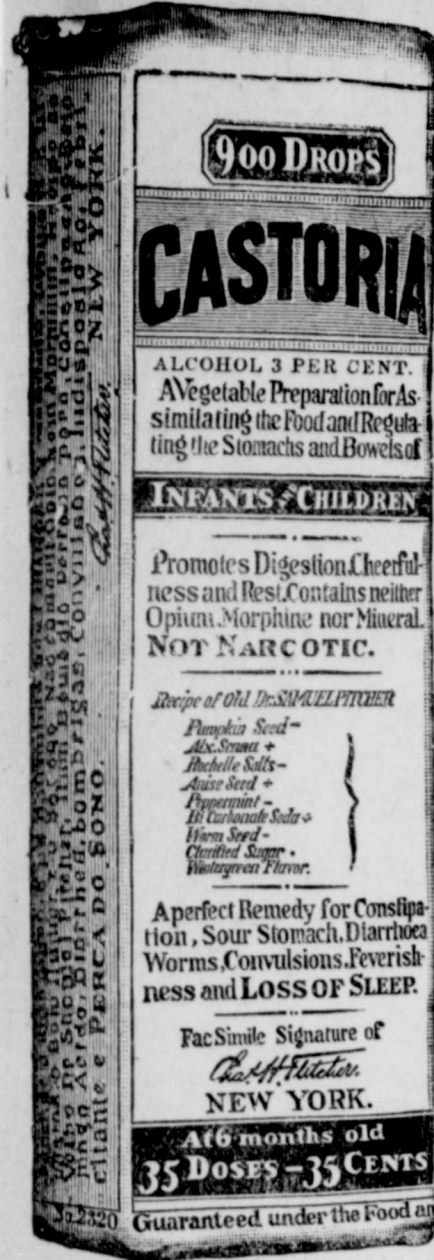

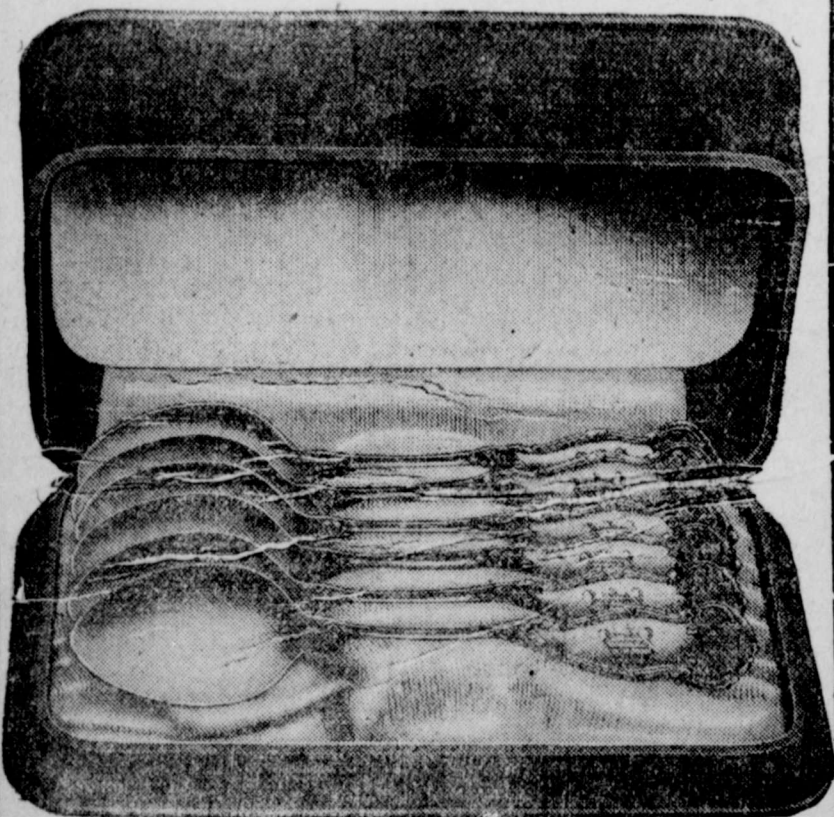

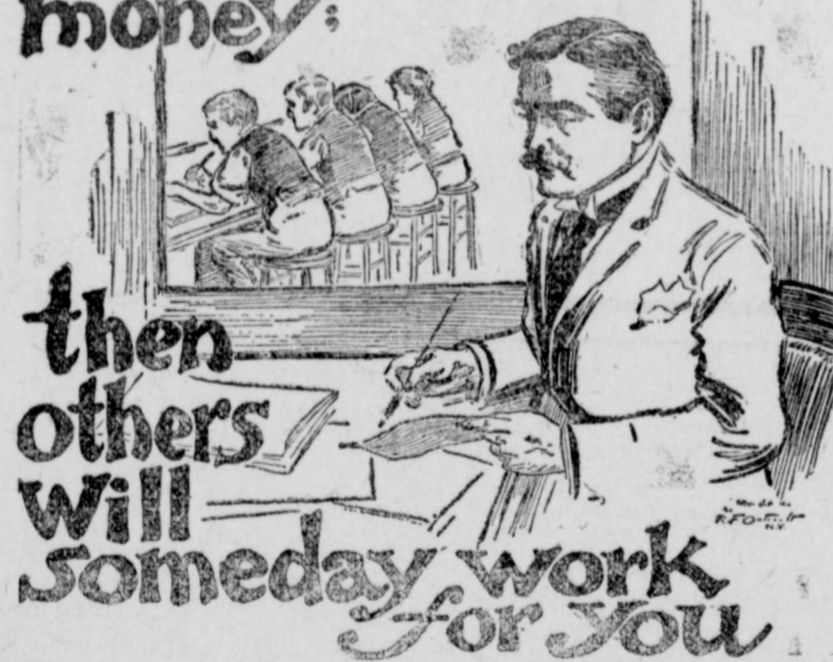

There was a considerable discussion as to whether the party would hold presidential primaries or precinct convention. Most of the members would favor election, but doubted if the people would turn out to vote and upon motion of D. Nation it was ordered that precinct Conventions would be held.

These conventions will be held at the several voting places, presided over by the respective precinct chairman to select delegates to the convention of the county.

The precinct Conventions are to be held at 2 o'clock p. m. on Saturday, May 4. The county convention will be held at Snyder at 2 o'clock p. m. on Tuesday May 7 to elect delegates to State Convention which will convene in Houston on May 28 where delegates will be elected to represent the democracy of Texas in the National Convention in Baltimore.

It is hoped that each precinct will send several delegates to the county convention so that the choice of Scurry county for president may be made known.

FATAL FIRE IN CLEBURNE

Johnson County Court House Consumed and Asst. City Marshal Killed by Falling Wall

The Johnson County Court House at Cleburne was destroyed by fire Sunday morning and Assistant City Marshal Bledsoe was caught by a falling wall and killed and a fireman probably fatally hurt.

A special from Cleburne, dated Monday says:

CLEBURNE, April 15—Still clasp ing the nozzle of the fire hose the body of Assistant City Marshal Albert Bledsoe was found this morning beneath brick and mortar in the debris of the Johnson county court house which burned here early yesterday. Bledsoe with a squad of firemen was on the second floor near the district court room playing water on the blaze when a wall toppled over.

He was the foremost man of the squad and the only one to be caught by the descending mass. Dutch Cash ion, another member of the squad was injured.

Cashion and the other survivors retreated to the second story windows whence they escaped to the ground.

Bledsoe was instantly killed. He leaves a widow and two small children.

The total damage was about seventy five thousand dollars with only thirty eight thousand dollars insurance.

The fire started near the base of the cupola. Defective wiring is suggested as a cause, although some investigators assert that it was incendiary.

The County records are believed to be safe.

But Democrats participate in their respective primaries.
For public information, the section of the Terrell Election Law, governing said conventions is as follows:
Sec. 139—Any political party desiring to elect delegates to a national convention shall hold a state convention at such place as may be designated by the State Executive Committee of said party on the fourth Tuesday in May 1908, every four years thereafter. Said Convention shall be composed of delegates duly elected by the voters of said political party in the several counties of the State at primary convention in May, 1908 and every four years thereafter.


Said primary Convention shall be held between the hours of 10 o'clock a. m. and 8 o'clock p. m. These primary conventions shall elect delegates to the County Conventions of the several counties, which shall be held on the first Tuesday after the first Saturday in May, 1908, and every four years thereafter.

The qualified voters of each voting precinct of the County shall assemble on the date named and shall be presided over, by a chairman who shall have been previously appointed by the County Executive Committee of the party and shall be a qualified voter in said election precinct and said Convention may elect from among their number a secretary and such other officers as may be necessary to conduct the business of the Convention.
The Chairman of said Convention

shall possess all the powers and authority that is given to election judges under the provisions of this act. Before transacting any business the Chairman shall make or cause to be made a list of all qualified voters present and the name of no person shall be entered upon said list nor shall he be permitted to vote or to participate in the business of such convention until it is made to appear that he is a qualified voter in said precinct from the certified list of qualified voters the same as is required in conducting a general election.

After the Convention is organized as above provided, it shall elect its delegates to the County Convention and transact such other business as may properly come before it.
The officers of said convention, shall keep a written record of its proceedings, including a list of the delegates elected to the County Convention, which record shall constitute the returns from said convention. The same shall be signed officially, sealed up and safely transmitted by the officers thereof to the Chairman of the County Executive Committee of the party and to be used by the executive committee in making up the roll of the County Convention.
