Conditions are Intolerable and aro Rapidly Growing Worse.
beverley, Mass., Sept. 7.-Although President Taft will not in tervene in Mexico without the full wonld mean war, his friends declared tonight that intervention is eclar er than it has been since the first American troops were rusined to the border eighteen months ago. It can now be stated on highest
authority, however, that shoul authority, however, that should the
president decide that interyention is the only course open to him, he will call congress in special session and demand of it the authority to
send the American border. Under no circumstances the has told his friends, would he do an unfriendly act against Mexico, with-
out consulting out consulting Congress. Friends of the President realize
that he would give the order to invade Mexico only with the greatest
reluctance. They are aware that it has afready been charged by senators that the President might send
the army across the line make himon that to bring victory to himself and the Republicen party in Novem-
ber. Mr. Taft has said that such a ation, and declared to his advisors
that it would be hard to conceive of a President who would use his
office to throw his country into wer office to throw his country into wer
which experts have predicted could
end in not less than wwo years: that would cost millions; that
would mean the sacrifice of thousands of lives and ruin for the years

friendship with the Central Americ The President today authorized General Leonard Wood, chief of
staff, U. S. A., to dispatch two more staff, S. A., to dispatch two more
regiments of cavalry to the Texas

from Fort Riley, Kan., and Fort D. A. Russell, Wyo. So far as the Pres-
ident was informed, there will ident was informed, there will be
no immediate need for more troops in Texas, but conditions along that border have grown worse in the las
few weeks. It is in the southern part of Mex ico, however, that the President ha
learned of intolerable conditions at fecting the Americans. There the Madero government, according to
the Washington information, is the Washington information, is ut-
terly unable to cope with the revorutionsts, and there seems to be
little propect that the situation will little propect that the situation will

the South, Mr. Taft has been told, would be to send troops to som gulf port of Mexico.
Intervention the Only Solution: The trouble is in the faterior and
the landing of troops in a Mexican port would mean intervention and war. There is no such opportunity in the south of Mexico to display
troops in force and thereby intill troops in force and thereby instil
respect for the United States, their has been along the Texas frontier. Only one solution of the problem has been put forward and that is interventio.
Mr. Taft is still hopeful, however that President Madero will improve
conditions so that such a step will not need to be taken.
The ninth cavalry will proceed to Douglas, Arizona and the thirteenth
Cayalry to El Paso from which points they will be distributed along the border.
