





SHOULD UNIVERSITY AND A. & M. COLLEGE UNITE

The agitation of the proposition to consolidate the A. & M. College and the State University has gained remarkable headway in a remarkably short time, and but for the conservative caution of some of the legislators, it is probable that a bill would have been railroaded through by now

A measure of such magnitude as that in which all the people of Texas are supposed to be interested should be given more thought.

The A. & M. College is an industrial school. It is there that we teach agriculture and mechanics, soils, climate, cultural methods and experiments, engineering, architecture and such other things as equip the young men of Texas for practical life, are taught there. The University, teaches the sciences, language, history, literature and the other lines of learning to make scholars and profes-
