The statement follows: Last summer and early fall I put
up some 200 tons of ensilage, using sorghum, kaffir corn and maize. In this lot of ensilage, I probably used
more maize than either kaffir corn more maize than either kaffir corn
or sorghum, but my opinion is from my experience with ensilage that kat-
fir corn is the best of these three forage crops, with sorghum second,
but I find that stock like it all. but I find that stock like it all.
Last fall I bought two hundred Last fall I bought two hundred
calves from four to six months old, calves from four to six months old,
receiving them November 1st. For
the first thirty days I ran the calves in the field on oats and stalk pasture, putting them in the pen at
night and feeding cotton seed. The weather being very cold and ratny ing my calves lost some thirty or forty pounds per head.
calves in the pens and began feeding them ensilage with 3 pounds of crushed maize per head each day, la-
ter changing from maize to cotton eed meal, using at first $11 / 2 \mathrm{lbs}$. pe of meal per head until I was giving
four pounds at close of feeding.
