We generally hear the old expresWe generally hear the old expres-
sion that "Competition is the Life of Trade" but why have we never heard
that competition without Co-opera-
ter tion is the Death of Trade?", Did you
ever see a business whose sucess was ever see a business whose success was
not due to the co-operation of its emnot due to the co-operation of its em
ployes; did you ever see a bank that
had grown to be a power of finme had grown to be a power of finance
without the co-operation of its of-
ficers ficers and directors; did you ever see
a town that stood for anything with a town that stood for anything with
out the co-operation of its people out the co-operation of its people,
both in a business and social way? So it is with the community or the State. For prosperity and advencement there must be co-operation of its people,
that is, its farmers, merchants that is, its farmers, merchants and
bankers. There must be competition bankers. There must be competitio
abroad, but co-operation at home abroad, but co-operation at home-
competition with other states and cooperation in our own state means diversification.
You might ask why this is true
and I would say and I would say because the one cro
plan is the competitive idea, eac plan is the competitive idea, each
producer being in competition with the other producer in his own com munity and State and only raising one staple product which will more
than compete with other states but than compete with other states, but
still at the same time spending all still at the same time spending al
the profits of this product in purchas ing the necessary food products from a foreign territory. The result of this
must necessarily mean high prices in must necessarily mean high prices in
food products to our people and low food products to our people and low
price of our own staple product, while on the other hand the diversification plan is the co-operative plan. By this plan we would raise enough
food products for our food products for our own consump-
tion and one or more staple articles for competition. We co-operate with ourselves in saving by raising our own food products and we compete with other communities in our staple
products. The diversification plan products. The diversification plan
plan therefore naturally means the plan therefore naturally means the
economical plan; the economical plan is always the best financial standard. Altogether the banker looks with more favor upon the credit of a man
who is diversifying his crops than he who is diversifying his crops than he
does upon one who is planting only one crop. Considering the failure of seasons, the diversifier will have more resources for taking care of his
credit and his obligations, while credit and his obligations, while if
