OPENING OF

The Snyder Public Schools open Monday September 8.

On account of the time required for adjusting the grades of the respective words and for procuring all books we shall have no opening exercises.

There will be no seventh grade at Central Building this year. The first day all pupils in the Seventh Grade will report at Colonial Hill school. All pupils in the Colonial Hill ward in the Sixth Grade will report at Central Building the first day. All pupils in the North Ward up to and including the Sixth Grade will re-All other pupils will report at Central buiding the first day.

It is the policy of the school board to arrange the attendance at the wards to accommodate the largest number of patrons, and we invite the friendly suggestion of any patcon in trying to accomplish this. On account of the situation of the ward schools it is almost impossible to arrange the attendance conenient for all the patrons, but we shall do our best, and we ask you to assist us. We feel confident that by working out the problem that way you will be satisfied, at least with our effort, whether you are satisfied with the situation of the respective build ings or not. You are all aware of the discontent resulting from that.

A faculty meeting of all teachers will be held at Central -building Septemger, 6 at 10.00 a. m.

No pupils are to bring books the first day. The state will furnish books and the pupils will be advised by the teachers how to procure them. As it is true that no public enterprise can make the best success without coperation, we invite every patron to co-operate, make friendly suggestions and criticisms and help us in every way you can to improve your schools constantly. I wish emphatically to state in the outset that we believe in our patrons and our pupils. A patron may make a mistake but that is no more than we teachers often do. We expect you to look over our mistakes and help us to mend them, therefore we can look over

If you have a grievance against a teacher, go to the teacher with it or else come to me, and you will be beard. It is a gross injustice to the teacher to the pupil to the school, and a keen reflection upon yourself criticise a teacher to the public efore you carry your complaint to he teacher It is equally as inconsistent for a teacher publicly to critisise a pupil, patrons or another eacher or superintendent or school pard. If we will work out our roubles with those vitally interested ve can not fail.

A school is for the pupils, but it s not for the pupils' to run. We inte your assistance in making the onduct of your children such that ou will be proud of, Will you do it? We are trusting you for that kind f support. It shall be our aim to cake this the best school Snyder as ever had. We realize that we have year's work before us. We want you o expect something of us and let is know all along how we are geting along. Do not be afraid to speak o us; we are just common folks ike you, and your servants at that. We get our monthly salary whether we do our full duty or not; but if we help your children on their way 76 shall receive a reward so high hat thieves can never touch it.

Sections of laws enacted since 1793, according to his statement, established for the Mexican government the legal right to exercise domiinon over coal and oil deposits and to enact mining and commercial codes which shall be binding through out the republic. Article 2e7 of the constitution of 1817, the statement says, "defines in clear terms the dominion of the nation over hydro-carbons and outlines a system of concessions for the explicit attention and development of petroleum territory.'

Refering to profits, the statement cites one company which in 1918 returned a net profit of more than 2,800,000 pounds sterling, being 177 per cent of the invested capital, which does ot include the increase of value in the lands controlled by the company.

In conclusion, the statement says: "This analysis is for the purpose of demonstration that the oil busines is a good one when it is carried out with the technical and financial means required by the magnitude of the enterprise."

We, the trustees of the various schools of Scurry county in annual meeting assembled do hereby adopt the following resolutions:

I. That whereas, due to the fact that the high cost of living and other causes have driven many of our best teachers from the profession, to. seek more remunerative employment; and.

2. Whereas many of our schools are unable to secure experienced teachers which are so badly needed to meet the emergency of the "afterwar-conditions," we as a body do hereby resolve that we favor higher salaries commensurate with the services rendered and that we recognize the fact that before this can be done, the local taxes in many of the various districts will necessarily have to be raised, and

3. Realizing the great responsibility under which our teachers are placed in the intellectual, moral and physical welfare of the children placed under their care be it resolved that we exercise due care and diligence in the employment of our teachers and that we strongly recommend that they abstain from the use of profane or vulgar language, the use of tobacco in any form, and the habit of dancing, and that they use all reasonable efforts to discourage: these things among the pupils whom they teach, and

How Constitution is Amended. The American Congress adopted amendment to the federal constitution granting full rights to women and submitting it to the severalstate legislatures to be ratified or rejected. Just a few weeks previous to that act the matter of state suffrage had been submitted in Texas and defeated by a small majority. Now the anti administration democrats in Texas are howling because the Texas legislature ratified the amendment, without again getting a popular vote. As a matter of fact the Texas legislature followed the law and had no constitutional authority to submit the national amendment to a popular vote. The Constitution of the United States Says:

Article 5.

"The Congress, whenever two thirds of both houses shall deem it necesssary; shall propose amendments to this constitution, or, on application of two thirds of the several states shall call a convention for proposing amendments, which, in either case shall be valid to all intents and purposes, as part of constitution when ratified by the legislatures of threefourths of the several states, or by conventions in three fourths thereof as the one or the other mode of ratiflication may be proposed by congress






