Senate Joint Resolution No. 12. oposing an amendment to Section
4 of Article XI of the Constitution increasing the total tax rat that may be levied by cities and towns having a population of five thousand or less from one-fourth of one per cent to not exceeding on appropriation therefor. e it resolved by the L the State of Texas:
Section 1. That Section 4, Arti
XI of the Constitution be e XI of the Constitution be so mended
ollows:
Section 4. Cities and towns hav less may be chartered alone by genand law. They may levy, assess thorized by law, but no may be au purpose shall ever be lawful for an one year which shall exceed one and one-half per cent of the taxable property of such city; and all taxes

money, and all licenses and occupafeitures and penalties accruing to said cities and towns shall be collec tible only in current money. Section 2. The foregoing con
