Landlords and persons who live in rental property are urged to contact the Housing Authority of Callahan County concerning participation in a program designed to assist our citizens to secure decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

The program benefits landlords and owners by providing financial assistance during vacancy and certain depository and damage guarantees. The program aids eligible renters by providing financial assistance on the basis of need.

Persons that wish to apply for rent assistance must make application for eligibility and subsequently provide proof of income. Applicants must be a family or head of household. If an individual applies he or she must be 62 years of age or handicapped or disabled.

Cost of housing occupied by the applicant must be within the limits set forth in a fair market rent schedule. Fair Market rents are based on standard market housing, however any standard unit falling within the Fair Market schedule is eligible.

Participation in the rent assistance program is voluntary on the part of owners/landlords and renters.



And/Or Barley:Producers who signed an intent to participate in the 1979 Feed Grain, Cotton, Wheat Program, and who have a crop loss from abnormal weather conditions, such as flood, excessive rain, hail, etc, should within 15 days after the loss, file a disaster claim with your county ASCS office. Do not make any other use of the acreage until after a farm visit is made and appraisal of the loss.

Final Dates:June 14 is the final date to transfer peanut allotment and quota by lease or owner transfer. July 15 is the final date to certify planted peanuts, grain sorghum, corn, cotton and set-aside.

ACP Aerial Spraying: Aerial Spraying will start May 28th and continue for twenty-five days, through June 21, 1979.

Fuel Allocation for Farm Operations: The U.S. Department of Agriculture is stressing the need for regulations to protect food and fiber production, and that necessary fuels are provided for such. Any fuel problems will be handled through the Texas State Energy Office. Do Not wait until you are completely out of fuel before checking with your supplier. In the event you or your suppliers are having trouble obtaining the necessary fuel to carry on your farming operations, the ASCS office in Baird has the necessary forms needed to apply for the Texas Crop & Livestock

and county summaries become part of the final published estimate. This is a cooperative effort of the USDA's Economics. Statistics, and Cooperattives Service and the Texas Department of Agriculture.

Grain Storage Loans Available:Funds are available to buy, build or remodel on-farm storage facilities. Under the farm facility loan program, farmers can borrow up to \$50,000 on structures adequate to store two years' crops, with 15 percent down and 10.5 percent interest. They can build conventional type on-farm

Hail Damaged Wheat Questionnaire: During late confidential, and only state storage structures such as ries, and wet storage facilities. To be eligible for farm facility loans, producers must grow one or more crops of barley, corn, grain sorghum, oats, peanuts, rye, wheat and high-moisture forage.


