Touching on Snyder's growth we want to point to the danger of becoming over-conservative in these matters and fail to make forward progress we are entitled to make. Snyder is a rattling good town, but can be made better by well matured plans of civic and commercial progress. We have reached a stage in our history when surrounding conditions which include population and trade territory importance, when we should put forward extra efforts this year to accomplish some worthwhile things in a civic way. The square and principal business streets should be paved before the close of 1924.
The point has been reached in our towns history when paving is absolutely necessary. The value of our merchandising storcks around the square demands that paving take place.
