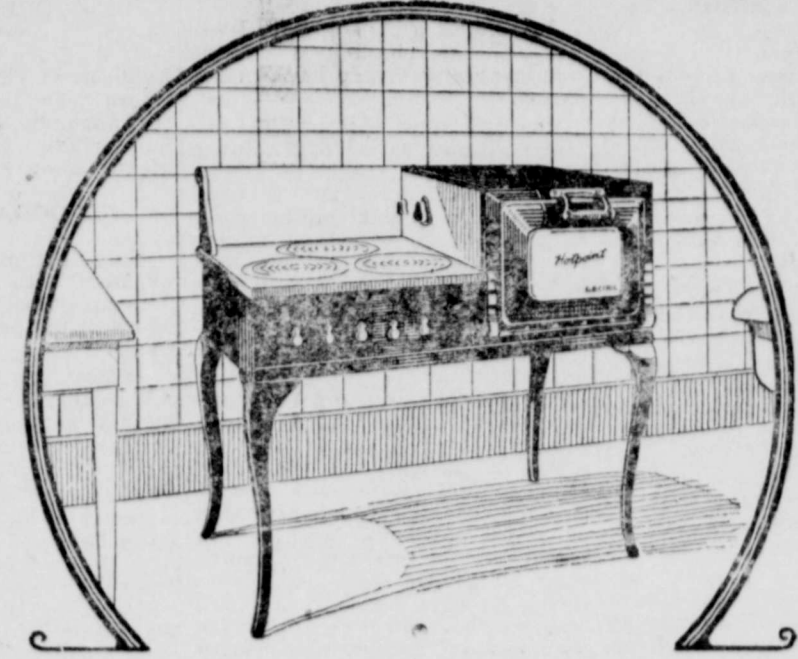

boiler is a convenient utensil to use for this purpose. Spice may be added to the pumpkin if desired and the flavor obtained by cooking the spice in at the time of canning is better than making the addition at the time of using. The following proportion of ground spices is generally used: for each quart of steamed strained brown sugar, two teaspoonsful of pumpkin add one-half cupful of cinnamon, one teaspoonful of salt, and one teaspoonful of ginger. Stir the pulp until of a smooth, even consistency, pack into cans

or jars while hot, and process in a water-bath intermittently one hour on each of three successive days, or process in a steam-pressure outfit for thirty-five minutes under ten-pound pressure.
