The number of certified authorization from the state, dent School District is just barely higher than the state average.
According to Superintendent Bill Moore, only seven of the 129 teachers, or 5 percent, in the district are not properly certified.
Statewide only 3.96 percent of teachers fail to have the proper certification, according Certification Certification
Out of the seven teachers locally that are not properly certified, most only need to take and pass a test to get official

Moore said. Many are already teaching in their area of specialization and lacking the endorsement for the particular subject they are currently teach-

For Muleshoe ISD the number of uncertified teachers is attributed most to secondary teachers teaching on the elementary level, said Moore. ## Counting fat grams best way to monitor food intake

HOUSTON - Counting fat grams is more effective than keeping food records, according to a study conducted by researchers at The DeBakey Heart Center at Baylor College of Houston in Houston. "For years, dietitians have used the food-record rating system to calculate how much total fat patients eat," said Dr. William Insull, professor of medicine and director of the Lipid Research Clinic at Baylor and The Methodist Hospital.
"Fat-gram counting is a simpler alternative and is less time-consuming for both the dietitian and the patient."

The food-record rating system requires dietitians to know standard recipes and exact serving sizes to "match" certain foods to a table of foods in a computer database. Foods are scored assorting to their cholesterol-lowering ability The process can take up to an hour.
"Unlike the food-recordrat ing which gives you more in formation than you need, like caloric content, fat-gram counting only gives out the fat gram value," Insull said
Insull and registered dieti tian Donna S. Roy collabo rated with a research team of dietitians and recruited 78 study participants were randomly assigned to a fat-gram counting group and food-

record rating group led by dietitians to test the effectiveness of both methods. Each participant completed four
three-day food records which were evaluated by food-record rating for one group and by fat-gram counting for the other group.
The dietitians used the fat gram counting method on one group and the food-record rating method on the other group.
"We found no significant differences in dietary adhe ence in the two groups," Insull

## Time for college－bound high school seniors to start sending in applications

GEORGETOWN－If you＇re a college－bound high school senior，add this to your getting a jump－start on your college applications

Most universities and col leges are now processing ap－ plications from students who want to enroll in fall 1998，and many will begin making finan－ cial aid and scholarship awards in February，says John Lind， vice president for enrollment management at Southwestern University，a selective national liberal arts college located in Georgetown，TX
Even more incentive to act quickly：students who apply early get better choices for on－ campus housing and are at the head of the line for financial aid．

But where to apply？
＂Some high school seniors already have decided what ca－ reer path to follow，which makes choosing a college and a specific major easier，＂Lind
＂But the vast majority are unsure about their plans，mak－ ing the task of finding the school right for them rather intimidat－ ing．＂
He says students shouldn＇t fell pressured to choose a ma－ jor before reaching the college classroom．Those who need help should visit with their high school guidance counselors for access to information about all sorts of colleges－subjective guides，objective guides，au－ dio－visual packages and，in some cases，computer pro

grams that can connect students directly to college or unive sity admission offices

Lind said that within the last few years，many colleges and universities，including South－ western，have created World Wide Web sites，which stu－ dents can access by using the Internet and using a search function to find the college or university that interest them．
At the sites，students can find information about the school＇s academic and social opportu－ nities or even take a＂virtual＂ tour of campus．
The average student today will change majors at least once during a college career，nation－ wide figures indicate．Futurist John Naisbitt predict that the
typical student will change ca－
reers three or four times during a life span－the result of a job market that will continue to undergo major technological advances．

Students really need to look arefully at themselves，＂says Lind．＂What are they like？What is their ambition？In what type environment are they most Iate individually ned to eachers？Do they want to stay in－state？

But don＇t rule out colleges n cost alone．
＂Too many people begin by looking at cost and ultimately exclude some viable options． tudents should determine what type of college suits their
