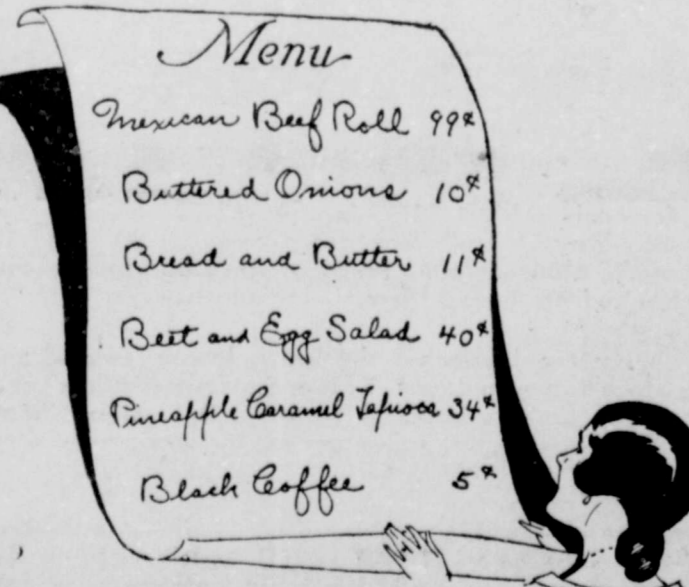

A Two-Dollar Dinner for Six



HERE is a good dinner the ingredients of which will cost \$1.99 if you do your marketing carefully, and which will serve six persons.

Drain the contents of a 3-ounce can of diced beets, chill thoroughly, and arrange in nests of lettuce. Slice three hard-cooked eggs and place in an overlapping circle around the beets. Sprinkle three tablespoons sugar, and add to the milk. Add four tablespoons sugar, four and one-half tablespoons minute tapioca and a few grains salt. Cook until tapioca is transparent. Beat one egg, pour hot mixture over slowly and return to double boiler, stirring constantly till thick and creamy. Add the contents of a No. 2 can of crushed pineapple and cool. Serve very cold.

SOME DECORATIVE DISHES

Tomato Aspic is a decorative dish for your table. First drain a large can of tomatoes in a colander, and save the pulp portion for stewed tomatoes.

Tomato Timbales: Bring to the boiling point two and a half cups of canned tomatoes seasoned with one and one-fourth teaspoons of salt and one-eighth teaspoon of pepper.

Rarebits for Cold Weather: Tomato Rarebit with Eggs: Stew three cups of canned tomatoes, one-fourth teaspoon of soda, one and a half teaspoons of salt and one-fourth teaspoon of pepper five minutes.

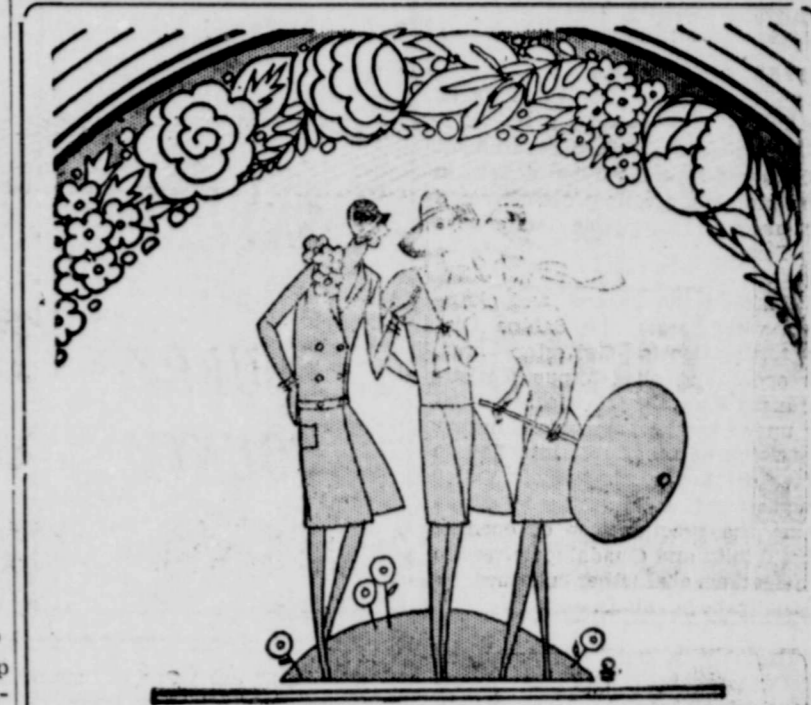

GROWING WITH TEXAS



DALLAS, June 18—A complete summary of crop conditions in Texas for the month of May would be extremely difficult, although, in general, it may be said that the condition of all crops is under expectations of reports compiled by the Southland Life Insurance Company for April.

NORTHWEST TEXAS: High winds and hot, dry weather have reversed wheat crop conditions, very promising up to a month ago. Seven or eight counties report crop below normal; at least several others in same condition.

NORTHEAST: Cotton generally below normal; all complain of rain. In some localities overflows; farms getting fouled with weeds and grass. Corn, oats and feed grains reported below normal to normal.
