And briefly speaking he laid the foundation for peaceful living by his comments regarding marriage, some of which are; "wives submit yourselves unto your own husbands, as unto the Lord and husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it."

"to be followers of God as dear children, and walk in love, as Christ hath also loved us." And we find the basis of his concern when he went to Ephesus, as recorded in Acts Chapter 20. Paul then said he was going bound in the spirit unto Jerusalem not knowing the things that might await him except he would suffer bonds and afflictions.

"But none of those my life dear unto myself, "And from Miletus so that I might finish he sent to Ephesus, and my course with joy, the ministry, which I have received of the Lord Jesus, to testify the gospel of the grace of God."

"And now behold I I came into Asia, after know that ye all, among

of God, shall see my face no more. Wherefore I take you to record this day, that I am pure from the blood of all men, for I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God." Note: "All the counsel of God."

It will not be possible to present all I have in mind in this one article, but I will try to complete it in the next one, which I hope will be next week.

I do however spend most of my time doing what I can in this type work, and helping others with their problems.

And I like to think of Paul as a guide, or as he said in Timothy, that Christ should show forth in him through all longsuffering a pattern to those that might hereafter believe on him to life everlasting.

"Take thereafter unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made thee overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood. For I know this, that after my departing grievous wolves shall enter in among you, not sparing the flock."

"Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things to draw away disciples after them. Thereafter watch, and remember, Farwell — Amanda that by the space of three every one night and day Wayland Baptist with tears."

#### NOTICE OF ELECTION

In accordance with the provisions of the Texas Agriculture Code, Chapter 74, Subchapter D, and 4 Tex. Admin. Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter A, the Texas Department of Agriculture (the Department) will conduct a board election in the Northwest Plains Boll Weevil Eradication Zone, in order to select a representative of the above-referenced zone to serve on the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board of Directors. The board is charged with administering the boll weevil eradication program in Texas.

The Northwest Plains Boll Weevil Eradication Zone consists of all of Bailey, Castro, Deaf Smith, Lamb and Parmer counties; and that part of Randall County that lies north and west of a line running along Highway 60 from the Deaf Smith County line east to Interstate 27; then running north along Interstate Highway 27 to the Potter County line.

Any person eligible to vote in the board member election that resides in the Northwest Plains Zone and meets the seven-year experience requirement may place their name in nomination for election to the Texas Boll Weevil Eradication Foundation Board by written application to the Department at the address provided below. Nomination forms are provided by the Department and must be signed by the nominee and at least ten other eligible voters. The nomination form must be received by the Department at its office located in Austin by February 7, 2011, and must provide the legal residence of the applicant. A nomination form may be obtained by contacting the Department office or any county agent located in the voting area.

The board election will be held by mail balloting. Ballots will be mailed to cotton growers by February 22, 2011. All ballots cast by mail must be postmarked no later than March 9, 2011, in order to be valid. Any cotton grower having planted cotton in the year 2010 within the zone defined above is eligible to vote, and, if he or she resides in the Northwest Plains Zone and has at least seven years experience as a cotton grower, can have his or her name placed on the ballot as a candidate in the board member election. A cotton grower is defined as a person who grows cotton intended to be commercial cotton. The term includes an individual who, as owner, landlord, tenant or sharecropper, is entitled to share in the cotton grown and available for marketing from the farm, or share in the proceeds from the sale of the cotton from the farm or from an indemnity or other payment received from or related to the planting, growing, or failure of the cotton.
