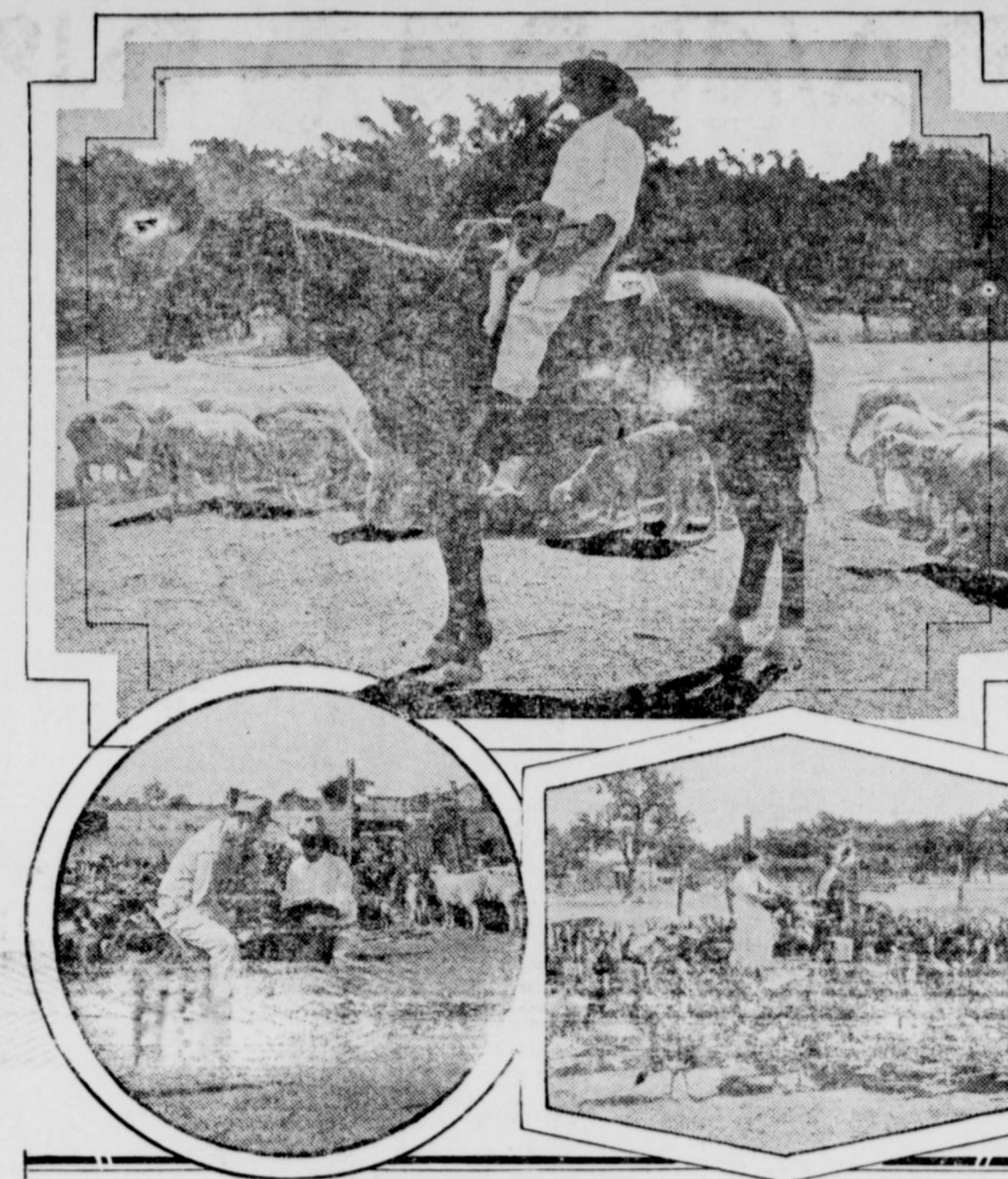
IRA GIRLS FEED COUNTY BOARD
