Flood at the Muleshoe zoo

Sophie is dead. She was the only casualty during the recent flood waters this week which inundated the southwestern to eastern areas of Muleshoe.

If you never met Sophie, you missed the possible beginning of the Muleshoe Zoo. Sophie was a lion that Victor Cox obtained when she was a cub some five or six years ago.

Cox kept Sophie in a cage at his place on Highway 84 at the eastern edge of Muleshoe. Many times, in the still of the night, you could hear Sophie roaring into the darkness.

Assistant Chief of Police Ray Cline and Ken Angeley finally got a boat into the raging torrent around the cage Tuesday afternoon in an effort to check on Sophie, but it was too late. The cage was completely covered with water.

Bailey County Deputy Sheriff Corky Green and Texas Highway Patrolman Joe Young made another attempt Thursday to get into where the cage is located, but could not get in because of the high water.

Since Cox went to Oklahoma recently, local people had been caring for Sophie.

Let the fun begin

Mules face Fritch Saturday in bi-district

The similarities are eerie. When Muleshoe meets Sanford-Fritch Saturday in a Class 3A Division II bi-district playoff game at Kimbrough Memorial Stadium in Canyon (7 p.m.) both teams will push aside a recent history long on losing and short on playoff appearances.

Now both can put the losing behind themselves after breakthrough seasons in 1998.

The Mules (9-1) won the District 2-3A championship, their first district title since 1979. The Eagles

(9-1) earned a share of the District 1-3A crown.

Both coaches are down-playing the lack of playoff experience.

"We're just going to approach it as we do any other game," Muleshoe head coach David Wood said.

Sanford-Fritch head coach Rick Ware offered nearly the identical answer.

"We're trying to stay focused and not get caught up in the hoopla," Ware said.

But there's no overlooking the possibility of two nervous teams showing up Saturday. No one could blame them.

Sanford-Fritch last appeared in the playoffs in 1990. Muleshoe has to go all the way back to 1983.

The Eagles won a total of four games in the four seasons before 1998, including a 1-9 mark last year in Ware's first season. The Mules

won 12 games in the 1990s — including a 1-9 record in Wood's first season in 1996 — before going 5-5 last year.

Both coaches credit their off-season programs for the turnarounds.

"The kids really worked hard all spring and summer," Ware said. "The kids deserve the credit, it wasn't anything I did."

In Sanford-Fritch, the Mules face a potent offensive attack led by one of the area's top runners in T.J. Clark and a quick, aggressive defense.

Muleshoe counters with a stout defense that has posted six shutouts and a versatile offense led by senior quarterback Matt McClanahan.

"If we continue to play defense the way we've been playing, it will be hard for any team to beat us,"

Muleshoe

Offense: Multiple set. Averaging 310 yards and 25.8 points per game.

Features one of the biggest and best offensive lines in the area. Power running game featuring bruising RB Greg Pena (646 yards, 5 TDs) and option QB Matt McClanahan (543 yards, 10 TDs). Pena has stepped up in Gilbert Vela's absence, gaining 471 yards in four games. McClanahan (45-93, 725 yards, 6 TDs) keeps defenses honest. WR Manuel Campolla doesn't have big numbers, but is a game-breaker.

Defense: 50. Allowing 157.5 yards and 5.5 points per game. Six shutouts.

Mules hang their hat on the defense. Have forced 29 turnovers and recorded 28 QB sacks. Pena is a force at LB. LB Mitch Mason is leading tackler. Safeties B.J. Gonzales and Campolla spearhead secondary.

Sanford-Fritch

Offense: Pro set. Averaging 380 yards and 27.7 points a game.

RB T.J. Clark (1,448 yards, 22 TDs) one of the top ball carriers in the area. FB Justin Holland (583 yards) is also a threat. Tyson Shappley (590 yards, 2 TDs) and sophomore Shiloh Reed split time at QB. Reed is a dangerous runner.

Defense: Split 6. Allowing 168 yards and 7.7 points per game. Three shutouts.

Quick, attacking defense led by Holland at LB. The Eagles try to control the gaps by stunting their DL and blitzing their LBs.

Keys to the game: Muleshoe needs to control T.J. Clark, limit big plays and win the turnover battle. Sanford-Fritch has to use its quickness on defense to neutralize Muleshoe's size advantage.

Bottom line: Muleshoe needs to tackle well and hold Sanford-Fritch to 2 TDs or less.

The Bailey County Meals on Wheels program is looking for a few good volunteers.

Berta Combs, director of Aging Services for Bailey County and coordinator for Meals on Wheels, said that holidays are not a normal part of Meals on Wheels.

"We thought we'd try to do something new this year," she said. "We are asking for volunteers that wouldn't mind sharing a part of their Thanksgiving meal or purchasing one for someone."

Combs said there are about 18-20 area residents that need assistance.

Meals on Wheels consists solely of volunteers who deliver meals to those in need five days a week. Last year, 45 volunteers donated 1,128 hours to Meals on Wheels.

"I think that the volunteers feel their best when they help others. They feel more blessed than the person they are trying to help," Combs said.

MISD school board notes

The Board of Trustees began their meeting Monday night with a public hearing on the Academic Excellence Indicator System Report for 1997-98.

The AEIS report indicates that all four MISD campuses are rated acceptable by the Texas Education Agency. The AEIS report compares MISD to other schools our size and to all the districts in Region 17. It also shows gains and losses in our TAAS scores for the past two years. TAAS scores, drop-out rates and attendance are the three major criteria in both cam-

pus and district ratings.

A copy of the complete AEIS report can be found on each campus in both the principal's office and the library. A copy of the report will also be placed in the Muleshoe public library.

The next item of business for the Trustees was to review a proposed handbook for substitute teachers. Although no official action was taken by the Trustees, the Board unanimously lent their support to the handbook.

The handbook is being developed at the recommendation

of the District Forum committee in an effort to assist the district's substitute teachers. It contains information concerning the district dress code, the discipline policy on each campus, primary contact personnel on each campus, campus maps, and other data.

In other business, the Trustees reviewed Update 59 to the Board Policy Manual, received a report on the usage of the Employee Assistance Program, and discussed the National Science Foundation's Texas Rural Systemic Initiative Grant.

The meeting ended with reports given by the administrative staff members present at the meeting.

The next meeting will be held on Nov. 23.

White family donates Cashway building

For years the White's Cashway Grocery was a hub for the Muleshoe area, a place where friends met to visit and buy their groceries.

It was also a place where the less fortunate could count on a little help to see them over a difficult period. T.R. White and family ran this friendly business for years, but in 1983 the doors of White's Cashway Grocery were closed.

In 1987, the Muleshoe Heritage Foundation rented the building and opened the Heritage Thrift Shop under the direction of Marie Bradley and Ruth Hall. In 1990, after working at the Thrift Shop for two years, Vivian White took over the management and continues to work and keep books there.

At the annual membership open meeting of the Muleshoe Heritage Foundation this year, the heirs of T.R. White, Clifford White and Jerie Nell White Flowers, donated the former White's Cashway Grocery building and property to the Muleshoe Heritage Foundation. This is the largest single donation ever made to the Muleshoe Heritage Founda-

tion, and will give the Heritage Thrift Shop a permanent home. The former White's Cashway Grocery building is a perfect place for the Thrift Shop, but it needs a new roof.

The Muleshoe Heritage Foundation board members enlisted the help of Irvin St. Clair to conduct a fund-raiser to help replace the old roof.

Mr. St. Clair has accepted this challenge and has organized a team consisting of Frank Ellis, Victor Leal, Bill Liles and Terry Hutton to accomplish this much needed project. After conducting a study, Mr. St. Clair has concluded that \$20,000 is needed to construct a new roof and to repair interior damage.

This team headed by Mr. St. Clair, notes that there will be three levels of donors and memorials which will be placed on special plaques at the Heritage old depot. The three levels are as follows:

The Golden Muleshoe — \$1,000 and above. Homesteaders (Life Membership) — \$500 and above. Patrons — \$100 and above.

It is hoped that this drive can be completed by Nov. 18. If you are not contacted by this

Wood said.

Muleshoe will key on Clark, who has rushed for 1,458 yards and 22 touchdowns during the regular season. Clark helped Sanford-Fritch average 380 yards and 27.7 points a game. "He's not the biggest kid, but he runs with the heart of an elephant," Wood said. "His feet never stop moving."

The Eagles have other weapons in running back Justin Holland (573 yards) and quarterbacks Tyson Shappley (590 yards passing) and Shiloh Reed. Holland, who doubles at line-backer, spearheads a smallish but quick Eagle defense that allowed 168 yards and less than 10 points a game.

Wood said Sanford-Fritch slants its lineman and blitzes linebackers in an attempt to control the gaps.

As usual, Muleshoe will rely on its huge and veteran offen-

sive line to control the line of scrimmage and open holes for senior running back Greg Pena and senior quarterback Matt McClanahan.

Splitting time at fullback and tailback, Pena has rushed for 471 yards in the last four games while McClanahan has amassed 1,263 yards of total offense and accounted for 16 touchdowns.

Atwood qualifies for state meet

LUBBOCK—Kyle Atwood was tired, but not too tired to smile.

The Muleshoe High School freshman needed a career-best effort to finish seventh Saturday at the Region I-3A cross country meet and qualify for the state meet.

"I'm pretty excited," said Atwood, who has taken his running success in stride this season—he's consistently finished in the top five and no worse than ninth. "I'm kind of interested in what it's going to be like at state."

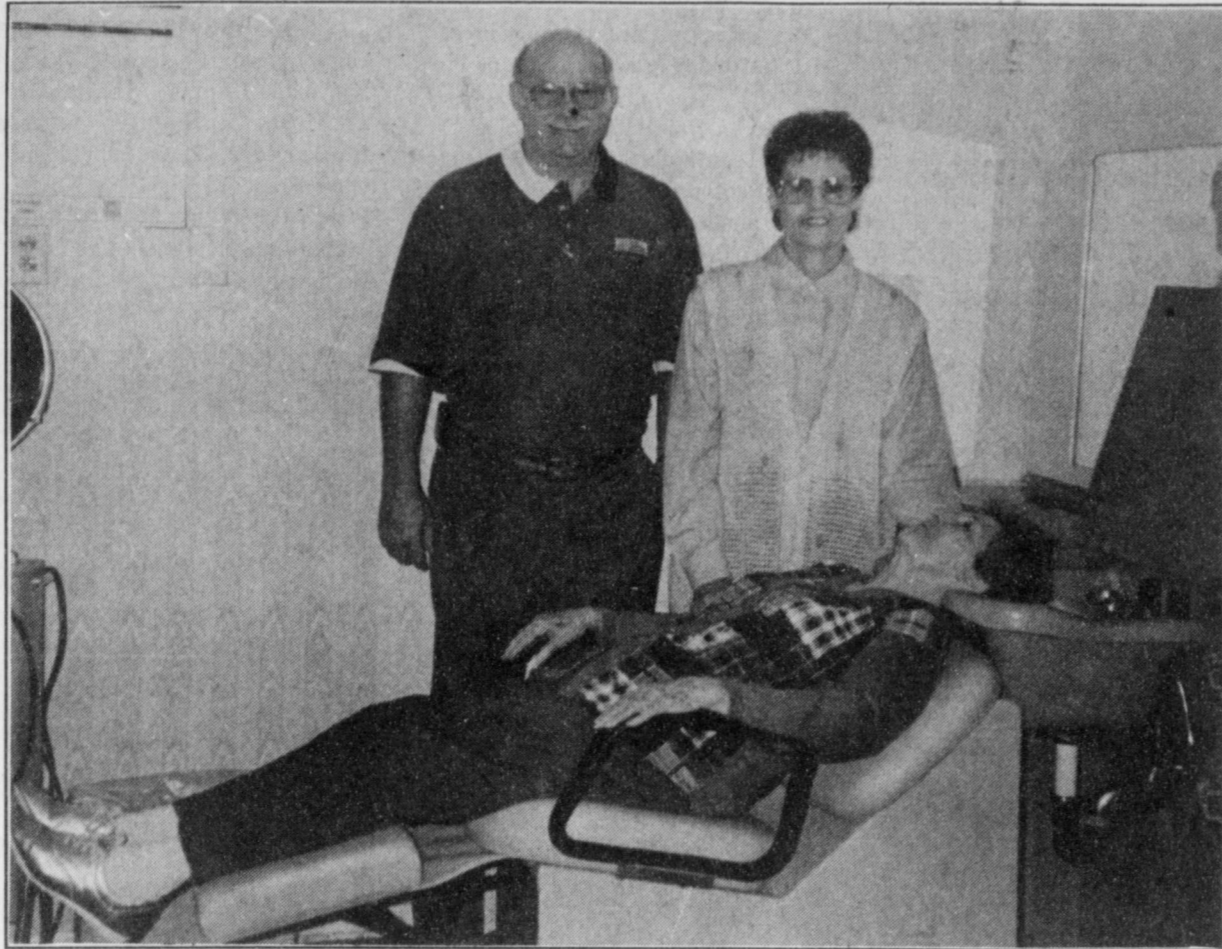
Morris is the son of Gail and Marca Morris of Lazbuddie and is a member of the Lazbuddie FFA Chapter.

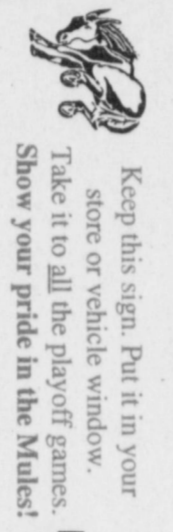
