

John 8:32

EXCUSES-No. 8

This will be the last article on excuses and in fact the last article I will write for this paper, as we will move to Everett, Washington the first week in March. In this closing article, permit me to note some seven arguments often offered by those who refuse to obey the Lord. They are:

1. IT DOESN'T MATTER WHAT YOU BELIEVE AS LONG AS YOU ARE SINCERE. No one was ever saved by sincerity but by obeying the "will of the father in heaven. Matt. 7:21. Why did Jesus warn us not to believe every spirit I John 4:1. Other scriptures that point out our need for believing the truth of God are: Matt 24:4, II John 9, I Timothy 1:3, II Timothy 4:3 and 4. If sincerity is enough what if one was a sincere athiest? Why did Paul and Cornelius have to obey the Lord?

2. YOU CAN PROVE ANYTHING BY THE BIBLE. In John 17:17 we read that "God's Word is Truth." All truth must run in parallel lines and can not contridict itself. Jesus was not guilty of saying things out of both corners of his mouth. The problem is that some would take a subject out of

3. IT DEPENDS ON THE WAY A MAN INTERPRETS THE BIBLE. There can be only one interpretation put on the Bible. That is what it really means. We must never "read" into a passage our prejudicies or ideas.

4. MAN IS SAVED BY FAITH ALONE. James 2:24 says "Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by faith alone". Other spriptures, Acts 10:35; James 2:19; 2:17; and I Cor. 13:2.

5. ONE DOESN'T HAVE TO BE BAPTIZED TO BE SAVED. The Bible does not say that! Mark 16:16. "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved." Acts 2:38 "Repent. and be baptized for the remission (taking away) of sins." Acts 22:16 and I Peter 3:21 also.

6. ANY MODE (METHOD) OF BAPTISM IS O.K. This: is not true. The word baptism means to dip, plunge or immerse. The Bible describes it as a burial, planting and a resurrection. Romans 6:1-6; Col. 2:12. There is not one command or example of sprinkling in the New Testament!

7. ONE DOESN'T HAVE TO BE A MEMBER OF ANY CHURCH TO BE SAVED. In Acts 2:47 we find "the Lord" added to the church such as should be saved." If God adds to the church the saved, how could one be saved outside the church? The church is called the body of Christ, Ephesians 1:22 and 23. Christ is the savior of the bod yEphesians 5:23, and I Corinthians 12:13 "we are baptized into one body" Thus we are to be baptized in order to get into the body

Have you been guilty of one of the above false arguements or excuses? If so why not repent before it is too late.




