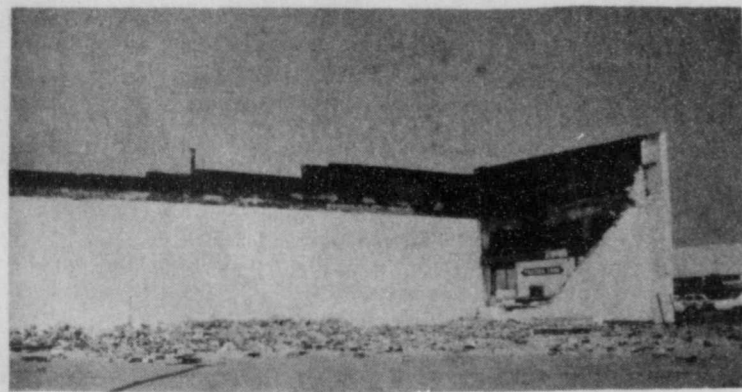
Damaging Hail Accompanies Spotted Rain Over County



Before hail and windstorm struck Fisher County last Tuesday, most cotton crops appeared as shown above.

Fisher County was covered by spotted rainfall Tuesday night, Aug. 18 accompanied by one of the most damaging hail and windstorms in several years.

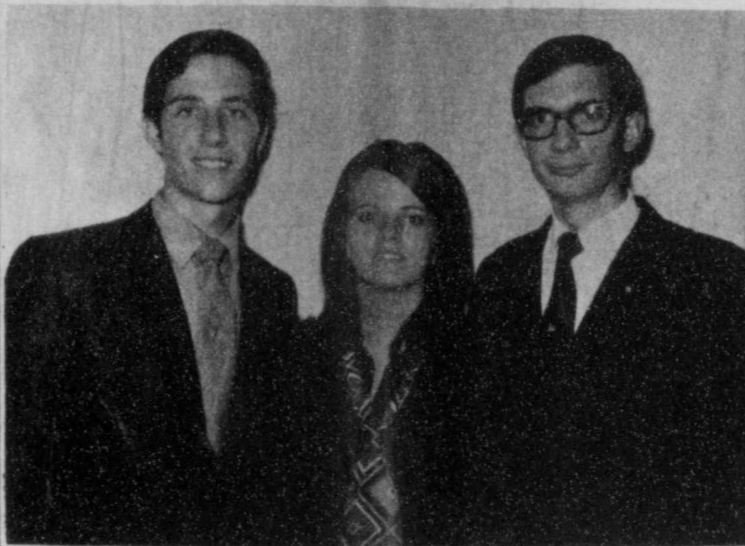
Hail storm started about five miles SW of Rotan and about the same distance NW of Roby. Storm traveled northeast to the Royston community. Among the heaviest damaged farms were Walter Byrd, Dan Park, Emory Keener, Addie Keener and Gene Terry. Terry had heavy damage to hay barn and sprinkler system. As the storm traveled to North Roby Community, Dwight Lovett lost top of hog barn. Mack Blair had house roof and barn destroyed. Practically all farms in the 1-1/2 mile wide strip were either destroyed or badly damaged. Some farmers in the area were "shredding" cotton following the storm.

REA and telephone company lost several poles to the vicious wind.

Most of Roby area received rainfall varying from 1 to 3 inches.

Moisture in Rotan area varied from 1 to 3 inches. North of town a spotted 2 inch rain fell. Fred Byerly gauged only .02 inch during the spell.

County Cotton Insect Report

Weekly insect check for boll weevils and boll worms was initiated by the State Department of Agriculture and the Fisher County Boll Weevil Control Association on August 18. The check will continue through September with Gary Floyd of Roby serving as Official Entomologist. Certain fields sprayed in the State Diapause Program will be checked weekly.

The data collected last week is as follows:

Location, West of Roby; % punctured squares, 2. 2%; high % 4% and low % 0%.
South of Roby, % punctured squares, 2. 85%; high, 10%; low, 0%.
East of Roby, % punctured squares, 14. 4%; high, 30%; low, 1%.
Royston, % punctured squares, 33. 7%; high, 66%; low, 10%.
Sylvester, % punctured squares, 12. 5%; high, 16%; low, 9%.
North Roby, % punctured squares, 29%.

Bollworm damage was minute or non-existent in all fields checked.

This week more fields will be added in areas not previously checked.
