Getting water from its source

to where it is needed often creates problems.

Plastic pipe may be the answer to the problem even if the water is to be used in the home. Plastic pipe, is economical and easy to install. The smooth interior surface reduces pressure loss in the pipe due to friction, and normally a plastic pipe has the same water carrying capacity as a galvanized steel pipe one size larger.

Less labor is needed for installing plastic pipe. Digging a ditch isn't necessary. A boot attached to a subsciler designed for a farm tractor will feed the plastic pipe into the trench cut by the blade.

Flexible pipe can be worked around large rocks, laid around curves or placed on uneven grades without cutting the pipe or using expensive fittings.

Pipe-fitting attachments for subsoilers are relatively inexpensive, Their cost can be justified in time and labor saved. Often a subsoiler or pipelaying attachment can be renter or neighbor.

Plastic pipe to be used for carrying water into the home should bear the seal of the National Sanitation Foundation.

It a water pipeline is needed to get water to spots on the farm where it is not now available, check into the possibility of using plastic pipe.

Mild disease conditions are not always easy to detect when buying omamentals. Dealing with reputable nurserymen is the best insurance against getting puny plants.

Plants in poor growth condition are usually more susceptible to disease and the weather this spring has been such as to cause delayed growth on many

Plants should be checked for any sign of disease and all diseased branches should be removed. Pruning woulds should be treated with an approved wound dressing to stop the entrance of wood decaying organisms.

Even good cultural and sanitation practices may fall short at times. This is the time to use specially formulated chemicals which are safe when applied according to label instructions.

Don't ruin your lawn by mowencourages a thinning of the turf and shallow rooting. This lowers the resistance of the lawn to drouth and disease, and gives weeds an opportunity to 1y.

Because of the extended drouth a lot of lawns are depending upon their owners to give them the water and plant food needed to keep up their good appearance, And this is no easy job. It will take the best management practices to keep the lawn beautiful and growing and proper mowing is one of the most important practices.

The lawn should be mowed often enough so no more than ed from a local machinery deal- one inch of the leaf tip is removed at any one clipping.

Proper mowing requires a sharp well adjusted mower. The mower should be sharp enough to cut the tips of leaves without crushing or burising them. Most mowers can easily be adjusted to the correct cutting height. Bermuda lawns should be mowed at a height of one to one and a half inches and most other lawn grasses a half-inch

The management practices used on the lawn during the current dry weather can well determine whether or not your


The dust settles over the world after the atomic warfare of World War III.
