

Wedel said everyone should come to the meetings with written comments to leave with the board members and to speak about how they will be affected and provide suggestions to improve the regulations.

"It doesn't have to be anything formal, but the board needs to hear constructive suggestions on how to make their conservation plan better,"

If residents are unable to attend these meetings to present comments, written comments must be submitted directly to the water district by 5 p.m. on April 1.
