### Telephone Company To Adjust Rates In Sept

telephone rates, which features phies will be presented this year a new reduced rate for Direct Distance Dialing and increased instead of jack-potting entry fees. rates for operator- assisted calls within Texas, was announced today by Southwestern Bell.

Scheduled to go into effect September 1, the adjustment rodeo performance will be Satur about 2 per cent, or \$15 million annually. H. D. Schodde, vice president for Southwestern Bell operations in Texas, said the after-tax result will be an increase of \$7 million in net operating revenue. "That amount should assist the company in maintaining its earnings in the of its property in Texas", Schodde

The new rates represent the first major long distance rate increase in the state since 1955. The company reduced rates \$6

million annually in 1967.

Schodde said the adjustment closely parallels a trend by AT&T and other operating telephone companies to place increases on calls which require operator assistance, and provides a reduction for station-to-station calls which customers can complete themselves. "It costs us more to provide operator assistance, " Schodde said, "so that's where we're placing most of the increase. On the other hand, customers who dial their own station-to-station calls should have the benefit of a reduced rate." Sehadda amphastas d that the


#### Notice to Long Distance Telephone Users

Effective September 1, the charges for long distance calls within the State of Texas will be changed as follows:

- Rates will be reduced on most station-to-station calls dialed direct, without any operator assistance.\*

- Rates will be increased on all person-toperson and station-to-station calls requiring operator assistance in any way, except as noted below.\*

Fisher County residents receiv- gal claims by certain persons ing welfare checks will notice that have contained welfare a sharp decrease in payments

beginning September 1, 1971. Fisher County residents voted 139 for the increase and 229 against the increase in the Constitutional Amendment vote last

The Fisher County Office serves 313 old age assistance people, 18 aid to the permanently disabled, 2 aid to the needy blind, 40 families with dependent children and 82 nursing home patients in the tri-county area of Fisher, Kent and Stonewall

The welfare program in Texas was placed in a serious financial condition, with the failure to change the \$80 million Constitutional ceiling on walfare payments in the election of May 18, 1971. That ceiling cannot be exceeded by the Governororby acts of the Legislature, yet the people receiving welfare con-

tinues to increase. The State has done an ingenious job of multiplying "matching" credits by including all kinds of local welfare assistance, but that source has been stretched about as far as it can go. One of the by-products of the War on Poverty has been the location, and enrollment of welfare eligible families and individuals.Addition of Medicaid enlarged the cisions have expanded the lists as courts have clarified the 16-
