Combine flour, potato chips, com meal, salt and pepper in a large paper sack. Drop washed, wet pieces of chick-
en in and shake until all pieces are well coated. Heat shortening in large frying pan, using enough shortening to measure about 2 inches deep when large pieces of chicken are added to the pan. Cook mearier pieces
