### County Voter Registration Forms For All Residents Now Available

With the new procedures in voter registration this year, Robert Buck, Fisher County Tax Assessor/Collector, and his staff are making applications for voter

registration certificates available to Fisher County's 21 largest communities. County residents closer to Roby can sign the application at

the Tax Assessor Collectors office in the county Court House. Residents of this county closer to Rotan can complete the form at the Rotan City Hall. Anyone not wanting to make a personal trip to either location, can complete the form on page six of this week's paper and mail it to the Fisher County Tax Assessor/Collector, P. O. Drawer L, Roby, Texas.

The period for voter registration began October 1, 1971. Eighteen year olds are eligible to vote this year, and can register at age 17, but must have been registered 31 days prior to an election and be 18 when casting a ballot, advised Buck.

County residents are reminded that they are registering to vote in elections after March 1972.

There is a space on the application for voter registration certificates calling for the voting precinct number. If you are in Commissioner Ford's precinct #1, you have either been voting in Roby's box 1, Sylvester's box 22, or Longworth's box 18.

If you reside in E.J. (Junior) Kiker's precinct #2, you have been voting in Rotan's box 12 at the City Hall or McCaulley Box 6.

Residents of Wayne Porter's precinct have been voting in box 10 at the Community Center or Box 13 in Hobbs.

Commissioner Thurman Terry's precinct includes Roby box 4 or Capitola Box 17. These voting precinct numbers need to be indicated on the application.

If you complete the form in this week's paper, your voter registration certificate will be mailed to you in the near future, advised Buck. If you personally appear at the City Hall in Rotan, or Tax office in Roby, the form will still need to be completed but your certificate will be presented you at that time.

### Rotan Ends Season And District On Winning Note

The Rotan Yellowhammers stormed past Anson in the final contest of the 1971 football season to finish the year with a winning 6-4 season. Immediately after the game Rotan's head coach Charlie Davis remarked, "the whole team did a good job against Anson."

The first quarter ended with a 0-0 tie. Rotan killed numerous pass threats and Anson stopped the Hammers on a few drives that could have produced points.

The Rotan eleven came alive in the second quarter with two touchdowns while denying Anson any points on the board. Neal Summers cracked the Anson line from seven yards out early in the second quarter to give Rotan the first score. His TD was scored on a run over right tackle. The extra point run by Summers failed as the Anson defense tightened up. William Duke was credited with several good blocks in the 55 yard touchdown drive.

Rotan's second score, in the second quarter, came when William Duke ran a "punch and drive" play from the three yard line. On the previous series, Rotan lost the ball inside their 5 yard line on downs and were forced to give up possession. Anson moved the pigskin to their 40 and were forced to punt. Rotan's second TD came after they returned Anson's short punt to their 45 yard line.

The stadium was packed with homecoming fans anxiously awaiting the naming of the 1971 Homecoming Queen when the teams retired to the fieldhouse. Rotan was ahead 12-0 at half time.

Mrs. Carlton Burrow was named Homecoming Queen during halftime activities. She was nominated to represent classes of the 1930's.

Anson scored first during the second half on a long pass from quarterback Tom Watts to end Victor Garcia. The play covered some 55 yards. The extra point kick left the score 12-7.

The remainder of the third quarter belonged to Rotan. Gary Powell intercepted a pass on the 28 yard line and ran it back to the 3 yard line. Sophomore Bruce Jones ran a quarterback sneak from the 3 to push Rotan's mounting lead to 18-7.

The final Rotan score was made on an interception. Harold Gruben ran 95 yards to paydirt

setting the score at 24-7. The extra point run failed. Lupe Alaniz executed a key block in Gruben's 95 yard jaunt.

Rotan failed to score in the final quarter. Anson connected on another long pass and ran the 2 point extra point conversion to end their night's work with 15 points.

Anson finished the season with a 5-5 record

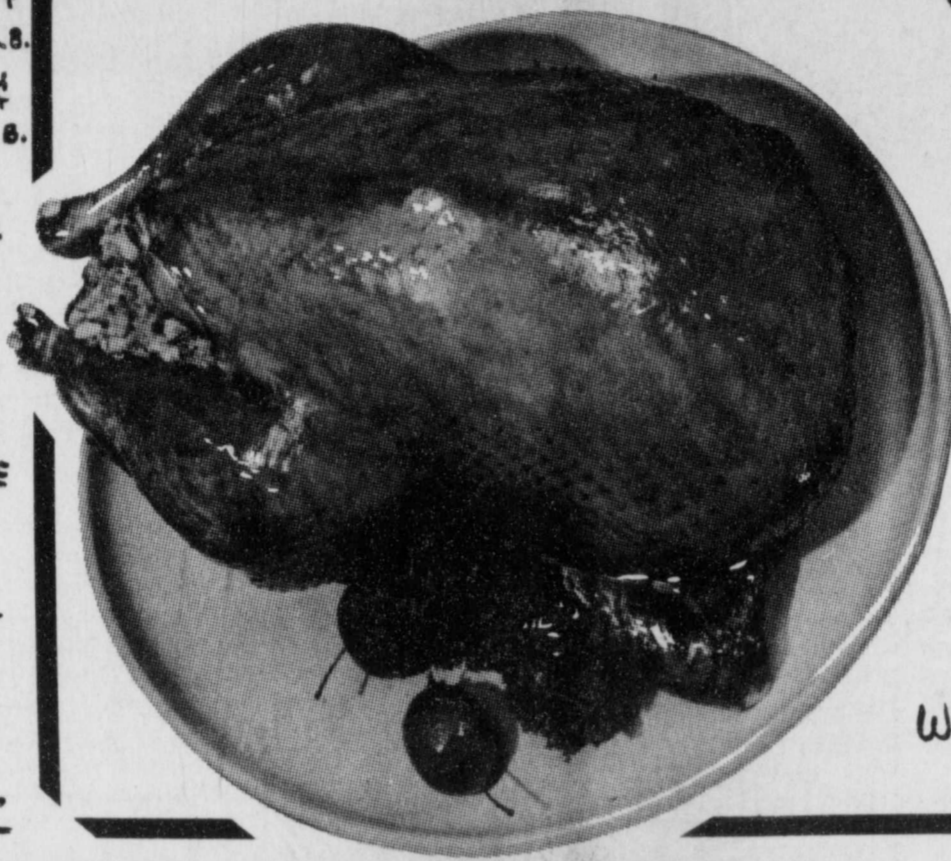

Mrs. Walter Collins, 83, longtime resident of Rotan, died at 6 p. m. Saturday in Callan Hospital following a lengthy illness.

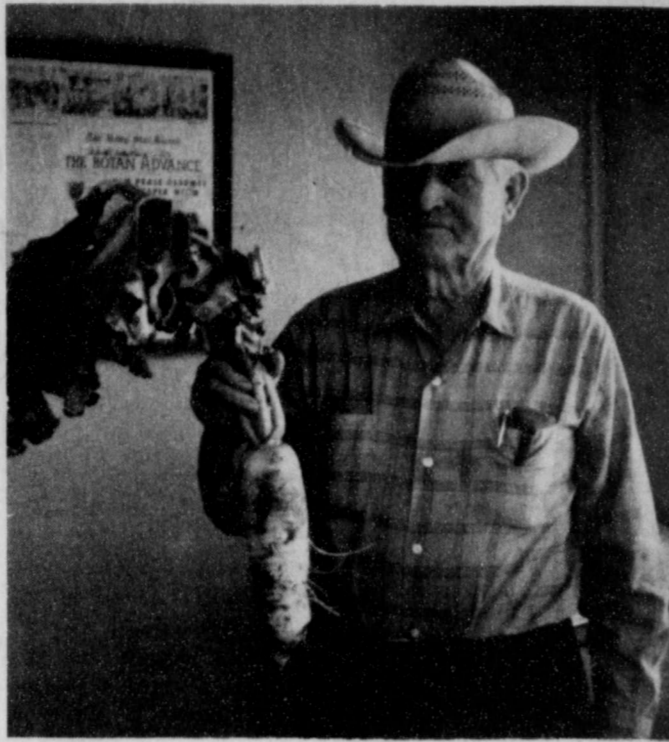

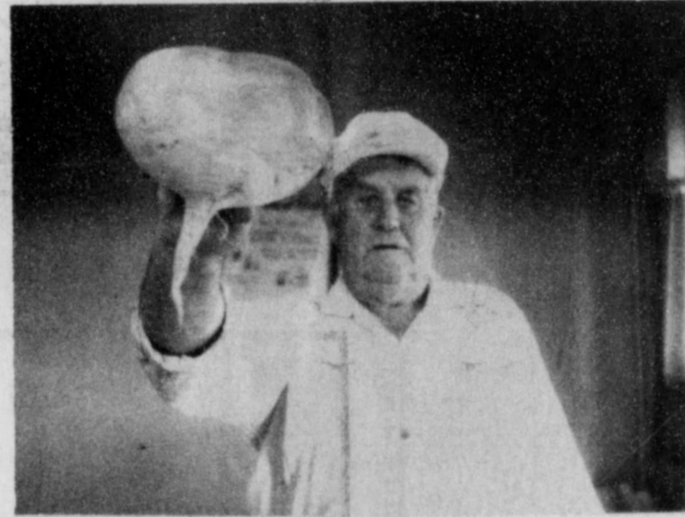

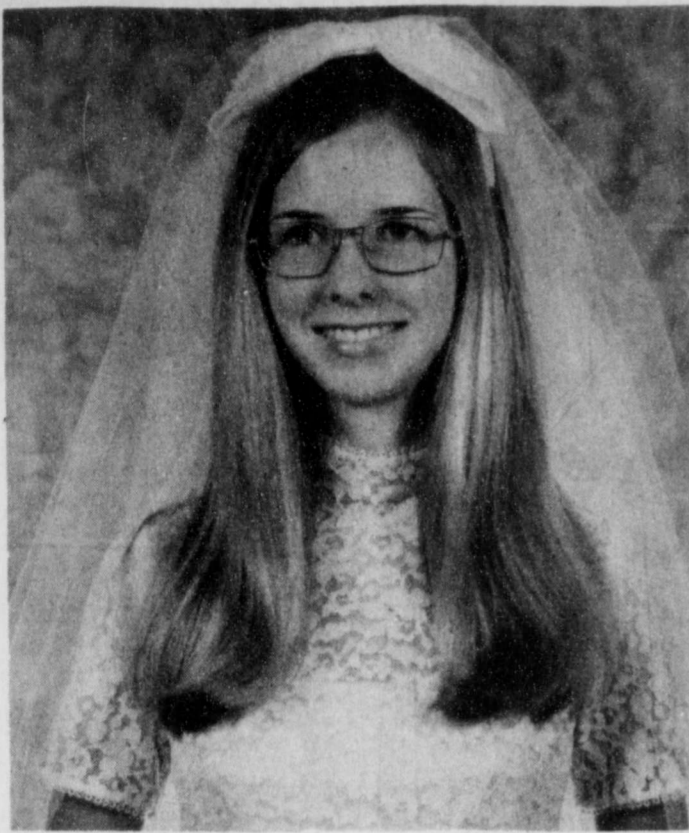

## Terracing Important Conservation Measure

Terracing is one of the most important conservation practices being used in Fisher County, states Jack Cadenhead. Maintenance of the terraces after they are constructed, he continued, is just as important. Terraces do their best when they are properly laid out and constructed to a standard design, but the older they get, the smaller they become and finally end up not very effective. Jack stated that each terrace is a structure of its own, designed to carry a certain amount or hold a given amount of water. Thus, each terrace requires maintenance if it is to remain in a condition that will work properly.

There are three important things to remember in terrace maintenance. They are, height of terraces, fills, and end blocks. The height of a terrace should be maintained so as to equal planned original height. If the height is not maintained, the terrace soon is plowed down and loses its ability to function properly. When this occurs, Jack continued, water runs over the top of the terraces causing severe erosion and very little water is held on the land. When a terrace breaks there is an immediate need for a fill to be made. So to speak, "One break leads to another."

End-blocks in terraces are as important to terraces as is height and fills. End-blocks are designed to hold water on the soil over a period of time so that it can soak into the soil. The end-block should be constructed approximately one-half the height of the terrace. Thus a terrace will hold water about half full. Should a big rain come when the terrace is holding water, the additional water will pour over the end-block and not break the terrace.

A good policy to follow is to check a terrace system after each rain and make repairs where necessary before another rain comes and washes the entire system away.

## FISHER COUNTY RECIPES The Elf's Corner

During the holiday season you will be having more guests calling and it is nice to have something to serve - and to have cheese and fruits will solve many difficult problems. Whether you serve fruit with cheese or fruit after the cheese or a sweet after the cheese is a matter of your taste. When fruits are in season - fruit is usually served after cheese, but as I say, it is a personal taste. I like Gouda, Gruyere and Port Salut and nuts go well with these cheeses.

A good cheese ball is nice to have, served with crackers, dips, or fruit as I mentioned.

### "CHEESE BALLS"

- 6 oz. Bleu Cheese
- 2- 5oz. jars processed cheddar
- 4- 3oz. pkgs cream cheese
- 2 T. grated onion
- 1 t. Worshestershire sauce
- 1/2 t. MSG
- 1 cup ground pecans
- 1/2 cup finely chopped parsley

Have cheeses at room temperature. Mix all together well; roll into balls.

For those of you who prefer big sweets when company comes calling - with that friendly cup of coffee - try this

### "SOUR CREAM CAKE"

- 1 box Duncan Hines yellow cake mix
- 3/4 cup Wesson or Crisco Oil
- 4 Eggs
- 1/2 cup Sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 1 cup Sour Cream
- 1 cup Chopped Nuts
- 2 t. Cinnamon and 2 t. sugar mixed

Mix cake mix, 1/2 cup sugar, 3/4 cup oil, salt, add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each egg is added. Add sour cream and nuts. Pour half of batter into well greased and floured bundt pan (or tube pan) and sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. Add remaining batter and sprinkle spices on top. Bake in 350 deg. oven for 1 hour. Cool a few minutes and remove to plate.

### "CHOCOLATE PIE"

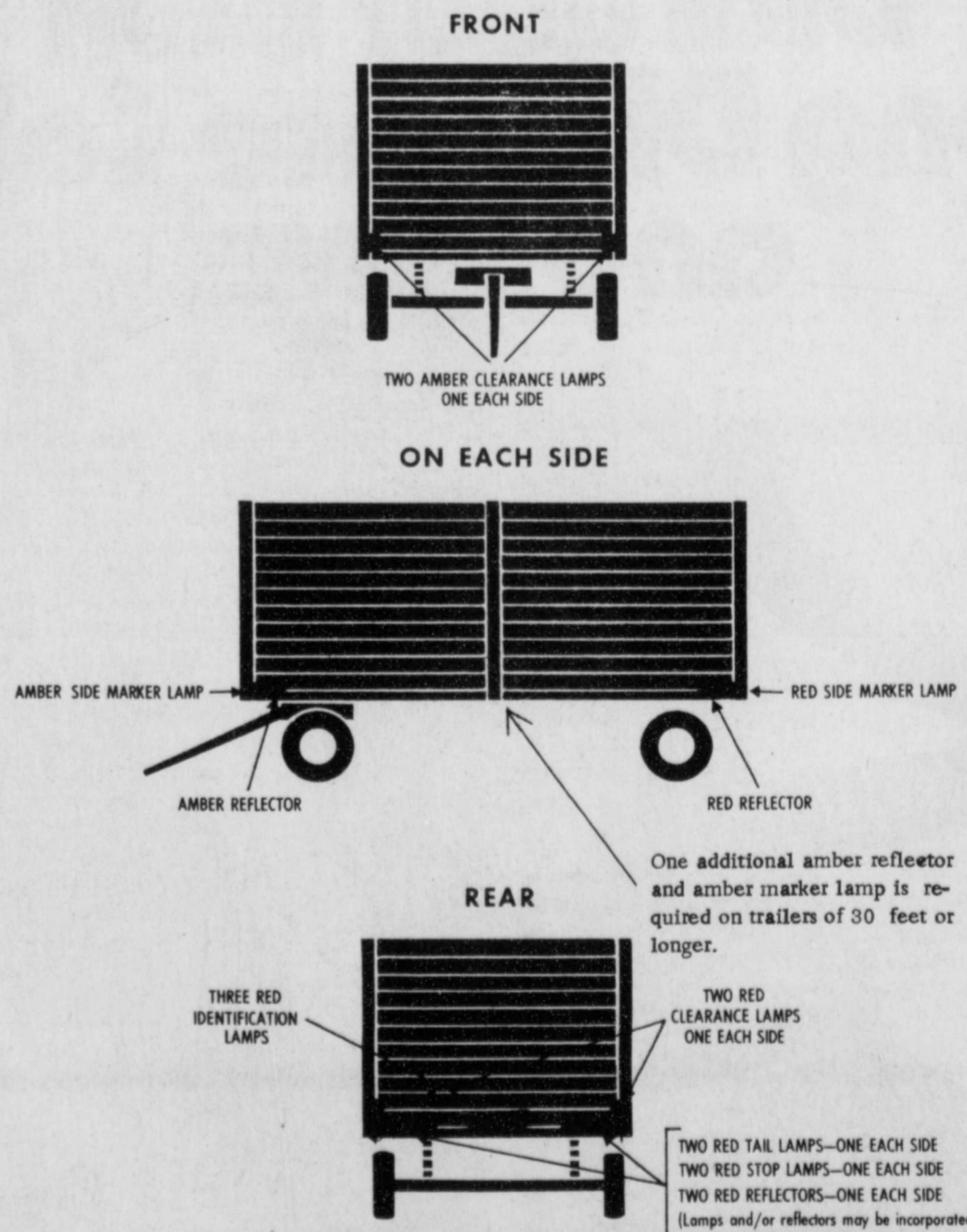
- Nine-inch baked pie shell
- 1 pkg. (6 oz.) Semi-sweet chocolate pieces
- 3 T. milk
- 2 T. Sugar
- 4 Eggs, separated
- 1 t. Vanilla
- 1 cup Heavy Cream

Combine chocolate, milk and sugar in the top of a double boiler and melt over simmering water, cool then add the egg yolks, one at a time, beating hard with whisk after each addition. Stir in vanilla. Beat the egg whites until they hold stiff shiny beat about a third into chocolate mixture. Then fold in remainder with a rubber spatula. Beat 1/2 cup of cream until it holds a firm shape then with spatula fold into the chocolate mixture. Pour into baked shell. Cover and refrigerate. Serve with remaining whipped cream.

Did you know that you can make up a big batch of French Toast and cook it nice and brown and wrap in foil and freeze; then I heat these nice slices in the toaster for hurried breakfasts along with some juice and jam and coffee or milk and you have it made. And I also froze soaked pan cakes, and surprise, they were delicious when heated well in the oven (still wrapped in foil). Get out the syrup and presto - you have breakfast in a jiffy.

### TURN SIGNAL LAMPS

Every motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer and pole trailer shall be equipped with electric turn signal lamps, except that passenger cars and trucks less than 80 inches in width, manufactured or assembled prior to model year 1960, need not be equipped with electric turn signal lamps, unless the body or load of the vehicle or combination of vehicles extends to the side more than 24 inches from the center of the top of the steering wheel post, or the rear limit of the body or load exceeds more than 14 feet from the center of the top of the steering wheel post.

### VEHICULAR HAZARD WARNING SIGNALS

After January 1, 1972, every bus, truck, truck-tractor, trailer, semitrailer or pole trailer, eighty (80) inches or more in width or thirty (30) feet or more in overall length shall be equipped with hazard warning lamps. The lamps used to display such warning to the front shall be mounted at the same level and as widely spaced laterally as practicable, and shall display simultaneously flashing white or amber lights, or any shade of color between white and amber. The lamps used to display such warning to the rear shall be mounted at the same level and as widely spaced laterally as practicable, and shall show simultaneously flashing amber or red lights, or any shade of color between amber and red. (The use of a flasher switch causing the turn signal lamps to flash simultaneously may be used to comply with this section.)
