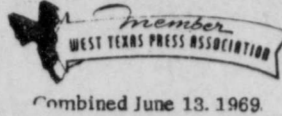

QUOTE: Never look down to test the ground before taking your next step. Only he who keeps his eye fixed on the far horizon will find the right road.

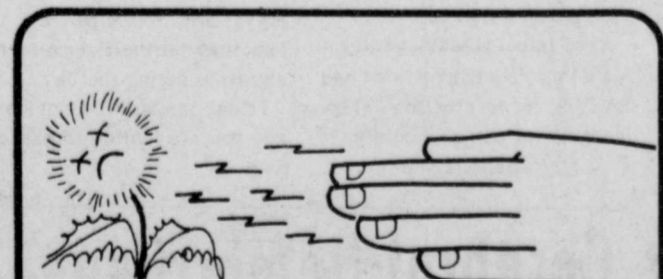

Roby Downs McCaulley In Pee Wee Tournament

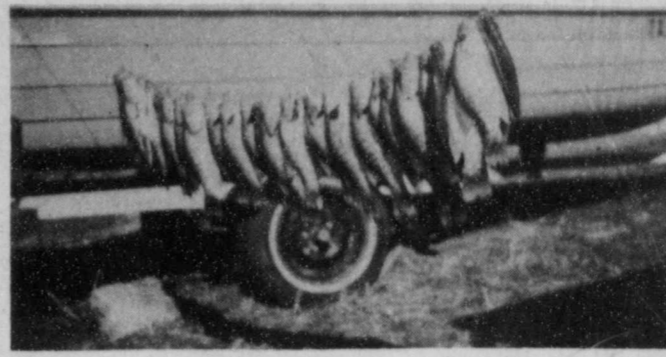

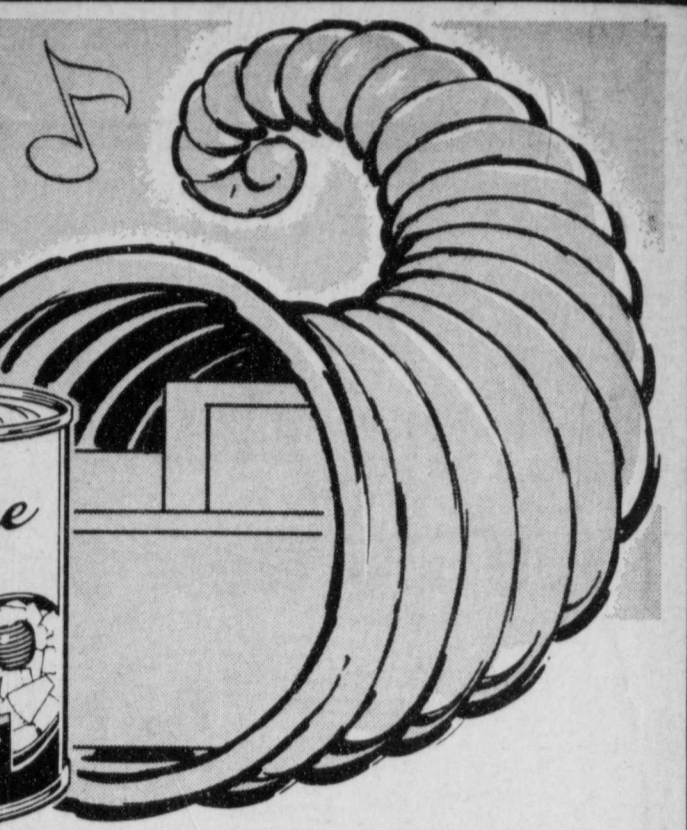
