## Larry Scherwitz Will Attend Harvard Seminar

Larry Scherwitz, University of Texas graduate psychology student from Roby, is one of 18 students in the nation selected to attend a special summer institute at the Harvard Medical School.

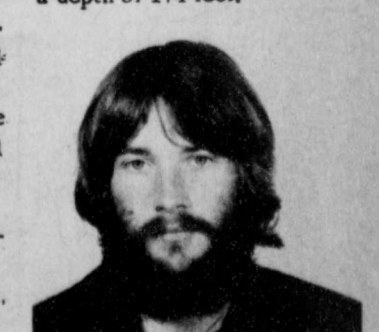
He will study at an 8-week institute, June 19-Aug. 11, devoted to the subject of psychophysiology.

Scherwitz received a \$720 fellowship from the Harvard Medical School to participate in the summer institute. Following the Harvard program, Scherwitz will go to Tokyo in mid-August to attend sessions of the International Congress for Psychologists.

The 25-year old UT student, who plans to receive his Ph. D. next year, earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology in 1969 from UT Austin.

As a UT graduate student, he has been the recipient of a traineeship from the National Institute of Mental Health, a fellowship from the March of Dimes, and a grant from the National Science Foundation, and grants from the office of Naval Research and NASA. For 3 months in 1970 Scherwitz was in the Virgin Islands as a behavior ob-

server in a research project which studied the effect of isolation and stress on persons confined in living quarters 64 feet below the surface of the ocean. He also has been an observer in a similar stress-isolation research project conducted in Hawaii, where subjects lived in an underwater environment at a depth of 174 feet.



Scherwitz, who is doing his doctoral work under Dr. Robert L. Helmreich, has had articles published in the Journal of Personality and Social Psychology and in the Annual Review of Psychology. He also has done a book review for Contemporary Psychology.

A 1965 graduate of Roby High School, Scherwitz is the son of Mr. and Mrs. R. H. Scherwitz of Roby.

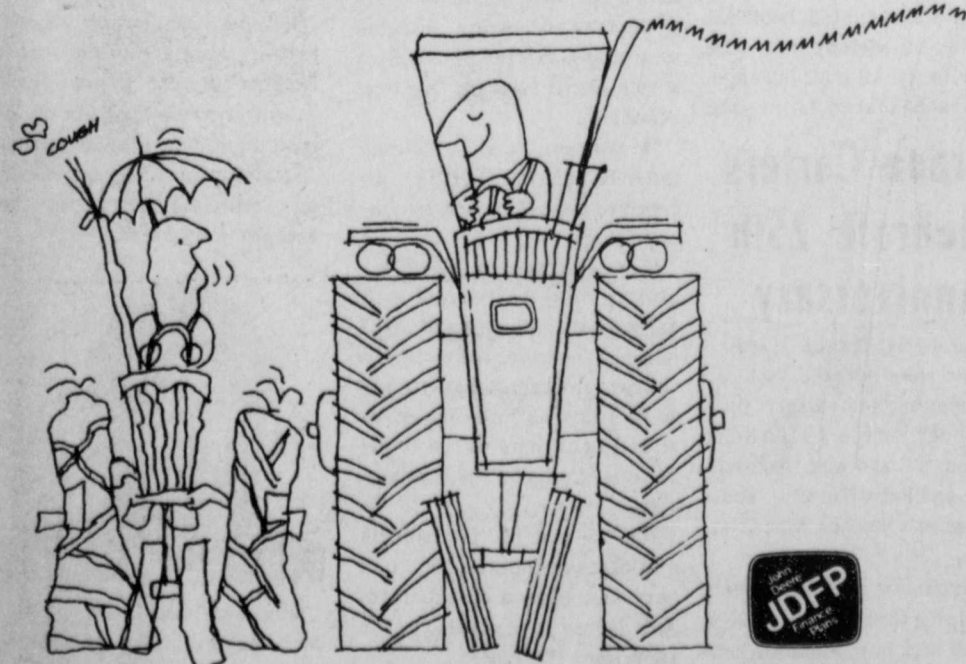

## Church Urges Mass Prayer

A call for citizens to "bring to bear the immense power for good native to prayer" on troubling conditions in Southeast Asia was made in the 106 Churches of Christ, Scientist, throughout Texas Sunday morning.

The Christian Science Board of Directors issued the statement in behalf of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass., and it was read at services in the 3,200 member churches of the denomination throughout the world.

"No one can outline for another how to pray, nor do we in our prayers attempt to outline specific solutions for human conditions," the message stated. "But let this not prevent us from joining in the deepest confidence that prayer does avail."

"It is our conviction that prayer is deeply needed and of vital importance at this time. We believe that all of us must now be counted upon to do our full share in bringing to bear the immense power for good that is native to prayer...."

A front page editorial in The Christian Science Monitor, the denomination's international daily newspaper, also has urged prayer be used in approaching the Vietnam problem.

"The seed of peace can take root only in the prayerful thought of men," the editorial stated.

The editorial also asked citizens not to dwell on negative feelings of disgust, futility, and fear.

"To do so is to fix thought on the issues that divide, and to deflect attention from the goal of harmonious world relations. It is also to fail to see that what is good in American history--the high regard for freedom and self-governance which is shared with various other lands--survives as the thread guiding its role in the progress of nations."

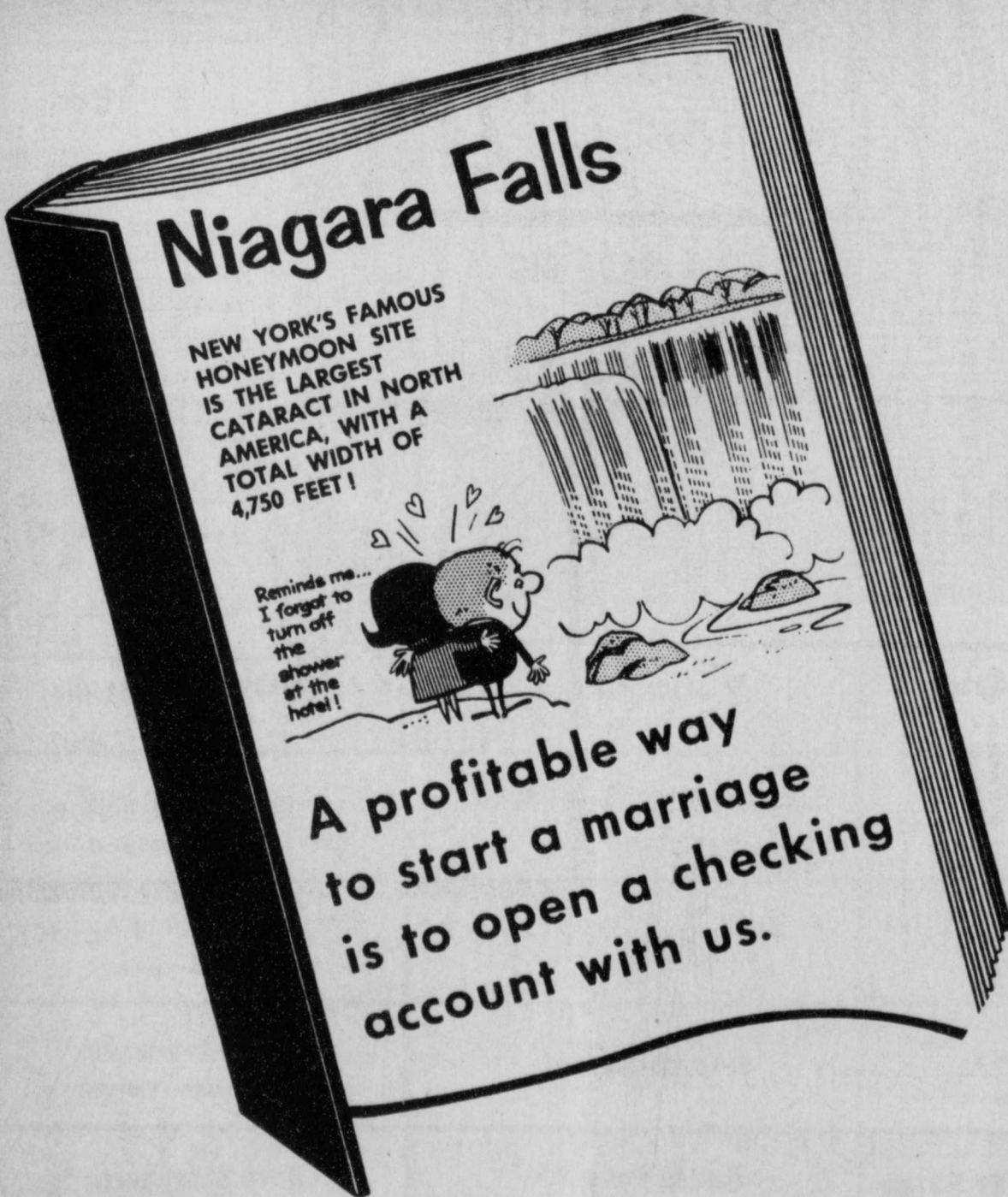

## COUNTY AGENT NEWS

By Richard Spencer



A "red alert" is being sounded throughout the state as screw worms continue to assault livestock and other animals. "Fisher County has recorded 2 cases to date, and it's vital that all animals be inspected closely and regularly so that infestations can be pinpointed and treated with sterile flies," says County Agricultural Agent Richard Spencer.

The latest case was confirmed on the Ben Nepper farm, 9 miles SW of Roby.

Weather conditions were favorable for heavy screwworm buildups last winter in northern Mexico as well as in parts of the Southwest. Some infestations were also spread by transporting infested livestock last fall, and the insect pest spent the mild winter in new quarters. This spring, overall conditions were "ripe" for a massive screwworm invasion.

According to Spencer, more than 2,300 cases have been confirmed in Texas this spring, the earliest and heaviest outbreak in the history of the Screwworm Eradication Program.

Although sterile fly production at the Mission Lab is running at its peak—200 million a week—treatment with these flies is not enough to stop the destructive, flesh-eating livestock pest, Spencer urges all livestock producers and owners of other animals (dogs, cats) to follow certain precautions:

1. Carry out all approved preventive practices to help eliminate screwworms.

2. Inspect animals regularly and carefully and treat all wounds whether they are wormy or not.

3. Delay all surgery until cool weather this fall. Shearing, docking, castrating and de-horning only provide additional wounds for worm infestation. Studies show that almost 90 percent of all worm samples come from calf navels and man-made wounds.

4. Spray animals with an approved product before shipping them. This is a preventive measure against spreading the infection.

5. Be cautious of livestock shipments coming from infested areas. If buying such animals, be sure to check them thoroughly for wormy wounds.

6. Care should be taken not to move infested livestock across state lines. Infestations resulting from this practice may bring about a quarantine and the regulated movement of livestock.

7. As soon as a wormy wound is found, send a worm sample to the Screwworm Laboratory, Box 969, Mission, Texas 78572. If the case is positive, sterile flies will be dropped as soon as possible to further protect animals in the area.

Everyone must cooperate if the screwworm eradication program is to be effective. This means farmers, ranchers, pet owners, auction managers, and others who work with or own animals.

Due to the high interest of farmers and ranchers over the state in artificial insemination and pregnancy testing, a series of clinics of these subjects will be conducted during the next five months.

The clinics are scheduled as follows: Brenham, June 12-16; Decatur, July 10-15; Sulphur Springs, July 31-Aug. 4; San Antonio, Oct. 2-6; San Angelo, Oct. 23-27; Mercedes, Nov. 6-10; and Athens, Nov. 6-10.

The clinics are designed to provide livestock producers and others with actual in-depth field training in AI and pregnancy determination. Detailed information will also be provided on managing the breeding herd which will include nutrition, disease prevention, selection and records.

Participants will receive a comprehensive manual on AI as well as numerous Extension publications and papers on breeding and herd management. A certificate of certification will be awarded to each student at the completion of the five-day clinic.

Registration fee for the AI course is \$125 while the training in pregnancy testing is an additional \$100. Registration is limited to about 30 producers of each of the 10 clinics. Extension Service personnel conducting the clinics include John Beverly and Dr. Jerry Cowley, Dr. Randall Grooms and Dr. Leroy Hoermann, livestock specialists.

The clinics are being sponsored by the Extension Service and the American Breeders Service.

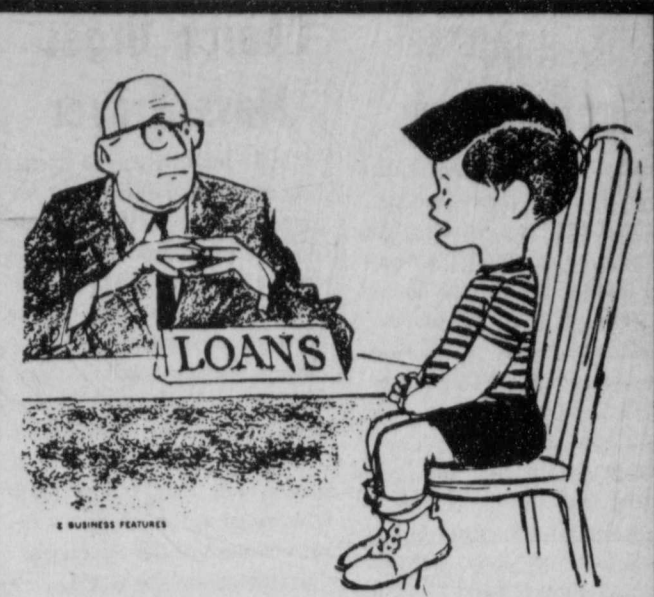

To The Residents of Fisher County, Texas, And All Other Interested Parties:

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that after due publication hereof, the undersigned intend to apply to the Texas Legislature at its second special session of the 62nd Legislature in 1972 for the passage of an Act authorizing the creation of a Hospital District over all of Fisher County, Texas, under the authority granted by Article IX, Section 9 of the Texas Constitution, the general purposes and nature of such Act being expressed as follows:

Adding fabric softener to your laundry restores softness and fluffiness to all washable fabrics.

But perhaps more important, it reduces or eliminates static clinging that often makes it necessary to peel away synthetics and permanent press items when folding laundry or wearing garments.

Some fabrics no longer need ironing when softener is used, and those that do require ironing dry with less deep-set wrinkles.

Though it isn't necessary to add fabric softener in every wash-load, frequent use is recommended. If softener is used with towels when fluffiness is desirable but moisture absorption is also important, skip the use of the additive occasionally.

Two types of fabric softeners are marketed. The most familiar is the one used in the rinse cycle. Either dilute it with water first and add to the rinse water, or pour it into the washer's fabric softener dispenser, if available.

It's important not to add other agents—bleach, water conditioner or any other additives—to the water when a rinse cycle fabric softener is used. In fact, though fabric softener is effective in both hard and soft water, it should not be used in rinse water containing a packaged water conditioner.

A new type of fabric softener is available that can be used in the wash or rinse cycle. Compatible with detergents and other wash cycle compounds, these fabric softeners usually require addition of the fabric softener to wash water before adding detergent and laundry. Then proceed as usual.

Don't pour a wash cycle fabric softener into a fabric softener dispenser unless you want it used in the rinse cycle. Never add any kind of fabric softener to a bleach dispenser or a detergent dispenser. These features are not equipped to handle softeners.

Also, do not pour fabric softener directly on fabrics or staining may result. If this should accidentally occur, immediately hold the stained area under cool running water and rub with bar soap.

Softeners are helpers worth trying. Next to getting clothes, towels and sheets really clean, a fresh, almost new appearance and soft, cozy comfort are the icing on the laundry basket.

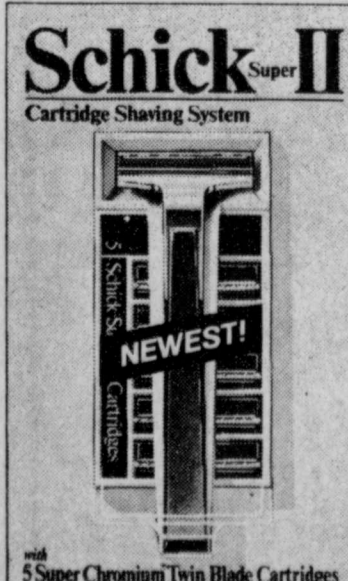
