

#### **Barbara Neeley** Will Get Degree At Angelo State


Barbara Neeley will receive her Bachelor of Science degree from Angelo State University Friday, May 11, The Commencement exercises will be held in the new physical education building of the University.





A total of 154 students were members of the graduating class. Administrative officials of the college said that the class of 1973 is one of the largest that the school has ever had.




