# Textbook Committee Is Named By Rotan Board

Members of the Rotan Independent School Board met for their regular monthly meeting last Monday and approved the textbook committee for the 1973 selection year.

Those appointed include: Supplementary Readers, Pre-Primer, Primer, Grade 1; Mrs. W.T. Edwards and Mrs. Lawrence Wayne Sparks, Supplementary Readers, Grade 2; Mrs. Robert Witherspoon, Mrs. Bill Smith, Supplementary Readers, Grade 3; Mrs. Charles McCall and Mrs. Louise Callan; Physiology-Hygiene, Grade 4; Miss Verna Mae Pittman, Mr. Walter Myers, Mr. Ray Womack; Arithmetic, Grade 7; Grade 8; Mr. Sidney McCown, Mrs. Jerry Dycus; Physiology-Hygiene, Grade 5, 6, 7, 8; Mrs. Marshall Hill, Miss Jackie Hancock, Mr. Marshall Hill; Physical Science, High School, Mr. Wesley Ballard, Mr. Fred Boone; Business Law, Mr. Robert Witherspoon, Mrs. Bart Strayhorn, Mr. Neil Wright.

The board also approved the purchase of 15 letter jackets for the members of the 1973

Rotan City Council met in regular session last Tuesday night and voted, among other things, to hire a new patrolman and grant a ten percent salary increase to all city employees.

The first item of business on the agenda after the approval of the minutes of the November meeting was the opening of bids on the water line to run east of town. The bids were identical by both Jack's Welding Service of Snyder, Texas

and Logan's Trencher & Backhoe Service of Abilene. Both firms submitted bids of \$2,160 to lay approximately 9,000 linear feet of plastic pipe. A motion was made by Lester Sessil and seconded by Sam Hamm to accept the bid of Jack's Welding Service.

Councilmen authorized City Manager Kenneth Vann to begin preparing necessary information to submit to the Texas Quality Water Board and Environmental Protection Agency, on securing a full grant to construct a completely new sewer system. The grant is to be approximately \$195,000 with 75% coming in the form of a grant and 25% being paid by the City of Rotan. Funds are available from the Federal Government with a deadline of January 15 for the submission of the preliminary paper work. The motion to authorize Vann to take the preliminary steps was made by Councilman Sessil and seconded by Councilman Bredemeyer.

Councilmen discussed work on Roby Avenue and Cleveland Street north of town. According to information received by City Manager Vann, the highway department will widen Cleveland St. from 3rd Street to 8th Street, if that area is curbed and gutted by the City of Rotan. The estimated cost to the City of Rotan will be \$6,700, a portion of this is to be passed on to landowners along the area to be improved.

Councilmen discussed annual Christmas bonuses for City employees and voted to give \$50.00 to full time employees and \$75.00 to supervisors. The motion was made by Hamm and seconded by Arvin White.

Councilmen also voted to raise employee salaries in excess of 10% per month. All employees will receive at least a 10% raise in pay with some employees receiving additional minor increases to even out salaries for bookkeeping purposes. The motion to approve the pay increases was made by Arvin White and seconded by Bredemeyer.

Councilman Bredemeyer made the motion, seconded by Councilman Sessil to hire Marvin Kersh as the new Rotan City Patrolman. Funds are available from the W. C. T. Cog to pay a portion of Kersh's salary. Vann is to check into the funds.

The final discussion of the evening was centered around the possible approval of a Fisher County Airport. This report to the Board was given by Mayor Springer and all councilmen seemed encouraged over the possibility of the creation of a new county airport.

# Commissioners Hear Trio Request County Airport

Three Fisher County citizens appeared before the Fisher County Commissioners Court last Monday morning to ask that commissioners give consideration to constructing a Fisher County Airport.

Those present included: Doug Weatherbee, representing the Rotan Chamber of Commerce; Joe Dale Burk, representing the Rotan Industrial Foundation; and James Springer, Mayor of Rotan.

Weatherbee pointed out that Dr. Maurice Callan had made arrangements with several specialists to "fly in" to do specialized operations in the new Fisher County Hospital. A new county airport would assure Fisher County residents of old service.

The anticipated cost of this airport was mentioned in general terms, Fisher County Judge

Dwight Lovett was of the opinion that the Texas Aeronautical Commission would share in the construction cost by involving some federal money.

The three man committee was going to check with some surrounding counties that had recently constructed air ports, attempt to ascertain some costs

and report back to commissioners at the next meeting.

Commissioners did discuss a request by County Agent Richard Spencer asking for "saddle tank" gas tanks to be installed on the County Agent's vehicle. No action was taken on the request.

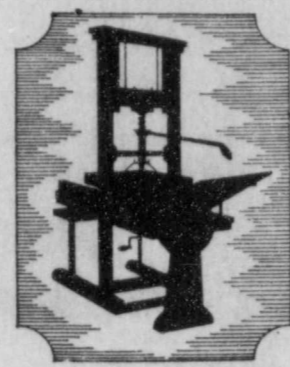
# Steve Wallace Named New Calvary Pastor

# Roby School Board Has Discussion On Energy

The members of the Roby Independent School Board met last Monday night for their regular monthly meeting. A wide variety of items were discussed by the board.

The first item of discussion

concerned the conservation of energy within the school system with respect to the current energy crisis. Some of the rulings passed down by Governor Briscoe concerning school operation hours during extremely cold weather were going to be qualified by school officials during December. The board and Superintendent Ray Pruitt did discuss at length ways to conserve lights and gas and also the use of car pools.

Subject of delinquent taxes was discussed by the board, however, no action was taken.

The length of the Roby bus routes came up for discussion. It was generally agreed by board members that they would try to even out the length of each route for the 1973-74 year.

Board members discussed the disposition of a \$13,000. bond currently drawing interest at the Mercantile Bank in Dallas. The bond is not owned by the school. The bond is drawing interest for the school but then interest is paid on it each year. It was the feeling of the board to try to get this off the records. Administrative personnel are attempting to seek a solution to this prior to the next board meeting.

The Planters Gin at Longworth recorded 554 bales last week to give them a season total of 1,881. The Troy Gruben Gin has a weekly reported total of 495 for a season total of 3,170. The Sylvester Gin baled 247 last week for a total of 2,680.

# Cross Roads Church To Begin New Mission Plan

# Rep. Martin Comments On Energy Crisis Meet

Representative Elmer Martin had these remarks to make after attending the briefing session of Gov. Dolph Briscoe's energy crisis meeting in Austin, Dec. 6, Lt. Gov. Hobby was moderator.

"There is not a quick solution to the energy crisis. It will take years of hard work and sacrifice before results can be meaningful and a solution can be found to a way out of this traumatic experience. Everything must be done to keep all industry in full production, and certainly this applies to agriculture. In all probability a special session will be called in regard to this crisis by Gov. Briscoe, for something must be done now; farmers must have fuel now to keep up production to prevent a shortage in

food and fibre.

**Jimmy Marks Is Back In States After Maneuver**

Army Staff Sergeant Jimmie Marks, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jess Marks, of Morton participated with other American and allied troops in exercise Reforger V in Germany, October 10-16.

The military airlift command flew approximately 11,000 U.S. based soldiers and more than 1,000 tons of equipment to three different airfields in Germany in preparation for the event.

Immediately after arriving overseas, the redeployed units

drew combat gear and vehicles from prepositioned storage sites in Germany and moved to the exercise area to begin the seven day field maneuvers.

Pitted against the airlifted forces were Europe-based elements of Nato Forces of the U. S., Germany and Canada.

The exercise, conducted by the joint chiefs of staff and Nato, focused on the procedures and techniques for receiving, equipping, assembling and employing units after they arrive,

rather than on rapid deployment of troops from the U. S.

Sgt. Marks is regularly assigned as a section chief in the 28th Field Artillery's 2nd Battalion in Ansbach, Germany.

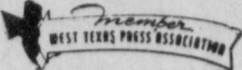

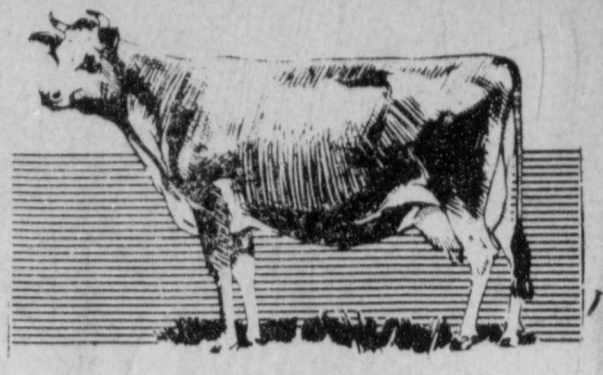
Nancy Napier And Christopher Frost Engagement Announced
